A two-year residential course leading to the University of London General Certificate of Education Examination at the Advanced Level will commence at the Ibadan Branch of the Nigerian College of Technology on 3rd October, 1955.

*Group A.*—Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics.

*Group B.*—Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology.

*Group C.*—Any THREE of the following—English Literature, Geography, History, Latin and Mathematics, providing that History and Mathematics are NOT taken together.

Students intending to become Engineers are advised to take *Group A*.

Some vacancies in *Groups A and C* will be reserved for applicants intending to take this Course as the first step to qualifying as teachers. Such applicants should consult their Director of Education.

A certain number of candidates for *Group B* may be allowed to enter this group as a preliminary to a new professional pharmaceutical course to be instituted at Ibadan. Such candidates may be trained at Government expense providing that they are prepared to enter into an agreement. 3. Candidates for admission to any of the above Groups of this course must have a good and suitable Cambridge School Certificate or equivalent or better educational qualification.

4. The total cost of the course, excluding vacation Boarding fee but including pocket money, will vary from about £100 to £115 per year, depending on the Group of subjects taken.
