PORTS ORDINANCE

LAGOS PORT REGULATION

Date.—3rd February, 1953.

Details.—Sub-regulation (1) of regulation 16 of the principal regulations has been revoked and the following sub-regulation substituted therefore:—

(1) No person shall float logs of timber, casks or other goods within the port except in accordance with the following provisions:—

(a) no raft or float, either singly or with others, shall be under way unless such raft or float is towed by a power driven vessel of sufficient power to keep such raft or float under control.

Provided that in the waters of port north of a line drawn from Bluff Point at the southern entrance of Ebute Metta Creek to the Pier known as French Company Pier situated on the eastern foreshore of Elegbata near Kernal Street, and Amosu Street and in position 206.75 degrees 412 feet from the secondary traverse point No. 17 S floats and rafts containing not more than twenty logs or fifty casks may be under way or floated without the aid of a power driven vessel.

(b) a crew of one man for every twenty logs or fraction of twenty or for every fifty casks or fraction of fifty shall be carried on each raft or float, provided that no raft or float shall have a crew of less than two men.

(c) every raft or float shall—

(i) by day fly from each end of the raft or float at a point equidistant from each side thereof and at a height of not less than six feet above the top thereof a red flag which shall be not less than two feet in length and eighteen inches in width;

(ii) by night exhibit from each end of the raft or float at a point equidistant from each side thereof a red light in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.
