PRESCRIPTION OF GRADE

It is notified for general information that under the powers conferred upon it by section 17 of the Nigeria Cocoa Marketing Ordinance (No. 33 of 1947) (as amended by Ordinance No. 35 of 1948), the Nigeria Cocoa Marketing Board has prescribed a sub-grade of cocoa that may be purchased for export with effect from the 14th January, 1955, to the 31st March, 1955, both days inclusive :

Sub-grade Cocoa.—Cocoa which is thoroughly dry, free from foreign matter and from smoky, velvety or black beans and which contains less than :—
