FOREIGN DECORATIONS

It is notified for general information that Her Majesty the Queen has approved the following revised Regulations regarding Foreign Orders, Decorations and Medals applicable to persons (A) in the service of the Crown and (B) not in the service of the Crown:—

A

REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE ACCEPTANCE AND WEARING OF FOREIGN ORDERS, DECORATIONS AND MEDALS BY PERSONS IN THE SERVICE OF THE CROWN

ORDERS

- No person in the service of the Crown may accept and wear the insignia of any foreign Order without Her Majesty's permission.
 - 2. Such permission, if granted, will be either-
 - (a) unrestricted, conveyed by Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual and allowing the insignia to be worn on any occasion; or
 - (b) restricted, conveyed by letter from Her Majesty's Private Secretary and allowing the insignia to be worn only on the particular occasions therein specified.
- 3. Full and unrestricted permission by Royal Warrant is contemplated in the case of Orders conferred—
 - (a) for distinguished services in saving or attempting to save life;
 - (b) on any officer in the Royal Navy, Army or Royal Air Force, or any British official, in recognition of services while lent to a foreign Government, if not in receipt of any emoluments from British public funds during the period of such loan.
- 4. Restricted permission is particularly contemplated in the case of Orders conferred in recognition of personal attention to a foreign Sovereign, the Head of a foreign State, or a member of a foreign Royal Family, on the occasion of State or official visits by such personages.
- Restricted permission will also be given for the wearing of insignia of foreign Orders conferred—
 - on members of Her Majesty's Missions abroad in connexion with a State visit by Her Majesty to the foreign capital concerned;
 - (2) on members of deputations of British regiments to foreign Heads of States;
 - (3) on members of Special Missions when The Queen is represented at a foreign Coronation, Wedding, Funeral, or similar occasion; on on any Diplomatic Representative when specially accredited to represent Her Majesty on such occasions (but not on the members of his Staff).

Permission will not be given to-

 (a) the Heads or other members of Her Majesty's Diplomatic or Consular establishments abroad when leaving, whether on transfer or on final retirement;

- (b) officers of British naval, military or air squadrons or units visiting foreign countries, except as provided at (2) above.
- 6. Applications for The Queen's permission, whether full or restricted, will be submitted to Her Majesty by Her Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, who however shall be under no obligation to consider them unless, before the bestowal of the Order, the Government of the foreign country concerned has ascertained, either through the British Diplomatic Representative there or through its Diplomatic Representative at Her Majesty's Court, that having regard to these Regulations the award would not give rise to any objection.

In no case can applications be considered in respect of Orders conferred more than five years previously, or offered in connexion with events so long prior to the proposal to award them.

7. When Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs shall have sought and obtained Her permission for a British subject to wear the insignia of a foreign Order without restriction, he shall signify the same to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, or to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Scotland if appropriate in the circumstances of the case, in order that he may cause a Warrant, as contemplated in Rule 2, to be prepared for the Royal Sign Manual.

When such Warrant shall have been signed by Her Majesty, a notification of the grant of permission shall be published in the London Gazette, or in the Edinburgh Gazette as the case may be.

8. The Warrant conveying Her Majesty's permission may, at the request and expense of the recipient, be registered in the College of Arms if it has been submitted to Her Majesty by Her Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, or in the Court of the Lyon King of Arms if it has been submitted to Her Majesty by Her Principal Secretary of State for Scotland.

Every such Warrant shall contain a clause providing that Her Majesty's licence and permission does not authorise the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence or privilege appertaining to the degree of Knight Bachelor.

 Permission will not be granted for the wearing of the insignia of foreign Orders conferred otherwise than by the Heads or Governments of foreign States recognised by Her Majesty as such.

MEDALS

- 10. Medals, with the exceptions specified below, and State decorations not indicating membership of an Order of Chivalry, are subject to the Regulations in the same manner as Orders, but permission, if granted, is given by letter or certificate, and not by Royal Warrant.
- 11. Medals for saving or attempting to save life at sea or on land, whether conferred on behalf of the Head or Government of a foreign State or by private Life-Saving Societies or Institutions, may be accepted and worn, subject only to the restrictions imposed by the regulations for the Services concerned.

Applications for Her Majesty's permission to wear other medals conferred by Private Societies or Institutions cannot be entertained. 12. Applications for permission to wear foreign medals gained in warlike operations will not be entertained if the grant of such permission would be at variance with considerations of general policy or public interest.

