2. This Notice takes effect as on and from the 1st day of April, 1955. With effect from the same date, all Government and Public Notices concerned with the prescription of grades and standards of quality for produce which have been issued from time to time by the Nigeria Cocoa Marketing Board, the Nigeria Groundnut Marketing Board, the Nigeria Oil Palm Produce Marketing Board and the Nigeria Cotton Marketing Board are hereby cancelled. The contents of such Notices as aforesaid are by this Notice, however, consolidated without material change except in regard to the name of the issuing authority.

Grade II.—Cocoa which does not qualify for Grade I and which is thoroughly dry, free from foreign matter and from smoky, velvety or black beans and which contain less than—

(a) Five per cent by count of mouldy beans,

(b) Ten per cent by count of mouldy, weevily, decayed, flat and/or germinated beans, and

(c) Ten per cent by count of unfermented and/or insufficiently fermented beans.

2. Provided that any parcel of cocoa of which a sample of three hundred beans weighs less than eleven ounces shall be designated "Light Cocoa", Grade I or II as the case may be.

GROUNDNUTS (KANO AREA)

The standard prescribed is that of "exportable quality", which means groundnuts which contain not more than 0.2 per cent by weight of stones, laterite and other mineral matters and not more than 1.5 per cent by weight of total impurities.

PALM KERNELS

The standard prescribed for exportable palm kernels is that of "first quality", which means palm kernels which contain less than 4 per cent by weight of shell, fibre, rotten and decayed kernels and/or extraneous matter and which are thoroughly dry and hard.

PALM OIL

A. The standard prescribed for exportable palm oil is that of "first quality", which means palm oil which contains less than 2 per cent by weight of water and extraneous substance and is free from any adulterant.

B. The grades prescribed are as follows :—

Special Grade A—Exportable palm oil containing not more than 3.5 per cent of free fatty acid ;

Special Grade B—Exportable palm oil containing more than 3.3 per cent but not more than 4.5 per cent of free fatty acid ;

Grade I—Exportable palm oil containing more than 4.5 per cent but not more than 9 per cent of free fatty acid ;

Grade II—Exportable palm oil containing more than 9 per cent but not more than 18 per cent of free fatty acid ;

Grade III—Exportable palm oil containing more than 18 per cent but not more than 30 per cent of free fatty acid.

SEED COTTON

The grades prescribed are as follows :—

Grade N.A. 1—American seed cotton grown in Nigeria containing not more than 5 per cent (by volume) of immature seed cotton and not more than 1 per cent (by volume) of damaged or stained seed cotton and which, as regards freedom from leaf and other foreign matter, conforms to the standard fixed for this grade.

Grade N.A. 2—American seed cotton grown in Nigeria containing not more than 6 per cent (by volume) of immature seed cotton and not more than 6 per cent (by volume) of damaged or stained seed cotton and which, as regards freedom from leaf and other foreign matter, conforms to the standard fixed for this grade.

Grade N.A. 3—Any other American seed cotton which, as regards freedom from leaf and other foreign matter, conforms to the standard fixed for this grade.

Grade I.N. 1—Improved Ishan seed cotton grown in Nigeria containing not more than 3 per cent (by volume) of ordinary native seed cotton and not more than ten per cent (by volume) of damaged or stained seed cotton and which, as regards freedom from leaf and other foreign matter, conforms to the standard fixed for this grade.

Grade I.N. 2—Improved Ishan seed cotton grown in Nigeria containing not more than 3 per cent (by volume) of ordinary native seed cotton and not more than 20 per cent (by volume) of damaged or stained seed cotton and which, as regards freedom from leaf and other foreign matter, conforms to the standard fixed for this grade.

Grade I.N. 3—Improved Ishan seed cotton grown in Nigeria containing not more than 30 per cent (by volume) of damaged or stained seed cotton and which, as regards freedom from leaf and other

foreign matter, conforms to the standard fixed for this grade.

1955-56

The Federal Government proposes to offer, subject to the provision of necessary funds by the House of Representatives, bursaries and scholarships to become available in the years 1955 and 1956. The bursaries will be tenable at the University College, Ibadan for courses beginning in October 1955. Scholarships will also be tenable at colleges and institutions in the United Kingdom for courses beginning in 1956.

2. The courses for which awards will be made will include:—

(i) Professional degree courses (*e.g.*, in Engineering, Medicine, etc.).

(ii) General degree courses in Arts or Science.

(iii) Teacher Training Courses, (*e.g.*, the Diploma in Education, Professional Teachers Certificate Course, etc.).

(iv) General nursing and midwifery and specialised branches of post-registration nursing (*e.g.*, Ophthalmic nursing, Tuberculosis nursing, Orthopaedic nursing, Ward Sister's or Sister Tutor's Course, etc.).

(v) Miscellaneous specialist courses (*e.g.*, domestic science and physical training).

3. Only candidates in the following categories will be eligible to apply for these scholarship and bursary awards financed by the Federal Government:—

(i) those born or permanently domiciled in the Federal territory of Lagos and the Southern Cameroons;

(ii) officers serving in Federal Departments and in branches of other departments or inter-territorial institutions for which the Federal Government is responsible;

(iii) those not born or permanently domiciled in Federal territory, *vide* (i) above, nor serving Federal officers, *vide* (ii) above, but who wish to seek the requisite qualifications for ultimate appointment to the FEDERAL PUBLIC SERVICE in such senior administrative, executive or professional grades as the Federal Government determine.

(iv) existing staff of autonomous bodies for which the Federal Government is responsible, who are seeking further administrative executive and professional training.

4. In addition the Federal Government proposes to award, on the recommendation of the Ibadan University College Authorities, a limited number of State Scholarships tenable at the University College and selected on the results of the University College entrance examination.

A MEDICAL EXAMINATION WHICH WILL INCLUDE A TUBERCULIN TEST AND AN X-RAY EXAMINATION OF THE CHEST WILL ALSO BE NECESSARY.

6. The majority of awards will be for courses now available at the University College, Ibadan. Intending candidates should acquaint themselves with the conditions for entry to the University College.
