- 1. This Notice is issued to draw attention in convenient form to the law contained in the Exchange Control Ordinance, 1950, in so far as it concerns goods exported from Nigeria, and to the exchange control formalities to be observed by exporters in respect of such goods.
- 2. Section 23 of the Ordinance enables the Financial Secretary to make orders prescribing the manner in which payments shall be received for goods exported from Nigeria to any destination, and the Exchange Control (Payments) (No. 2) Order, 1954, has accordingly been made covering all goods exported to any destination outside the Scheduled Territories. The exporter of any such goods is required to show to the satisfaction of the Comptroller of Customs that payment has been made to a person resident in Nigeria in an approved manner, or will be so made within six months from the date of export or such other period as the Financial Secretary may direct, and that the payment made, or to be made, is such as to represent a return for the goods which is in all the circumstances satisfactory in the interest of Nigeria.
- Exporters in any doubt as to whether a destination is outside the Scheduled Territories, or as to the appropriate method of payment, should consult their bankers. The Scheduled Territories are defined in the First Schedule to the Exchange Control Ordinance, 1950, and are as follows :-

The fully self-governing countries of the British Commonwealth except Canada;

Any Colony under the dominion of Her Majesty; Any territory administered by the Government of any part of Her Majesty's dominions under the trusteeship system of the United Nations;

Any British protectorate or British protected

state;

The Irish Republic: South West Africa;

Iraq; Iceland;

Burma;

The Hashemite Kingdom of the Jordan;

The United Kingdom of Libya.

NORMAL PROCEDURE

4. Documentation.—Exporters of goods to countries outside the Scheduled Territories must complete a Form N.C.D. 3X in respect of goods over a value of £25 and not exceeding £250 f.o.b. and Form

- N.C.D. 3 for exports of a value over £250 f.o.b. which are obtainable from any Bank or Collector of Customs and Excise, except in the following cases:—
 - (a) Gift parcels not exceeding £25 in value (see paragraph 15).
 - (b) Goods exported in a traveller's baggage and regarded as his personal effects (see paragraph 15).
 - (c) Goods dealt with under the transhipment procedure (see paragraph 11).

The remainder of this Notice applies equally to Form N.C.D 3 and to Form N.C.D. 3X except that reference to pages 3/4 should be ignored if Form N.C.D. 3X is being used.

- 5. Value to be shown on Form N.C.D. 3 (item 4).— The amount entered under item 4 on N.C.D. 3 must be the net proceeds of sale of the goods to the purchaser abroad. The amount must be shown either in sterling or in the currency of the country to which the goods are being sent, as the case may be. If the shipper is the agent of his own firm or subsidiary company in the United Kingdom or is the agent of a principal in the United Kingdom, he will nevertheless be responsible for completing under item 4 the net amount of the proceeds which will be received by his principal.
- 6. Goods shipped on consignment.—In the case of goods shipped on consignment, the Form N.C.D. 3, together with the application for an export licence, must be submitted to the Department of Commerce and Industries for verification. The exporter must in such cases furnish a certificate in the following form on the pages 2 and 4 of the Form N.C.D. 3:—

"I/We certify that the goods described overleaf are being shipped on consignment. The approximate market value of the goods is ______ and it is expected that an amount of approximately will ultimately be received and repatriated.

Date..... Signature.....

- 7. Goods exported as cargo or air freight.—The completed Form N.C.D. 3 must be produced to the Customs authorities with the Customs Export Bill of Entry. The Customs will retain the form for onward transmission to the Nigerian Exchange Control, who will in due course return pages 3 and 4 to the exporter or his agent. Immediately on receiving payment for the goods, the exporter must see that his bank completes the certificate on page 3 showing that the proceeds of the shipment have been duly received in the appropriate manner. The procedure to be followed, according to the method of payment, is described in detail in the notes on page 4 of the form. The approved methods of payment for exports are stated in the Third Schedule to the Exchange Control (Payments) (No. 2) Order, 1954.
- 8. Goods exported or paid for through an agent or principal in the United Kingdom.
- (a) Exports to the American Account Area and Canada:—

Where payment is received through an agent in the United Kingdom, or where the exporter in Nigeria is acting as agent for a principal who receives payment in the United Kingdom, the pages 3 and 4 should be forwarded by the exporter to the agent or principal in the United Kingdom, who will ensure that the necessary bank certificate

- on page 3 is obtained. Unnecessary correspondence will be avoided by prompt compliance with this requirement.
- (b) Exports to all other non-Scheduled Territories:—

Procedure will be as in (a) above except that the certificate of a United Kingdom bank that payment has been made is not required. The agent or principal will return pages 3 and 4 to the exporter for lodging with the Nigerian Exchange Control.