GENERAL

- 13. The wives of persons in the service of the Crown are regarded for the purposes of these Regulations as sharing the disabilities of their husbands concerning the acceptance of foreign awards.
- 14. Persons employed in the commissioned or salaried service of the Crown on a temporary basis are subject to these Regulations in the same way as those employed on a permanent and pensionable basis.
- 15. Members of the various police and constabulary forces maintained in the United Kingdom and Dependent Territories are uniformly regarded as subject to these Regulations, with the exception however of British Transport Commission Police and Dock and Harbour Police Forces established under private Statutes.
- 16. Persons who have retired from the service of the Crown remain subject to these Regulations in so far as concerns the acceptance of foreign Orders, decorations or medals offered in respect of services rendered before their retirement.
- 17. The Regulations shall be regarded as applying, in the same way as to British subjects, to British-protected persons who are such by virtue of their connexion with a Protectorate or Trust Territory administered under the supervision of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies or Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Commonwealth Relations; they may also be regarded as applying in the same manner to British-protected persons who are such by virtue of their connexion with a Protected State administered under the supervision of either of the said Principal Secretaries of State, but Orders, decorations and medals conferred upon such British-protected persons by their Rulers are not regarded as falling within the scope of these Regulations.

ORDERS

- 1. It is The Queen's wish that Her subjects should not accept and wear the insignia of any foreign Order without Her Majesty's permission.
 - 2. Such permission, if granted, will be either-
 - (a) unrestricted, conveyed by Warrant under the Royal Sign-Manual and allowing the insignia to be worn on any occasion, or
 - (b) restricted, conveyed by letter from Her Majesty's Private Secretary and allowing the insignia to be worn only on the particular occasions therein specified.
- 3. Full and unrestricted permission by Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual will only be given in the case of Orders earned by services in the salaried employment of the foreign Government concerned, by honorary consular services of not less than three years' duration, or by distinguished services in saving or attempting to save life.

When permission is given in other cases it will be restricted only.

- Neither full nor restricted permission will be given—
 - (a) when considerations of general policy or public interest must be held to preclude the grant of either;
 - (b) in respect of Orders relating to services wholly rendered more than five years before the question of eligibility for permission is raised;
 - (c) unless authoritative evidence of the award is forthcoming, preferably in the form of a notification through one of the channels prescribed in Rule 5.
- 5. Applications for The Queen's permission, whether full or restricted, will be submitted to Her Majesty by Her Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, who however shall be under no obligation to consider them unless, before the bestowal of the Order, the Government of the foreign country concerned has ascertained, through the British Diplomatic Representative there or through its Diplomatic Representative at Her Majesty's Court, that having regard to these Regulations the award would not give rise to any objection.
- 6. When Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs shall have sought and obtained Her permission for a British subject to wear the insignia of a foreign Order without restriction, he shall signify the sane to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, or to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Scotland if appropriate in the circumstances of the case, in order that he may cause a Warrant, as contemplated in Rule 2, to be prepared for the Royal Sign Manual.

When such Warrant shall have been signed by Her Majesty, a notification of the grant of permission shall be published in the London Gazette, or in the Edinburgh Gazette as the case may be.

7. The Warrant conveying Her Majesty's permission may, at the request and expense of the recipient, be registered in the College of Arms if it has been submitted to Her Majesty by Her Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, or in the Court of the Lyon King of Arms if it has been submitted to Her Majesty by Her Principal Secretary of State for Scotland.

Every such Warrant shall contain a clause providing that Her Majesty's licence and permission does not authorise the assumption of any style, appellation rank, precedence or privilege appertaining to the degree of Knight Bachelor.

Permission will not be granted for the wearing of the insignia of foreign Orders conferred otherwise than by the Heads or Governments of foreign States recognised by Her Majesty as such.

MEDALS

9. Medals, with the exceptions specified below, and State decorations not indicating membership of an Order of Chivalry, are subject to the Regulations in the same manner as Orders, but permission, if granted, is given by letter or certificate and not by Royal Warrant.

No permission is needed for the acceptance of a foreign medal if it is not designed to be worn.

10. Medals for saving or attempting to save life at sea or on land, whether awarded by the Head or Government of a foreign State or by private Life-saving Societies or Institutions, may be accepted and worn without restriction, except that such medals, if given by private organisations, should be worn on the right breast and not on the left with State awards. Not more than two awards in all should be worn in relation to one act of bravery.

