# COMMONWEALTH FUND COLONIAL CIVIL SERVICE FELLOWSHIP, 1955

With reference to Gazette Notice No. 1408 of 26th August, 1954, full details of the two Commonwealth Fund Colonial Civil Service Fellowships to be awarded in 1955 have now been received from the Secretary of State.

- 2. Officers who wish to be considered, having regard to the terms and conditions set out in paragraphs 4 to 20 below, are invited to submit their applications to their Heads of Departments by the 1st of October, 1954. Heads of Departments, in turn, are asked to consider carefully the claims of all officers in their Departments who submit applications and to forward to the Chief Secretary, or appropriate Civil Secretary, by the 15th of October the name of not more than ONE officer for further consideration. Since only two Fellowships are available for the whole of the Colonial Empire competition will be, therefore, very keen.
- 3. Officers who have applied unsuccessfully in previous years may reapply if they wish to do so. Successful applicants will be notified by the end of March 1955. The officers who received awards in 1952 were Mr K. H. HENDERSON, M.B.E., Malaya, and Mr A. L. C. THORNE, Veterinary Research Officer, Nigeria.

#### PURPOSE OF THE FELLOWSHIPS

4. The Commonwealth Fund of New York, a philanthropic foundation existing since 1918 and supported by endowments from the late Mrs Stephen V. Harkness and the late Mr Edward S. Harkness, has established for British subjects a number of Fellowships tenable in the United States. In creating these Commonwealth Fund Fellowships the Directors of the Fund have been impelled by a belief in the value of international opportunities for education and travel, and by a conviction that mutual amity and understanding between the British Commonwealth and the United States will thereby be promoted. The Fellowships are under the patronage of Her Majesty the Queen.

## CONDITIONS OF APPOINTMENT

- 5. Candidates should be sufficiently expert to carry out a definite scheme of advanced study, research, or enquiries related to a problem which is of importance to Government service and can be investigated to particular advantage in the United States. Officers with less than five years' service cannot normally be regarded as qualified for these Fellowships.
- 6. Candidates may be married or single; but they should not have attained the age of forty on the 1st September of the year of award.
- No one is eligible who has already worked or studied in the United States for more than a few months.
- 8. Candidates are required to give an undertaking that, if elected, they will complete the tenure of their Fellowship; resignation will be permitted only for the strongest reasons. A candidate is also required to agree that when his Fellowship has terminated, he will return to Government or Local Government Service in some part of the British Commonwealth, for not less than two years.
- An interview with the Committee of Award in London will not be required. All selected candidates, however, will be required to undergo medical

examination as a qualification for election. Examinations may be made in the region from which a candidate applies, to be assessed by the Fund's medical advisor in London. The Fund will supply the medical form for this purpose and bear the expenses of the examination, including chest X-ray. Recent vaccination against smallpox is demanded by the American Authorities.

- 10. In the selection of candidates for nomination primary consideration is given to intellectual ability and actual or potential achievement; account is also taken of character, personality and health. It should be noted that officers who are seconded to Local Government Services within the Colonies are also eligible.
- 11. Speaking generally, no limitation is imposed on the subject of study to be undertaken by the Fellow during the tenure of the Fellowship. In the particular case of candidates in Medicine, however, while research in the medical sciences or in clinical medicine or surgery is regarded as within the scheme, routine clinical work is excluded.

#### CONDITIONS OF TENURE

- 12. The Fellowships are tenable for a minimum period of six months and a maximum period of twelve months. Fellows are normally expected to arrive in the United States in September of the year of award.
- 13. A Commonwealth Fund Fellowship is not tenable with a Fellowship or scholarship of any other foundation established for a similar purpose. Candidates should inform the Committee of Award of any application for other fellowships or of any conditional acceptances of fellowships or posts in the United States. During tenure a Fellow may not render services, seek employment or solicit funds in the United States.
- 14. A Colonial Civil Service Fellow will not be required to reside continuously at any one place; he will be free to visit, with the approval of the Fund, institutions, universities, departments or districts appropriate to his field of study. He may be permitted to change his scheme of work or to receive leave of absence for reasons accepted by the officers of the Fund. A Fellowship may be terminated by the Commonwealth Fund if in the opinion of its officers a Fellow is not observing or has not observed the obligations compatible with the purposes and nature of these Fellowships.
- 15. To advance his studies and his understanding of the country, a Fellow is required to travel in the United States for at least two to three months during the twelve months' tenure of the Fellowship. Travel plans are to be formulated in consultation with the Fund after the Fellow's arrival.
- 16. A Fellow shall render a report on his work and experience in the United States within three months of the completion of the Fellowship.

