Regulations made under the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 48)

PERMITS TO ENTER CUSTOMS AREAS AND TO BOARD SHIPS

This Notice supersedes Government Notice No. 789 of 1946 which is hereby cancelled.

Attention is invited to Parts XV and XIX of the Regulations made under the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 48) which govern the procedure to be observed by passengers and other persons embarking on or disembarking from ships and by persons wishing to enter a Customs area.

1. Permits to enter a Customs Area

(a) No animal or vehicle, other than an animal or vehicle intended to be loaded in a ship, and no person other than a person who can produce documentary evidence, if so required, that he is the owner, master, an officer or a member of the crew of a ship or a passenger who has a passage in a ship for its outward voyage shall enter a customs area except in accordance with and subject to any conditions contained in a permit issued by the proper officer in respect of the particular area.

(b) The proper officer for the issue of a permit to enter the Customs area specified in column I shall be the officer holding the post designated in column II below, or any person authorised by him to act on his

behalf:-

Customs Areas managed by the Nigerian Ports Authority

All other Customs Areas

The General Manager of the Nigerian Ports Authority or such officer of the Authority as he may depute

The Customs officer in charge of the port or place concerned

Except that a person holding a permit to board a ship (see paragraph 2 below) may enter the Customs Area in which the ship is berthed without obtaining a separate Customs Area pass.

(c) Permits may be :-

(i) permanent, authorising the person to whom it is issued to enter or take a particular animal or vehicle into a Customs Area or any specified part thereof at all times and subject to such restrictions and for such period (if any) as may be endorsed on the permit, or

(ii) temporary, authorising the person to whom it is issued to enter or take a particular animal or vehicle into a Customs Area or any specified part thereof on a specified day or days and during the hours (if

any) indicated in the permit.

If so required there shall be affixed to any permanent permit a photograph of the person to whom it is issued supplied by such person.

2. Permits to Board a Ship

(a) No person other than :-

(i) the owner, master, officers and crew of a ship;

(ii) the duly appointed agent of the owner or master and any person employed by the owner or master or his agent and proceeding on board with his authority;

(iii) any Government employee, official of the Nigerian Ports Authority, Consular Officer or member of Her Majesty's Armed Forces, wearing a uniform or in possession of an identity card, acting in the execution of his duty or

(iv) any passenger who has a passage in a ship for its outward voyage shall go on board any ship which arrives in Nigeria unless that person is in possession of a permit issued by or on behalf of the Customs Officer in charge of the port concerned.

(b) A permit to board a ship may be :-

(i) general, authorising the person to whom it is issued to go on board any ship or ships, or

(ii) temporary, authorising the person to whom it is issued to go on board any particular ship on such days and at such times and subject to such other conditions as may be specified in such permit.

No permission given as aforesaid shall have effect in any case where the master of the ship is unwilling or refuses to allow the person concerned to go on board the ship.

(c) Every person intending to go on board a ship shall proceed to such ship by the most direct route from one of the places appointed for the landing of baggage, unless the proper officer otherwise directs.

3. Persons Disembarking from Ships

(a) Every person disembarking from a ship shall proceed by the most direct route to the place appointed for the landing of baggage or such other place as the proper officer may direct and there disembark and proceed to the place appointed for the examination of baggage or such other place as the proper officer may direct and there remain until he receives permission to leave such place.

(b) Any person who brings any articles from a ship except such articles as he is expressly authorised so to bring by the customs laws renders himself liable to the penalties provided in the customs laws.

4. Conveyance to or from a Ship

No boat, other than a ship's boat or a boat owned by Government when used in the service of Government which is not licensed in accordance with the provisions of the Customs Regulations, 1945, may go or remain alongside or approach within fifty yards of any ship, except with the written permission of the Customs officer in charge of the port concerned and subject to such conditions and limitations as may be expressed therein.

5. The Law

(i) The following regulations from the Regulations made under the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 48) are quoted for information:—

Identification badges.

- (a) r. 171. In addition to or in lieu of documentary permits the officer responsible for the issue of such permits may issue or cause to be issued at the expense of an applicant permits which may be in the form of metal discs or other means of identification authorising the persons to whom they are issued to enter a customs area or any specified part thereof during the time for which they are issued.
- (b) r. 172. A person to whom a permit whether documentary or otherwise is issued shall when within the the customs area to which the permit relates always—

Carrying and production of permit or badge. (a) carry the permit on his person or

(b) wear the permit in such a way (if any) as he has been directed to wear it and shall produce the permit for examination and allow it to be examined at all times when required so to do by any officer.

Daily permits. (c) r. 173. A permit authorising the holder thereof to enter a customs area or specified part thereof during one day only shall be surrendered to the proper officer by the holder on his leaving the area unless such officer is satisfied that the holder must return to the said area during that same day in which case the officer aforesaid may give specific instructions that the permit need not at that stage be delivered up in which case it shall be delivered up to the proper officer on the holder thereof again leaving the said area or before noon on the following day if he does not return as anticipated.

Cancellation of permits.

(d) r. 174. Any permit may at any time be cancelled without reason assigned and any person to whom a permit is issued under this part shall surrender it on demand by the proper officer.

Loss of permit.

(e) r. 175. Where a person to whom a permit whether documentary or otherwise is issued loses it he must report the fact forthwith to the proper officer.

(ii) The following section from the Ports Ordinance No. 27/1954 is quoted for information:—

S. 119. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to derogate from the powers conferred upon any person under the customs laws as defined in the Customs Ordinance.

6. The Comptroller of Customs reserves the right to cancel at any time any issued permit to which this notice applies.
