ARBITRATION AWARD

By Messrs H. U. Kaine, A. Ogunsanya and N. A. Kuforiji in the Trades Dispute between the Nigerian Railway Corporation and the Railway and Ports Transport Staff Union.

To

The Honourable,
The Minister of Internal Affairs and Labour.

A trade dispute having arisen between the Nigerian Railway Corporation and the Railway and Ports Transport Staff Union, the Honourable the Minister of Internal Affairs and Labour in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 4 of the Trade Disputa (Arbitration and Inquiry) Ordinance, Chapter 219 of the Laws of Nigeria (as amended by Ordinance No. 46 of 1957 published in the Supplement to *Official Gazette* No. 62 of 1957) referred the matters in dispute to an arbitration tribunal and appointed Ademiran Ogunsanya and Nelson Adeyemi Kuforiji as Arbitrators and the Honourable Charles Dady Onyeama, a Judge of the High Court of Lagos to act as independent Chairman of the arbitration tribunal to examine the claims of the Railway and Ports Transport Staff Union.

A later instrument dated the 7th day of May, 1959 and published in the *Official Gazette* No. 30 of 1959 appointed Hyacinth Ugboma Kaine, Barrister-at-Law an independent Chairman in place of the Honourable Justice C. D. Onyeama.

The terms of reference were to examine the claims of the Railway and Ports Transport Staff Union concerning the following matters, that is to say :—

- (1) Where there are more than 150 Staff at a Station the man in charge should become a Station Superintendent I or Chief Station Master I at a salary of £1,150-1,600. The following Stations would qualify :—Lagos terminus, Ibadan, Zaria, Kano, Jos and Enugu.
- (2) Where there are 75-149 Staff, the Station should be graded £900-1,150. The following stations would qualify : Apapa Local, Minna, Kaduna Junction, Kafanchan, and designation should be Station Superintendent II or Chief Station Master II.
- (3) Where there are 21-74 Staff the Station should be graded on Scale £800-1,000 and the man in charge designated Station Superintendent III or Chief Station Master III. The following Stations would qualify :—Ebute Metta Junction, Offa, Jebba, Makurdi, Umuahia, Aba and Port Harcourt.
- (4) Where there are 10-20 Staff, the Station should be graded on Scale £550-750 and the man in charge designated Senior Station Master I. The following stations would qualify : Agege, Ifaw, Ijoko, Abokuta, Funtua, Aro, Oshogbo, Ilorin, Nguru, Gusau, Bukuru, Agbado.
- (5) That all staff who have 3-9 under them should be graded on Scale £410-550. This would embrace all 1st Class Stations, All Assistant Yard Supervisors. All Senior Goods clerks, etc.
- (6) Where there are 21-75 Staff, the man in charge should be Chief Telegraphist on Scale £800-1,000.
- (7) Where there are 10-20 men, the man in charge should be Assistant Chief Telegraphist on Scale £550-750.
- (8) Where there are 3-9 men, the man in charge should be Senior Telegraphist on Scale £410-550.
- (9) Upgrading of :—
 - (a) Chief Telegraphists at Offa, Jos, Kano and Port Harcourt to Senior Station Master, Grade III.
 - (b) Officer in charge of Wireless Offices at Zaria, Enugu, and Kafanchan to Senior Master Grade III.
- (10) Up-grading of all Station Masters, Grade II on the Mainline to Station Masters Grade I.
- (11) Transfer of Porters after 5 years' service into the permanent establishment and to be on Corporation Scale 30.
- (12) Night duty allowance should be paid to all Station Staff, Telegraphists, Wireless Operators, Senior Signal-men, Porters, Telephone Attendants, Level Crossing Keepers who work from 22.00 hours to 6.00 hours.
- (13) Placing of Station Staff, Telegraphists, Wireless Operators, Telephone Attendants, Level Crossing Keepers, Senior Signalmen, Tarpaulin Repairers and Porters at 59 hour week.
- (14) Operating and Commercial Department Telephone Operators at Kano, Zaria, Kaduna and Jos should be placed on Scale F1 and 2. (Railway Corporation Scale 28 Maximum £240).
- (15) Placing of all goods Porters on Daily Rate equivalent of Corporation Scale 30 (maximum £154).
- (16) To every 8 porters there should be one Head Porter.
- (17) That overtime should be paid to all Level Crossing Keepers at specified Stations.
- (18) Placing of certain Station Staff on sub-scale.
- (19) Placing of Station Staff on £180 per annum after passing out of the Traffic School.
- (20) Incremental Credit to be given to Station Staff as was given to the clerical Staff with effect from 1st July, 1957.
- (21) Adjustment of Salaries of Station Staff who entered the service before 1st October, 1958 from £190 to £220 per annum.
- (22) Demand for the removal of 4 (four) men from the Lagos Terminus.