#### EMOLUMENTS

- 17. The emoluments have now been amended as follows:—There is no fixed stipend; the emoluments are intended to cover the dollar requiremens of the Fellow for travel, residence and study in the United States. It is expected that the Fellow's home obligations, including normal superannuation contributions, etc., will continue to be covered by his Government Department. He will be granted leave with full pay, so that:—
- (a) The period of absence will count for increment and pension.

- (b) If an established officer is permanently incapacitated or dies during tenure of his Fellowship, he or his dependents will be treated for pension or gratuity purposes as if he had been still serving in the Colonial Civil Service at the time.
  - 18. The dollar allowances are made up as follows:
- (a) The cost of the Fellow's travel (but not his wife's or child's) from the Fellow's home to the United States and return, including \$500 for round-trip transatlantic passages.
- (b) An equipment and book allowance of \$200, payable in New York on arrival; also tuition and similar fees incurred by the Fellow in course of his approved programme.
- (c) A basic allowance of \$1,000 for travel in the United States. A supplementary allowance of not more than \$100 per month may be granted to cover those periods (outside the required three-months travel period mentioned in paragraph 11 above) during which a Fellow's programme calls for extra travel or frequent changes of residence.
- (d) A living allowance of \$300 per month for a period not exceeding twelve months.
- (e) If, on a plan approved by the New York officers of the Fund, a Fellow is joined in the United States by his wife for a part of his Fellowship, an additional allowance of up to \$450 will be made (at the rate of \$150 a month for three months).
- 19. According to present Treasury regulations, a single Fellow or a married Fellow who is unaccompanied by his wife may not convert any part of his British salary into dollars. A married Fellow who is going to the United States of America for more than six months can apply to the local Exchange Controller for a special allowance of dollars to cover the expenses of his wife and family if they should join him there.
- 20. A married Fellow who wishes to take his wife with him to the United States must do so at his own expense. Apart from the extra allowance mentioned in paragraph 13 (e) above, the Fund cannot assume responsibility for a Fellow's family. Because of housing shortages in many localities and high and rising costs of living, a Fellow should not bring his wife, still less his wife and child, without a plan for accommodation and support, approved in advance by the New York officers of the Fund. A married Fellow is well advised not to make arrangements for his wife to join him in the United States before his main travel period (normally in the summer months).

# MINIMUM BUYING STATION PRICES

It is notified for general information that the Nigeria Cocoa Marketing Board, by virtue of its powers under section 17 (a) of the Nigeria Cocoa Marketing Board Ordinance (No. 33 of 1947) and in consultation with the Shadow Northern Regional Marketing Board, has fixed the prices set out in columns II and III of the schedule below as the minimum prices payable for cocoa during the 1954-55 season at gazetted buying stations in the Northern Region specified in column I.

2. The minimum buying station prices are based on the naked ex-scale port of shipment prices for the 1954-55 cocoa season (published under Government Notice No. 1483 in the *Nigeria Gazette* No. 46 of 26th August, 1954) less the transport differentials by the approved evacuation routes.

3. The middlemen's allowance will be included in the block buying allowance paid to the Board's licensed buying agents and will be as follows:—

### PRODUCE SALES TAX

4. Under the provisions of the Sale of Produce (Taxation) (Northern Region) Order in Council, 1953, made under the Sale of Produce (Taxation) Ordinance, 1953, all sales of cocoa made in the Northern Region to the licensed buying agents of the Nigeria Cocoa Marketing Board became subject to Produce Sales Tax of £4 per ton as from the 1st October, 1953.

5. For purposes of collection of this tax, for which under the Sale of Produce (Taxation) Ordinance, 1953 the Marketing Board is accountable to the Financial Secretary of the Northern Region for all sales of cocoa made to it or to its licensed buying agents in the Region, the following arrangements are prescribed.

6. The prices payable by the licensed buying agents of the Marketing Board for cocoa in the Northern Region will take into account the incidence of Produce Sales Tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in columns IV and V of the schedule hereto (being the minimum buying station price fixed by the Marketing Board abated by the amount of Produce Sales Tax).

7. The grades of cocoa referred to in the Schedule hereto are defined in Government Notice No. 523 published in the Nigeria Gazette No. 21 of 19th April, 1951.
