GREETINGS:—

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section 4 of the Supreme Court Ordinance (Chapter 211 of the Laws of Nigeria), it is enacted that the Supreme Court of Nigeria shall consist of a Chief Justice and such other Judges as the Governor-General shall from time to time appoint by letters patent under the public seal of the Federation of Nigeria in accordance with such instructions as he may receive from Her Majesty and that the Chief Justice and judges shall hold office during Her Majesty's pleasure:

WESTERN REGIONAL GOVERNMENT
SCHOLARSHIPS

The Western Regional Government will be awarding a further one hundred scholarships this year to applicants of Western Origin. They will be tenable at institutions in Nigeria commencing from the 1955-56 Session and will generally be tenable at colleges and institutions abroad commencing from the session 1956-57. Students already studying at institutions abroad however, may, depending upon the recommendations of the Scholarship Board, have their awards made tenable from an earlier date.

3. The six scholarships for survey courses are being offered only to members of the Survey Department of the Western Region, and separate instructions in regard to these awards will be circularised Departmentally. The instructions given below do not apply to these six awards.

4. Only persons of Western Origin will be eligible for awards.

5. Applications for scholarships may be made by candidates of either sex, preference normally being given to those candidates under thirty years of age.

6. The minimum qualification required from any applicant is Grade II Cambridge School Certificate with exemption from London Matriculation. Applicants holding only a Grade III Cambridge School Certificate or who have obtained exemption from London Matriculation on the basis of such a certificate will not be considered for an award.

7. Candidates wishing to proceed to University College, Ibadan, or to the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology, to undertake courses of study which are available there must apply direct to the College Authorities to sit for examinations in accordance with the procedure prescribed and will not be eligible for awards unless they have been accepted for entry by the College Authorities.

8. Applicants applying for courses of study at institutions outside Nigeria should ensure that their academic qualifications are sufficient to enable them to be placed in suitable institutions to undertake degree courses as soon as admitted as scholarships abroad will not be offered for studies up to General Certificate of Education (Advanced Level) or equivalent examinations.

9. All applications for scholarships must be completed in duplicate on the prescribed forms which may be obtained from:—

Prospective students are advised to communicate with the British Council Representative, 25 Ajasa Street, Lagos (Telephone, Lagos 21521) before leaving Nigeria in order that they may receive advice on the requirements and conditions of living in the United Kingdom, and make arrangements for their reception in the United Kingdom.

(i) a certificate from an authority approved by the Board stating that he has attended for the prescribed period of not less than 300 working hours an approved course of lectures and demonstrations, and

(ii) a certificate signed by a Medical Officer of Health to the effect that he has worked day by day for a period of not less than three years in the employment of an approved Public Health Authority and has obtained practical training in the duties of a Sanitary Inspector.

6. Candidates must be able to read and write English, spell correctly, make an outline sketch to scale and read ordinary building plans ; and must possess a knowledge of arithmetic.

7. The fee for the examination is five guineas. The amount of £1 1s towards the full admission fee should accompany the application form. The balance of the admission fee must be paid at least one week before the first day of the examination.
