OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR ENTRY
INTO THE GENERAL EXECUTIVE CLASS OF THE
WESTERN REGION PUBLIC SERVICE, 1958

The Open Competitive Examination for a limited number of vacancies in the General Executive Class of the Western Region Public Service will be held on the 14th and 15th of November, 1958.

2. The examination will be open to candidates between the ages of 18 and 28 including both serving officers and persons outside the Government Service provided that they possess the following minimum qualifications:—

(a) The West African School Certificate with a credit in English Language or an equivalent qualification;

or

(b) The General Certificate of Education at Ordinary Level including English Language or the General Certificate of Education to which English Language has been added on a subsequent occasion or an equivalent qualification.

3. The examination will consist of two parts:—

(a) A written examination comprising:—

(i) An English paper.

(ii) An Arithmetic paper of a reasonably high standard.

(iii) A General paper.

The examination will be competitive and not a qualifying test. Candidates will be arranged in order of merit on the aggregate of their marks in the examination as a whole, but even if there are unfilled vacancies no candidate will be appointed who does not obtain an aggregate mark that satisfies the examiners.

(b) An interview for candidates who reach a satisfactory standard in (a) to be conducted by a Board under the Chairmanship of a Member of the Public Service Commission.

A copy of the syllabus and a set of examination papers can be obtained in pamphlet form (price 6d post free) from the Government Printer, Ibadan.

N.B.—The following amendments to the syllabus should be noted. These amendments will come into effect for the 1958 examination:—

English.—Reletter existing sections (a) to (f) as (b) to (g) add new section (a) Prose composition. Candidates will be required to attempt sections (a), (b) and (c) of the paper and to answer one other question which may include any of the exercises noted under sections (d) to (g). There will be a choice of questions. Questions involving exercises of all types noted under (d) to (g) will not necessarily be set in any one examination.

Arithmetic.—(a) The paper will be in one section only.

(b) Candidates will be required to answer eight questions out of TEN, with possibly two compulsory questions of a manipulative non-problematical type.

General.—The paper will consist of EIGHT or NINE questions including one or two which are compulsory. Candidates will be required to answer FOUR questions in all.

Note.—More weight is attached to questions on the interpretation of graphs and statistical data and on the summarising of official documents and correspondence than to questions on the other items of the syllabus.

4. Applications should be submitted on the prescribed form to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Ibadan. All applications from candidates resident in the Western Region must be accompanied by a Treasury Receipt for £1-10s-0d, the examination fee. Candidates not resident in the Western Region should forward crossed postal orders payable to the Western Region Government. The closing date for receiving applications is 31st August, 1958.

5. Candidates should ensure that they are qualified to sit for this examination under the terms of this notice. Examination fees will NOT be refunded under any circumstances.

6. The prescribed application form, W.R.P.S.C. 2 can be obtained from the Secretary, Public Service Commission, or from any Divisional Office in the Western Region.

7. The examination will be held at the following centres provided that there are sufficient candidates:

Abecokuta; Akure; Benin City; Ibadan; Ijebu-Ode; Ilesha; Warri; Lagos.

8. Successful candidates will enter the C (E) Training Grade on £270 per annum and all officers will be required to undergo a twelve-months' training course at Ibadan.

9. The salary scale, is as follows:—Executive Officer in Training Scale C (E) Training—£270-12-318 per annum.

(ii) Executive Officer Scale C (E) 1, 2—£390-18-444; £468-24-492; £540-24-588, £660, £714.

10. There are promotion prospects to the post of Higher Executive Officer and Senior Executive Officer and officers with exceptional ability may be considered for promotion to the Administrative Class.

11. The posts are permanent and pensionable. New entrants into the Government Service will be on probation for three years.