- 9. Exports by post.-Where merchandise is exported by post, pages 1 and 2 of the Form must be placed in an envelope marked "Currency Declaration" which must be attached firmly to the package in such a manner as to be readily detachable. The outer cover of every postal package for which a Form is furnished must be clearly marked "Currency Declaration" followed by the serial number of the Form used. Where a single Form covers a batch of parcels the envelope containing the Form must be parcels, Nos. refer" and each parcel must be marked "one of a batch of . parcels covered by one Currency Declaration". Failure to observe these requirements may lead to delay in despatch. Pages 3 and 4 of the Form must be retained by the sender to be dealt with as explained in the notes on page 4 of the Form.
- 10. Export Licences.—It must be clearly understood that nothing in the law or procedure relating to Exchange Control relieves an exporter from the necessity of obtaining an export licence, where appropriate. Application for such licences should be made to the Department of Commerce and Industries.
- 11. Transhipments.—In the case of goods arriving in Nigeria from any part of the Scheduled Territories for transhipment to any destination outside those territories, documentary evidence should be produced to the Customs authorities showing that the Exchange Control authority in the country of origin has approved shipment to the country of final destination. Form N.C.D. 3 is not required for goods which arrive from any place outside the Scheduled Territories and which are dealt with under transhipment procedure.

PROCEDURE TO BE FOLLOWED IN SPECIAL CASES

- 12. Export without Payment.—Persons desiring to export goods without receiving payment or in other circumstances not conforming to normal requirements, except as provided below, should apply to the Nigerian Exchange Control, through their own bank, forwarding Form N.C.D. 3 completed as far as possible. It should be endorsed by the Nigerian Exchange Control on the Form N.C.D. 3 before lodgment with the Customs.
- 13. Trade samples and printed advertising matter.—Forms N.C.D. 3 in respect of bona fide trade samples and printed advertising matter supplied without charge need not be submitted to the Nigerian Exchange Control, for prior endorsement. Instead, they may bear a statement that the goods are bona fide trade samples, or advertising matter, supplied without charge; a copy of the packing list or advice note should be attached to the Form N.C.D. 3 in the case of trade samples. If the circumstances are unusual in any way, however, the exporter is

advised, in order to avoid possible delay at the port, to forward the Form N.C.D. 3 to the Nigerian Exchange Control through his bank for approval prior to exportation.

- 14. Extended Credits.-Exporters who wish to give credit to the purchaser beyond six months from the date of export should forward to the Nigerian Exchange Control, through their own bank, a letter of explanation stating the extension required. Before any contract providing for extended credit terms is entered into, the approval of the Nigerian Exchange Control should be obtained. Any extension authorised must be endorsed by the Nigerian Exchange Control on the relative Form N.C.D. 3 before lodgment with the Customs at the time of shipment of the goods.
- 15. Gift Parcels and Passengers' Baggage .-Special conditions governing the export of gift parcels and of goods in passenger's baggage are laid down in Public Notice No. 4 of 1952 and Public Notice No. 5 of 1952 published in Gazette No. 3 of 1952.

WARNING

16. Penalties.-The attention of exporters and others concerned with the export of goods is drawn to the fact that heavy penalties attach to contraventions of the provisions of the Exchange Control Ordinance, 1950.

NOTICE TO BUILDING, CIVIL ENGINEERING AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING CONTRACTORS

FEDERAL WORKS REGISTRATION BOARD

Building, Civil Engineering and Electrical Engineering Contractors are invited to take note of the following procedure which has the approval of the Council of Ministers.

- 1. Only contractors who are registered in the Federal Works Register of Contractors are eligible to be invited to tender for contracts for Federal Public Works to a value of more than £500.
- 2. Contractors who wish to be registered in the Federal Works Register of Contractors should complete a Pre-Qualification Form and submit it with their application to the Federal Works Registration Board, P.W.D. Headquarters, together with their application for registration. Pre-Qualification Forms may be obtained, on application, from the Secretary of the Board. No fee is chargeable for the Form or for registration.
- Contractors are requested to state in their applications the Districts in which they are prepared to undertake work for the Federal Government. This will facilitate the issuing of invitations to tender.
- 4. Contractors so registered will be classified into categories according to their capacity. The categories are :-

A. £,501-£3,000 B. £3,001-£6,000 C. £6,001-£10,000 E. £,20,001-£,50,000 F. £50,001-£100,000 G. Över £100,000

D. £10,001-£20,000

- 5. Contractors may be invited to tender for contracts the value of which is within their own category. They may also be invited to tender for contracts the value of which is within two categories below the category in which they are classified. For example, a contractor who is classified in category E may be invited to tender for contracts within the range £6,001 to £50,000. The Minister of Works, notwithstanding the foregoing, reserves the right, in exceptional circumstances, to invite contractors in the last three categories to tender for contracts in the first four categories of rule 4.
- 6. Contractors may apply for re-classification into a different category after the lapse of a period of twelve months from the date of their previous classification.

- 7. A contractor who fails to complete a contract will be required to explain the reasons for his failure in writing to the Federal Works Registration Board which will consider each case on its merits.
- If a contractor is unable to produce sufficient justification for his failure, the Federal Works Registration Board is empowered to remove his name from the register.
- Appeals from the decisions of the Federal Works Registration Board will lie in the first instance to the Director of Federal Public Works and then to the Federal Minister of Works.
- 10. Contractors who wish to be invited to tender for contracts the value of which is less than £500, should apply to the Chief Engineer (Lagos) for registration on the Register of Petty Contractors. Contractors who have been classified by the Federal Works Registration Board in category A or B of rule 4 may apply to the Chief Engineer (Lagos) for registration in the Register of Petty Contractors.
