## ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY TO MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS UNDER THE CONSTITUTION

It is announced for general information that the Governor-General, in accordance with the provisions of section 98 of the Nigeria (Constitution) Order in Council, 1954, has charged the Ministers mentioned in the first column of the First Schedule to this notice with responsibility for the matters set out opposite to their names in the second column of that Schedule and with responsibility for the departments of government set out opposite to their names in the third column of that Schedule.

It is also announced that the Governor-General has been pleased to direct that the Minister responsible for each of the groups of matters set out in the second column of the First Schedule shall be designated by the title specified in relation to that group of matters in the fourth column of that Schedule.

The Governor-General has further assigned to each of the *Ex-officio* Members of the Council of Ministers mentioned in the first column of the Second Schedule to this notice (in addition to their other responsibilities and functions) responsibility for the matters set out opposite their offices in the second column of that Schedule and with responsibility for the departments of government set out opposite their offices in the third column of that Schedule.