Applications for Her Majesty's permission to wear other medals conferred by Private Societies or Institutions cannot be entertained.

11. Applications for permission to wear foreign medals gained in warlike operations will not be entertained if the grant of such permission would be at variance with considerations of general policy or public interest.

GENERAL

12. The Regulations shall be regarded as applying, in the same way as to British subjects, to British-protected persons who are such by virtue of their connexion with a Protectorate or Trust Territory administered under the supervision of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies or Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Commonwealth Relations; they may also be regarded as applying in the same manner to British-protected persons who are such by virtue of their connexion with a Protected State administered under the supervision of either of the said Principal Secretaries of State, but Orders, decorations and medals conferred upon such British-protected persons by their Rulers are not regarded as falling within the scope of these Regulations.

Directions to the Administrator of Roumanian Property in Nigeria given Pursuant to Article 1 (7) of the Treaty of Peace (Roumania) Order, 1948

Whereas at Paris on the 10th day of February, 1947, a Treaty of Peace with Roumania (hereinafter called "the Treaty") was signed on behalf of His late Majesty;

And whereas by section 1 of the Treaties of Peace (Italy, Roumania, Bulgaria, Hungary and Finland) Act, 1947, it was provided that His late Majesty might make such appointments, establish such offices, make such Orders in Council, and do such things as should appear to him to be necessary for carrying out the Treaty and for giving effect to any provisions of the Treaty;

And whereas by Article 1 of the Treaty of Peace (Roumania) Order, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as "the Peace Treaty Order") made in pursuance of the

said section 1 it was provided

(1) That all property, rights and interests as therein specified and defined should be charged with the amounts due at the date when the Treaty came into force in respect of claims by His late Majesty (otherwise than in the right of His Government in the Dominions) and by British nationals (other than British nationals ordinarily resident in any of the Dominions) against the Government of Roumania or Roumanian nationals including debts due to His late Majesty or them by the Government of Roumania or Roumanian nationals, other than claims fully satisfied under any Article of the Treaty other than Article 27;

(2) That the Board of Trade may, for the purpose of making effective and enforcing such charge as aforesaid, appoint an Administrator to act under the general direction of the Board, and may by order vest in such Administrator any property, rights or interests subject to the said

charge

And whereas it is provided by paragraph (7) of Article 1 of the Peace Treaty Order that the said Administrator should retain out of the property, rights or interests, or the proceeds thereof, vested in or collected or received by him under the said Order, such sum as, subject to the consent of the Treasury, he may consider necessary to cover expenses and the amount for which he may be liable in respect of any proceedings or claims, and subject thereto should hold and deal with the said property, rights or interests, and the proceeds thereof and the sums received by him in such manner as the Treasury may direct;

And whereas by paragraphs (1) and (3) of Article 7 of the Peace Treaty Order it was provided that the Order should apply to the whole of His late Majesty's dominions and Protected Territories except the Dominions, and that in such application any reference to "Board of Trade" or "Treasury", "property, rights or interests" and "Administrator" should be construed respectively as a reference to the Governor or Officer Administering the Government of the territory in question, the property, rights or interests within that territory, and the Administrator appointed

for that territory;

And whereas on the 23rd of September, 1954, the Governor in pursuance of the Peace Treaty Order appointed an Administrator of Roumanian Property in Nigeria who is hereinafter referred to as "the Administrator";

Now, therefore, the Governor-General in pursuance of paragraph (7) of Article 1 of the Peace Treaty Order, hereby gives the following directions;

- 1. In these Directions—
- the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them—

"The United Kingdom" shall include the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man;

"The Roumanian Fund" means the residue of the property, rights or interests or the proceeds thereof vested in, collected or received by the Administrator under the Peace Treaty Order remaining after any transfer or release which has been or may be made in pursuance of the proviso to Article 1 (2) of the Peace Treaty Order and after the Administrator shall have retained such sum as, with the consent of the Governor-General he considers necessary to cover expenses and the amount for which he may be liable in respect of any proceedings or claims;

"Roumania" means all territory under Roumanian sovereignty on the 15th September, 1947;

"Short term banking claim" means a claim arising out of the banking facilities covered by paragraph 1 of an agreement known as Technical Agreement in relation to Short Term Banking Credits made on the 30th May, 1936, between the National Bank of Roumania and the Joint Committee of British Short Term Creditors representative of Banks and Banking Institutions in Great Britain and similar claims arising out of other banking facilities made available to the Government of Roumania or a Roumanian national for the purpose of financing current trade by persons carrying on the business of banking in the United Kingdom;

