TERMS OF LOANS

1. All loans to the Electricity Corporation, including those to the Native Authorities at Kano and Katsina (whose liabilities in respect of the electricity undertakings for which the loans were granted were taken over by the Corporation from 1st April, 1952) are subject to a moratorium under the terms of paragraph 22 of the White Paper, "The Capital Requirements of the Electricity Corporations of Nigeria."