The first meeting at which the matter of procedure was settled took place in the Committee Room of the House of Representatives on the 18th day of May, 1959 and it was agreed that the press and public be admitted to the sitting in accordance with section 13 of the Ordinance. Hearing opened on the same day and continued on 19-5-59, 20-5-59, 25-5-59, 27-5-59, 29-5-59, 1-6-59, 9-6-59, 15-6-59, 19-6-59, 20-6-59, 26-6-59, 27-6-59, 13-7-59 and 14-7-59.

On the 4th of July, 1959 the tribunal paid a visit to Lagos Terminus, Lilly pond Level Crossing at Apapa, Iganmu Railway Station, Chief Mechanical Engineers Telephone Office at Ebute-Metta Junction, Ebute-Metta Store Gate, Shogunle Halt and Ikorodu Railway Station. One hundred and fourteen documents were tendered in Evidence and twenty six witnesses called, 22 by the Union and 4 by the Management. The Arbitrators met in the Chambers of the Chairman on 15-7-59, 21-7-59, 22-7-59, 29-7-59, 31-7-59, 4-8-59, 10-8-59, 14-8-59, 24-8-59, 25-8-59, to discuss their findings.

The Nigerian Railway Corporation was represented at the Tribunal by Mr S. Davis the Chief Superintendent and the Railway and Ports Transport Staff Union by Mr H. F. Adebola the General Secretary of the Union.

1. This Order may be cited as the Lagos Central Planning Scheme, 1951 (Amendment No. 2) Order, 1959.

2. Clause 4 of the Lagos Central Planning Scheme, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as the Scheme) set out in the schedule to the Lagos Central Planning Scheme (Approval) Order in Council, 1952 is amended by the deletion of paragraph (f) and the following substituted therefor—

"(f) The offer of land within the replanned area to the original owners thereof, as far as it is possible to do so, at the gross cost of acquisition and development in accordance with section 56 (4) of the Ordinance and subject to the conditions, terms and requirements set out in the Fourth Schedule to the Scheme".

3. The Scheme is amended by the insertion immediately after the Third Schedule of the following new schedule—

"FOURTH SCHEDULE (Clause 4 (f))

CONDITIONS OF SALE, CONVEYANCING ARRANGEMENT AND BUILDING COVENANTS

1. When upon the acceptance of an offer of allocation of plot part of the purchase price is paid by way of deposit and nothing further is done by the intending purchaser towards the completion of the sale, such deposit shall be refunded to the depositor whereupon the contract of sale shall determine provided a notice has been served on the depositor requesting him to complete the contract within thirty days from the date of such notice and the contract has not been so completed.

2. (i) In all cases of multiple ownerships where compensation is paid by the Board to any person acting under a Power of Attorney from those owners, the Board shall have the right to deal with such person in all matters of allocation and sale of plots to those owners as if the Power of Attorney contains stipulation and authority enabling such person to purchase allocated plots for and on behalf of the owners.

(ii) Persons to whom compensation shall be paid under the Scheme are those who, in the appropriate cases of multiple ownerships, are beneficiaries known to the Board after reasonable and diligent investigations.