"Trade debt" means any sum due and payable

- (i) under a contract for the sale of goods whether executed or not,
- (ii) in respect of the servicing, preservation, transport, insuring and advertising of goods in the course of trade whether or not the goods are the subject of any such contract as aforesaid.
- (iii) in respect of professional and agency charges and disbursements, or
- (iv) under a bill of exchange given for the discharge of obligations under any such contract as aforesaid,

but shall not include sums due and payable in respect of

- (a) passenger fares other than disbursements under (iii) above,
 - (b) wharfingers' charges;

"War Damage Bond" means a bearer bond not negotiable on the Stock Exchange, issued by the Kingdom of Roumania on the 1st October, 1928 and bearing the heading "Règlement des indemnités dues pour les destructions des exploitations pétroliféres ordonnées en 1916, conformément a la convention ci-contre";

(2) "national" has the meaning assigned to it by paragraph (1) of Article 5 of the Peace Treaty Order;

- (3) references to a person being a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies on any specified date shall include a citizen of Southern Rhodesia within the meaning of the Southern Rhodesian Citizenship and British Nationality Act, 1949, as amended by the Southern Rhodesian Citizenship and British Nationality Amendment Act, 1951;
- (4) for the purposes of these Directions "British protected person" means a person who was at the date of these Directions a British protected person within the meaning of the British Nationality Act, 1948, and the British Protectorates, Protected States and Protected Persons Order in Council, 1949:
- (5) for the purposes of these Directions no effect shall be given to any Roumanian law which came into force after the 14th August, 1947.

2. The Administrator shall:

(i) so far as possible convert into money such of the Roumanian Fund as is not held in money;

(ii) from time to time when so directed and as directed by the Governor-General make distributions from the monetary balance (hereinafter referred to as "the distributable balance") of the Roumanian Fund;

(iii) add to the distributable balance any sums which he may receive by virtue of the Peace Treaty Order and by virtue of that Order as modified in pursuance of Article 7 (2) thereof.

3. (1) The Administrator shall make payments out of the distributable balance to every person who makes application to him and establishes to his satisfaction a claim to which these Directions apply and shall dismiss each application where in his opinion such a claim is not established.

(2) In the event of the death, bankruptcy, windingup, mental incapacity or absence from his usual place
of residence of any person who has made application
to the Administrator and established a claim to which
these Directions apply the Administrator shall make
payments as aforesaid either to any person authorised
by any such person as aforesaid in that behalf or to
any person entitled to deal with his property.

4. A claim to which these Directions apply is :-

(1) a claim of a person, from whom in accordance with Clause 5 hereof the Administrator may accept an application to establish that claim, for any sum due and payable on the 15th September, 1947, from the Government of Roumania, or a Roumanian national resident at the time when the sum fell due and payable, in a country which was then or which subsequently became at war with the United Kingdom, in respect of

(a) a debt which became due and payable on or after the 15th February, 1935, under any contract whether entered into before, on or after that date (including any debenture, debenture stock, or bond issued by any company or Government or any Municipal or other authority) or

(b) a balance in an account at a bank in Roumania, or

(c) a dividend or monetary bonus due and payable on or after the 15th February, 1935, on any shares or stock issued by any company or other body corporate;

(2) a claim for a sum due and payable on a bond described under the heading "Caisse Commune Obligations" in the Schedule to these Directions;

PROVIDED that

(i) these Directions shall not apply to any claim for a sum due to Her Majesty's Government arising directly or indirectly out of the war between the United Kingdom and Germany, Austria, Bulgaría and Hungary which terminated on the 31st August, 1921,

(ii) a sum shall be deemed for the purpose of these Directions to have been due and payable in respect of a balance in an account at a bank in Roumania or arising under any contract, notwithstanding that payment thereof has not been demanded or that any due notice has not been given or that any application has not been made,

(iii) these Directions shall not apply to any claim for a sum due and payable in respect of

(a) a debt arising under any contract or treaty of reinsurance and

(b) a debt arising under any contract of insurance, other than a contract of life insurance, where the event or events insured against occurred before the 15th February, 1935 or after the 15th February, 1941, and

(iv) save as provided in sub-paragraph (g) of paragraph (1) of Clause 5 hereof, these Directions shall not apply to any claim arising out of

a bond except by the owner of the bond.

