TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME  
GREETING :—

WHEREAS by the Nigeria (Offices of Governor-General and Governors) Order in Council, 1954, constituting the office of Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, it is provided that whenever the Governor-General has occasion to be absent from Lagos but not from Nigeria, or has occasion to be absent from Nigeria for a period which he has reason to believe will be of short duration, or whenever by reason of illness which he has reason to believe will be of short duration he considers it desirable so to do, he may, by Instrument under the Public Seal of the Federation appoint any person in Nigeria to be his Deputy during such absence or illness, and in that capacity to discharge for and on behalf of the Governor-General during such absence or illness such of the functions of the office of Governor-General as may be specified by such Instrument :

AND WHEREAS having occasion to be absent from the seat of Government but not from Nigeria, I consider it desirable to appoint some person to be my Deputy during my absence :

*Government Notice No. 1744***VACANCIES FOR STUDENTS IN UNIVERSITIES AND OTHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS IN UNITED KINGDOM**

With reference to Government Notice No. 1486 published in the *Nigeria Gazette* No. 60 of the 22nd of October, 1953, it is notified for general information that there is still likely to be severe competition in the 1955-56 session for entry in the United Kingdom to Medical Schools and, in a lesser degree, to University faculties of Dentistry, Engineering, Forestry, Pharmacy and Science, where a solid background of scientific knowledge and a high standard of attainment are prerequisites to acceptance.

2. At present, admission is generally granted to students who have qualified for entry by passing the General Certificate of Education examination at the appropriate standard in the requisite subjects. For example, a student is not likely to be accepted for admission to the Faculty of Medicine unless he has obtained the General Certificate of Education at the Advanced Level in Physics and Chemistry, taken as separate subjects, and at least at the Ordinary Level in Biology or Botany and Zoology in lieu of Biology. It is considered essential that students should so far as is practicable, take advantage of such local facilities for higher education as exist in their own Territory before seeking recommendation for admission to Universities in the United Kingdom.

3. It must also be emphasised that no student from this country is now ordinarily accepted for admission to an institution of higher learning in the United Kingdom unless he is recommended by the Students' Advisory Committee. Students are therefore strongly advised in their own interests to communicate with the Secretary, Students' Advisory Committee, care The Chief Secretary's Office, Lagos, and ensure that their applications for assistance in gaining admission to educational institutions in the United Kingdom are submitted by the dates given below or as soon as possible thereafter. On no account should a student apply direct to a College or University in the United Kingdom in anticipation of the grant of a scholarship for which he may have applied as such a step can only result in needless duplication of work both here and in London.

4. Most Universities and educational institutions in the United Kingdom now insist on early applications and students who wish to proceed to the United Kingdom in 1955 are advised to submit their applications to the Secretary, Students' Advisory Committee not later than the 1st of January, 1955, if the fullest advantage is to be taken of the places available.

5. In the following categories, however, applications should reach him by the 30th of October, 1954 at the latest :—

(a) Degree courses in Agriculture, Dentistry, Engineering, Pharmacy, Pure Science and Veterinary Science.

(b) Teachers' training courses (including physical training, domestic science, and Froebel and other kindergarten training).

(c) Admissions to Oxford and Cambridge Colleges.

Applications for entry to Medical Schools in 1956 should be submitted before the 1st of June, 1955 since the entry lists to most Medical Schools close early in the autumn previous to the year for which admission is desired.

6. It is emphasised that entry into the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge and to the Internal Colleges of the University of London is most difficult to secure. Students seeking admission to these institutions are reminded that they have to incur certain initial expenses, for instance, on the purchase of books and household equipment for their rooms, and they are advised to provide themselves with a small sum of money, besides their normal maintenance allowance, to cover contingencies like Caution Money of between £40 and £75 payable on entering an Oxford or Cambridge College. The attention of students is also drawn to the advantages of seeking admission to the residential colleges of the University of Wales, the Universities in Scotland and the provincial Universities in England.

7. *Admission to the London School of Economics.*—Candidates are usually admitted to the London School of Economics on the results of the School Entrance Examination. The next examination will be held in Nigeria on Tuesday, 22nd February, 1955, and will consist of one three-hour paper of a general nature. Before candidates can be admitted to this examination, a formal application must be submitted to the Overseas Students Committee of the Academic Board. The last day for receipt of applications for students wishing to read for the B.Sc. (Economics) degree course will be the 1st of January, 1955. Candidates taking the School Entrance Examination will be required to pay an entry fee of £1 (one pound) and will be responsible for any local charges which may arise.

8. The authorities of the London School of Economics and Political Science have stressed that applications for admission, particularly for the B.Sc. (Economics) course, should be submitted very early in the year. Applications submitted at a late stage are considered only if withdrawals occur.

9. Prospective students of the London School are also warned that entrance requirements for the LL.B. degree course are likely to be raised in the near future. Candidates will be required to pass in three subjects at Advanced Level in the General Certificate of Education examination or pass the Intermediate LL.B. examination or its equivalent before they are admitted into the School.




