By His Excellency SIR JOHN STUART MACPHERSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria.

To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting :---

WHEREAS by the Nigeria (Offices of Governor-General and Governors) Order in Council, 1954, constituting the office of Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, it is provided that whenever the Governor-General has occasion to be absent from Lagos but not from Nigeria, or has occasion to be absent from Nigeria for a period which he has reason to believe will be of short duration, or whenever by reason of illness which he has reason to believe will be of short duration he considers it desirable so to do, he may, by Instrument under the Public Seal of the Federation appoint any person in Nigeria to be his Deputy during such absence or illne's, and in that capacity to discharge for and on behalf of the Governor-General during such absence or illness such of the functions of the office of Governor-General as may be specified by such Instrument :

AND WHERFAS having occasion to be absent from the seat of Government but not from Nigeria, I consider it desirable to appoint some person to be my Deputy during my absence : KNOW YE THEREFORE that I, JOHN STUART MACPHERSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, do hereby appoint SIR HUGO FRANK MARSHALL, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George during such absence as aforesaid to be my Deputy within Nigeria ; and in that capacity to exercise and perform and execute on my behalf throughout Nigeria all powers and authorities by the said Order in Council or otherwise howsoever vested in the Governor-General subject to the instructions addressed to the said SIR HUGO FRANK MARSHALL for his guidance.

1. Unauthorised Expenditure.—I have not seen the approval of the Board for the following expenditure in excess of the approved Estimates in 1951-52 :— Pensions and Gratuities

2. Daily Paid Labour.—It was observed that daily paid labour in the employ of the Board has from time to time been used for private works on a repayment basis. Records showing the basis of allocation between the various works of the Board and private works have not however been provided, and it is in any case considered undesirable that the Board's labour should be used for such purposes. The question is the subject of correspondence with the Board, and an assurance has been given that this practice has ceased.

3. Transport Allowances.—It has been observed that transport allowances payable to officers of the Board are not entirely in accordance with Government General Orders. In order to clarify the position this Department has suggested that the Board should either adopt Government General Orders or, alternatively, that a separate set of instructions should be drawn up and approved by the Board. The question is under correspondence.

GENERAL LAND ACCOUNT

4. Purchases.—The amount of £387-12s-9d charged to the General Land Account in 1951-52 represents compensation paid by the Board for land acquired some years ago. It has been agreed that this is not a correct charge to the General Land Account and it is understood that the matter will be adjusted in the current year's accounts.

5. Land on Hand.—Due to various errors in computation, the balance of land on hand at 31st March, 1952, is overstated by £226 and at 31st March, 1953 by a net figure of £137-10s-0d. The necessary adjustment will be made in the current year's accounts.

APAPA ESTATE DEVELOPMENT ACCOUNT

6. Proportion of Overhead Expenditure.—With reference to paragraph 3 of the 1949-50 Report and paragraph 4 of the 1950-51 Report, 20 per cent of the General Overhead Expenditure has again been charged to the Apapa Estate Development Account in 1951-52 and 1952-53. I have not yet seen the Board's approval for apportionment on this basis.

7 Rents Receivable.—In calculating Rents Receivable for the years under review, credit has been taken for more than twelve months' rent, the maximum which it is considered can be regarded as the income for any financial year. This has resulted in an overcredit of £21,855-2s-4d in 1951-52 and £13,762-13s-11d in 1952-53. The necessary adjustments will be made in the current year's accounts.

BALANCE SHEET

8. Treasury Current Account.—At the date of this report the balances of the Treasury Current Account at 31st March, 1952 and 31st March, 1953, in the Board's books had not been reconciled with the corresponding balances in the Treasury.

9. Miscellaneous Deposits.—The balances of the Control Account in the General Ledger at 31st March, 1952 and 31st March, 1953 have not been reconciled with the sum of the individual balances in the Deposit Ledger. The question is under correspondence and is being investigated by the Board.

10. Cash at Bank and in Hand,—This includes an amount of $\pounds 3,149-4s-4d$ at 31st March, 1952 and $\pounds 3,231-9s-9d$ at 31st March, 1953 on Deposit in the Post Office Savings Bank on account of the Pensions and Gratuity Reserve.

11. Land at Valuation.—I have been unable to satisfy myself that the Land leased and on hand at 31st March, 1952 and 31st March, 1953 as shown in the Balance Sheet agrees with the land actually held at that date; nor have I been able to satisfy myself that documents establishing the Board's title to such land are held. The matter is under correspondence.

THE EXCHANGE CONTROL ORDINANCE, 1950 (No. 35 of 1950)

The Exchange Control (Import and Export) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1954

Date of Commencement : 11th November, 1954

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Financial Secretary of the Federation of Nigeria by sections 21 and 31 of the Exchange Control Ordinance, 1950 the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Exchange Control (Import and Export) Short title (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1954, and shall come into operation on the 11th November, 1954.
