PRESCRIPTION OF STANDARD AND GRADES OF PALM OIL

1. It is notified that the Nigeria Oil Palm Produce Marketing Board under section 17 of the above Ordinance has abolished the previous Special Grade of Palm Oil and prescribed in its place with effect from midnight on the 30th December, 1954:—

Special Grade A Palm Oil, being exportable palm oil containing not more than 3.5 per cent of free fatty acid, and

Special Grade B Palm Oil, being exportable palm oil containing more than 3.5 per cent but not more than 4.5 per cent of free fatty acid.

2. Government Notice No. 519 of 1951 remains in force only to prescribe the standard of exportable palm kernels. For all other purposes that Notice and Government Notices 1230 of 1951, 523 and 524 of 1952, and 1824 of 1953 are superseded by the Appendix hereto which consolidates their contents without change other than in respect of the amendment effected by paragraph 1 above.

APPENDIX

Standard and Grades of Palm Oil as from 31st December, 1954

A. The standard prescribed for exportable palm oil is that of "first quality", which means palm oil which contains less than 2 per cent by weight of water and extraneous substance and is free from any adulterant.

B. The grades prescribed are as follows:-

Special Grade A.—Exportable palm oil containing not more than 3.5 per cent of free fatty acid;

Special Grade B.—Exportable palm oil containing more than 3.5 per cent but not more than 4.5 per cent of free fatty acid;

Grade I.—Exportable palm oil containing more than 4.5 per cent but not more than 9 per cent of free fatty acid;

Grade II.—Exportable palm oil containing more than 9 per cent but not more than 18 per cent of free fatty acid;

Grade III.—Exportable palm oil containing more than 18 per cent but not more than 30 per cent of free fatty acid.

IMPORTATION OF MOTOR CARS AND STATION WAGONS FROM THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND CANADA DURING 1955

As in previous years, the importation from the United States of America and Canada of a limited number of saloon cars and station wagons will be permitted during 1955. The need to conserve dollars still remains and the number of letters of authority to purchase will be strictly controlled by the various issuing authorities. Only those applicants who can adduce evidence of special need for these vehicles will be issued with letters of authority to purchase.

- 2. Applications by intending purchasers, in the following categories only, should be submitted to the Director, Department of Commerce and Industries, Lagos:—
 - (a) Heads of Government Departments and public corporations, in respect of their Lagos official requirements only;
 - (b) Federal Government officers, wherever stationed;
 - (c) Heads of firms with Headquarters in Lagos and branches in the Regions, in respect of the firm's overall requirements for Lagos and the Regions;
 - (d) Individuals resident in Lagos.