5. The Administrator may accept applications to establish claims from the following persons:

 in the case of a claim for a sum arising otherwise than out of a bond specified in the Schedule hereto, from

(a) Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom in respect of any sum due and payable to His late Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom on the 15th September, 1947,

(b) an individual to whom the sum claimed was due and payable on each of the dates hereinafter mentioned and who—

(i) on the date when the sum claimed became due and payable and on the 15th September, 1947, was a British subject or British protected person and

(ii) on the date of these Directions was a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies or a British protected person and was ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom or in any place outside any territory for whose foreign relations Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom are responsible,

(c) a body of persons (including a partnership) which on the date when the sum became due and payable, and on the 15th September, 1947, and on the date of these Directions was constituted or incorporated under the laws in force in Nigeria, and to which the sum claimed was due and payable on each of those dates,

(d) joint owners provided that one of them satisfied the relevant requirements specified in sub-paragraphs (b) or (c) of this paragraph,

(e) an assignee or any subsequent assignee of a sum due and payable and of the right to apply for a claim to be established thereto to whom that sum was due and payable on the date of these Directions, PROVIDED that the person to whom the sum claimed was payable on the date on which the sum became due and payable and on the 15th September, 1947 and on the date of these Directions, fulfilled in

each case the relevant requirements specified in sub-paragraphs (a) (b) or (c) of this paragraph relevant to those dates with which an individual or body of persons must comply in order that his or its application may be accepted by the Administrator under this Clause,

- (f) the Personal Representatives (of a deceased individual) to whom the sum claimed was due and payable on the date of these Directions, PROVIDED that at the date of his death or on the 15th September, 1947, whichever is the earlier, the deceased fulfilled the requirements specified in sub-paragraph (b) relevant to those dates with which an individual must comply in order that his application may be accepted by the Administrator under this Clause,
- (g) in the case of a War Damage Bond and without prejudice to the other provisions of this paragraph, a body of persons, which, on the 15th September, 1947 was constituted or incorporated under the laws in force in Nigeria and which on the 10th June, 1948 was the holder of ordinary shares in either of two Roumanian companies known as Astra Romana S.A. and Steaua Romana S.A. to which said Roumanian company a sum was due and payable on 10th June, 1948 in respect of its holding of War Damage Bonds;
- (2) in the event after the date of these Directions of the death, bankruptcy, winding-up, mental, incapacity or absence from his usual place of residence of any person who would otherwise have been entitled to claim under the preceding provisions of this Clause, any person entitled to deal with the property of any such person.
- The Administrator shall not permit a claim to be established by a beneficiary of a trust if a trustee of the same trust has established a claim in respect of the same matter.
- 7. Subject to the provisions of this Clause the Administrator shall assess the amount due in respect of each claim to which these Directions apply at such sum as seems to him to be just and equitable having regard to all the circumstances, which sum is herein-after referred to as the "assessable amount of the claim".

PROVIDED that

- (a) in the case of a War Damage Bond the assessable amount of the claim shall be the capital sum of the Bond at date of issue and where a Roumanian company is concerned shall as far as practicable bear to the total sum due and payable to the Roumanian company concerned the like proportion which the ordinary shareholding in the said Roumanian company of the person or body of persons making the application bore on the 10th June, 1948 to the total of ordinary shares issued by the said Roumanian company,
- (b) in the case of a short term banking claim the assessable amount of the claim shall be the capital outstanding in respect of that claim on the 15th February, 1941 excluding any interest accruing after that date,
- (c) in the case of any bond of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto the assessable amount of the claim shall be the capital outstanding on the 15th February, 1941, excluding any interest,
- (d) in the case of any other loan, the assessable amount of the claim shall be the aggregate of:—

- (i) the amount due and payable on the 15th September, 1947 in respect of interest that fell due between the 15th February, 1935 and the 15th September 1947, and either
- (ii) the amount (if any) attributable on the 15th September, 1947 to the loan in respect of sinking fund payments which had fallen due between the 15th February, 1935 and the 15th September 1947, or
- (iii) the amount (if any) due and payable on the 15th September, 1947 in respect of capital repayment in accordance with the terms of the loan which had fallen due between the 15th February, 1935 and the 15th September, 1947,

Provided that the assessable amount of the claim in respect of any loan shall not exceed 125 per cent of the capital outstanding on the 15th February, 1941,

