WHEREAS by section 5 of the Nigeria (Supplementary Provisions) Order in Council, 1951, it is provided inter alia that there shall be a Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Northern Region:

AND WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 8 of the said Order in Council it is provided that whenever the office of Lieutenant-Governor is vacant, or the Lieutenant-Governor is absent from Nigeria, or is from any other cause prevented from, or incapable of, performing the functions of his office, then such other person as the Governor may by Instrument under the Public Seal appoint, shall, during Her Majesty's pleasure, administer the Government of the Region:

AND WHEREAS the Lieutenant-Governor of the Northern Region is absent from Nigeria:

Now, THEREFORE, I, JOHN STUART MACPHERSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Nigeria, do hereby appoint HABLOT ROBERT EDGAR BROWNE, Esquire, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, to administer, during Her Majesty's pleasure, the Government of the Northern Region.

NIGERIA COCOA MARKETING BOARD—1954-55 COCOA MARKETING SCHEME: WESTERN REGION MINIMUM BUYING STATION PRICES