(iii) In all cases of multiple ownerships, if the persons so entitled do not within nine months accept an offer of allocation of plot made to them or where they accept such offer of allocation but they cannot all be got together to execute a conveyance if and when such execution is deemed necessary such

offer of allocation shall lapse and the Board thereafter may offer the plot to the person or persons next on its waiting list.

3. Allocation of plots by virtue of clause 4 (f) of the Scheme shall, unless otherwise agreed, be subject to the following conditions and stipulations:—

(a) Any person or persons to whom a plot is allocated shall

(i) within eighteen months from the date of the conveyance to him commence and complete building on the said plot to the approval of the Board, and

(ii) observe and perform such conditions, restrictions, stipulations and other requirements and regulations imposed by the Board.

(b) The foregoing provisions shall be binding upon those claiming through and under such person or persons aforesaid."

**RULES GOVERNING THE AWARD OF SCHOLARSHIPS MADE BY THE
FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND TENABLE IN NIGERIA OR ANYWHERE OUTSIDE NIGERIA**

(In this context "Scholarships" include Awards made under the Federal Government Scholarships Scheme, Training Courses and Study Leave)

Every Person awarded a "SCHOLARSHIP" by the Federal Government which is tenable in Nigeria or outside Nigeria is required to comply with the following rules:—

(a) To accept a third class, or failing that, a cabin class sea passage to the United Kingdom or elsewhere overseas; or failing that an air passage;

(b) To proceed to the institution as directed by the awarding authority and to begin the course of studies for which the award was made and to continue with such studies for as long as the awarding authority shall prescribe unless he is prevented from so doing by sickness proved by a certificate from a recognised Medical Practitioner or by circumstances beyond his control recognised as such.

(c) To reside in an approved college, hostel or lodgings;

(d) To devote his time to following the courses of instruction for which the scholarship is awarded unless permission to undertake other work or studies or to modify his course in content or duration is granted by the awarding authority;

(e) Not to engage in any occupation or activity which is considered detrimental to his progress in the course of studies prescribed for him and detrimental to his health;

(f) To satisfy the awarding authority as to attendance, conduct and progress by reports from the head of the institution, or his representative, at which he is studying;

(g) At all times to conduct himself as an honest and faithful student and to the best of his power and ability to observe, obey and perform such instructions and directions as shall be given from time to time;

(h) To submit himself for medical examination as directed by the awarding authority; it being understood that the scholarship may be suspended or terminated if the report from such medical examination indicates that he is unfit to complete his studies owing to ill-health. The scholarship may be suspended or terminated if he absents himself from studies for more than six months owing to ill-health.

(i) To sit for and pass any prescribed examinations or approved group of examinations within the time fixed by the authorities of the institution at which he is attending or by the awarding authority unless he is prevented from so doing by sickness proved by a certificate from a recognised Medical Practitioner or by circumstances beyond his control recognised as such by the awarding authority;

(j) Not to marry during the tenure of his scholarship without the permission of the awarding authority;

(k) Whether or not permission to marry is granted, to complete the course without interruption in a satisfactory manner and to fulfil all the conditions under which the scholarship was awarded.

2. The scholarship may be suspended or terminated if the person awarded a scholarship fails to comply with any of the foregoing rules. Where a scholarship is tenable outside Nigeria, the cost of a return passage (which is payable by Government if under normal circumstances a scholarship is concluded) will also be met if the scholarship is terminated; but if the student declines to travel at the earliest opportunity without reasonable excuse he will lose his right to a free passage and the payment of any allowances which he may be receiving will cease forthwith.

3. All scholars who are pursuing their studies outside Nigeria will during the period of such scholarship be under the charge, control and direction of the accredited representative of the Federal Government of Nigeria, where such a representative has been appointed or under any other person duly authorised by the Federal Government for that purpose.

4. Whenever direction, intention, approval or consent is indicated or required by any of the foregoing rules the same may be given or signified by any officer of the Federal Ministry of Education authorised to do so by the Permanent Secretary.

5. All Federal Government Scholars will be required to sign the following declaration in the presence of a Magistrate, Justice of the Peace or an Officer of the Federal Ministry of Education authorised to do so by the Permanent Secretary.
