*The Magistrates' Courts Ordinance (Chapter 122)*

DIRECTIONS GIVEN BY THE ACTING  
CHIEF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 3  
OF THE MAGISTRATES' COURTS  
ORDINANCE

I, OLUMUYIWA JIBOWU, ACTING CHIEF JUSTICE OF NIGERIA, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Chief Justice by section 3 of the Magistrates' Courts Ordinance hereby give the following directions:—

1. These Directions may be cited as the Magisterial Districts (Amendment) Directions, 1955, and shall come into operation on the 16th day of May, 1955.

2. The Schedule to the Magisterial Districts Directions, as from time to time amended, is hereby amended by deleting Items 1 and 2 and substituting therefor Items 1 and 2 in the Schedule hereunder and by adding thereto Item 19.




