Lagos Town Planning Ordinance (Chapter 103)

LAGOS CENTRAL PLANNING SCHEME, 1951
NOTICE OF AMENDMENT OF SCHEME

Notice is hereby given by the Lagos Executive Development Board in accordance with section 24A of the Lagos Town Planning Ordinance as amended by the Lagos Town Planning (Amendment) Ordinance, 1955, and the Lagos Town Planning (Amendment) Ordinance, 1956, that the Board intends to apply to the Governor-General in Council for approval of the Order of the Board set forth in the Schedule hereto amending the Lagos Central Planning Scheme, 1951 (see 1952 Annual Volume of the Laws, page B23).

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to meet the general demand made by new owners of plots in the cleared area of the Scheme for a height of building in excess of that presently prescribed under Clause 16 of the Scheme. It is now clear that there has been, since the framing of the Scheme in 1951, a big increase in land values not only in commercial zones but also, in fact, in the whole Scheme Area. It is therefore not economical to enforce the height restriction as at present prescribed in Clause 16 of the Scheme. The Order, if approved will permit increased heights of buildings as proposed in the table contained in the Schedule hereto, allow for economic development of the new plots, and consequently encourage rapid rebuilding in the Scheme Area.

(iii) In the case of a place of assembly the Board may permit either or both the limits imposed by this clause to be exceeded to such extent as they may think fit.

(iv) A building shall not exceed the height at the building line or be considered stepped back unless the angle and extent of such stepping back are considered by the Board upon approval to be adequate.

Industrial Development (Import Duties Relief)

Ordinance 1957

CLAIMS FOR REPAYMENT OF DUTIES PAID

General.—The method of applying for relief under the Industrial Development (Import Duties Relief) Ordinance, 1957 is explained in Government Notices 2051 and 2052 of 1957 published in *Official Gazette* No. 62 of 14th November, 1957. For the guidance of beneficiaries, the following paragraphs set out the requirements of the Comptroller of Customs and Excise as regards documentations, storage of goods and method of claiming repayments.

Importation and entry.—Materials for which relief has been authorised by the Governor-General must be entered on importation in the normal way, an extra copy of the entry prominently headed in red ink "For import duty relief purposes only", being submitted. Each copy of the entry must bear a declaration signed by the beneficiary that the goods may be used in accordance with the authority granted by the Governor-General and that import duty relief will be claimed.

Storage.—Materials on which relief will be claimed and products manufactured from these materials must be stored separately, pending use or disposal, from other goods.

Records.—Full records must be kept of the receipt and disposal of all materials on which relief will be claimed, and of the goods made therefrom.

No set form of records is laid down since it is desired to make as much use as possible of a beneficiary's own records, but recommendations for approval of claims will not be made until the records kept by the beneficiary have been inspected and approved by the proper officer.

Use of authorised materials.—Only:—

(a) materials imported by the beneficiary and used in the manner authorised or

(b) Unusable waste destroyed in the presence of the proper officer qualifies for relief.

There is no objection to the use for other purposes of imported materials upon which relief has been authorised provided:—

(a) prior notice of such alternative use is given to the proper officer.

(b) use and disposal is clearly shown in the beneficiary's records.

(c) claim for relief is not made in respect of the materials so used.

Officer's right of entry to beneficiary's premises.—The proper officer may at all reasonable times enter the beneficiary's premises and make such enquiries and examine such goods, processes, books and records as he considers necessary for the purpose of verifying claims for relief. He may also take such samples of materials or goods as he considers necessary for the proper verification of any claim.

The beneficiary and any person materially interested in the goods must answer truly all questions put to him by the proper officer and to produce all goods, books, records and other documents on demand. It should be noted that the responsibility for satisfying the officer that the terms of the Governor-General's authority have been carried out in full and that relief can therefore be recommended, rests with the beneficiary.

Method of claiming relief.—(a) *Form of claim and by whom to be made.* Claims for relief must be submitted in triplicate on the special forms which can be obtained from any Custom House or from the Comptroller, must be completed by the person, persons or body named in the Governor-General's authority.

(b) *When and where claims to be submitted.*—Claims for relief must not be made at intervals of less than three months. They must be submitted to the Comptroller, H.M. Customs and Excise, Lagos.

Penalties.—Beneficiaries are warned that heavy penalties are prescribed for any false declaration in relation to claims for relief.

Comptroller's right to vary requirements.—The Comptroller reserves the right to vary the general requirements of this notice to meet the special needs of individual cases.

1958 PALM KERNELS MARKETING SCHEME
MINIMUM PRODUCER PRICES**

It is notified for general information that the Western Region Marketing Board, by virtue of its powers under section 16 (a) of the Western Region Marketing Board Law (No. 10 of 1954), has fixed the prices set out in Column II of the Schedule subjoined as the minimum prices payable for palm kernels during 1958 at gazetted buying stations in the Western Region specified in Column I.

2. The minimum prices are based as in previous years on the naked ex-scale port of shipment price less the appropriate cost of transport by the approved normal routes.

3. The amount of the middlemen's allowance under the 1958 palm kernels marketing scheme is £1-4s-6d per ton, and, as in previous years, the middlemen's allowance has been taken into account in calculating the minimum prices payable for unbagged and ungraded palm kernels at "First Schedule" buying stations. At these stations a sum of £1-4s-6d will be paid for each ton of bagged, graded and sealed palm kernels in addition to the minimum prices payable for unbagged and ungraded palm kernels.

PRODUCE SALES TAX

4. Under the provisions of the Sale of Produce (Taxation) (Western Region) Order in Council, 1953, made under the Sale of Produce (Taxation) Ordinance, 1953, all sales of palm kernels made in the Western Region to licensed buying agents of the Western Region Marketing Board are subject to Produce Sales Tax at the rate of £1 per ton.

5. For purposes of collection of this tax for which under the Sale of Produce (Taxation) Ordinance, 1953, the Marketing Board is accountable to the appropriate regional authority in respect of all sales of palm kernels made to it or to its licensed buying agents in the Region, the arrangements as set out in paragraph 6 are prescribed.

6. The prices payable by the licensed buying agents of the Marketing Board for palm kernels in the Western Region will take into account the incidence of produce sales tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in Column III of the Schedule subjoined (being the minimum buying station prices fixed by the Marketing Board reduced by the amount of the produce sales tax).