- (e) in the case of a trade debt arising under a contract subsisting on or before the 15th February, 1941 the assessable amount of the claim shall be the amount due and payable in respect of that debt, excluding any interest,
- (f) in the case of any other obligation the assessable amount of the claim shall include not only the capital but also any interest due and payable on the 15th September, 1947,
- (g) in the case of any person who has received any compensation or recoupment from any other source in respect of his claim, that con pensation or recoupment shall be deducted from the amount assessed under this clause, and the net amount after such deduction has been made shall be the assessable amount of his claim.
- 8. Where the assessable amount of the claim consists of or comprises a sum expressed in a unit of foreign currency, the Administrator shall determine the value in sterling of that sum in accordance with the following provisions, that is to say—
 - (1) where the sum is due and payable under a contract in which provision is made for a specified rate of exchange its value in sterling shall be determined in accordance with the rate of exchange so specified;
 - (2) where the sum, or any part thereof, became due and payable on or before the 15th February, 1941, the value in sterling of that sum, or such part thereof as aforesaid, shall be determined at the rate of exchange obtaining on the 15th February, 1941;
 - (3) where the sum represents capital outstanding in accordance with the provisions of proviso (a), (b) or (c) of Clause 7 hereof or a sum computed in accordance with the provisions of proviso (d) of Clause 7 hereof its value in sterling shall be determined at the rate of exchange obtaining on the 15th February, 1941;
 - (4) where the sum, or any part thereof, first became due and payable after the 15th February, 1941, the value in sterling of that sum, or such part thereof as aforesaid, shall be determined at the rate of exchange obtaining on the 14th August, 1947.

For the purposes of this Clause the rate of exchange between a foreign currency and sterling on any date shall be taken to be the middle official rate of exchange fixed by the Bank of England on the date or if there was no such rate on that date the rate which the Treasury may determine as appropriate for ascertaining the value in sterling of a sum payable in that foreign currency on that date.

- 9. The amount for which the assessable amount of a claim shall rank for payment (hereinafter referred to as the "amount ranking for payment") shall be calculated as follows:—
 - (1) in respect of claims arising out of War Damage Bonds, the amount ranking for payment shall be calculated by multiplying the assessable amount of the claim by 0.47,
 - (2) in respect of claims arising out of any other bond of a description specified in the Schedule hereto, the amount ranking for payment shall be calculated by multiplying the assessable amount of the claim by the figure specified in relation to that bond in the second column of that schedule,
 - (3) in respect of claims arising out of any other loans the amount ranking for payment shall be the assessable amount of the claim,
 - (4) in respect of short-term banking claims the amount ranking for payment shall be calculated by multiplying the assessable amount of the claim by 1.5,
 - (5) in respect of claims arising out of trade debts arising out of contracts subsisting on or before the 15th February, 1941, the amount ranking for payment shall be calculated by multiplying the assessable amount of the claim by 1.5,
 - (6) in respect of any claims arising out of any other obligation, the amount ranking for payment shall be the assessable amount of the claim.
- 10. The amount to be paid by the Administrator to a person who has established to the Administrator's satisfaction a claim to which these Directions apply, shall, so far as practicable, bear to the amount of the distributable balance the like proportion which the amount of that claim ranking for payment bears to the total of the amounts ranking for payment of all claims established pursuant to these Directions.
- 11. The Administrator may from time to time as sums become available for distribution make an interim distribution therefrom to the persons or any of them who at the date of such distribution had established claims to which these Directions apply.
- 12. When it appears to the Administrator that the residue of the distributable balance will not produce a dividend which can reasonably and conveniently be distributed to all persons whose claims have been established he shall consult the Governor-General and shall dispose of such residue as the Governor-General shall direct.
- 13. The Administrator shall require applications in respect of claims to which these Directions apply to be submitted in such forms as may be prescribed by the Governor-General and within such times as shall be prescribed by the Governor-General and shall dismiss any application which is not made in the prescribed form or within the prescribed time.

- 14. The Administrator shall prepare accounts at such times and in such form as the Governor-General may direct of the sums received and the sums paid by him and shall forward them to the Director of Federal Audit for audit as soon as possible after the end of the relevant accounting period.
- 15. These Directions may be varied or supplemented by subsequent directions, being either special or general directions.
- 16. The Interpretation Ordinance shall apply to the interpretation of these Directions as it applies to the interpretation of an Ordinance.
