For all other candidates the course shall last for not less than four years.

To complete the course satisfactorily students must—

(a) satisfy the Inspectorate of the Federal Ministry of Education (in consultation with the Principal) during the last year of the course in Practical Tests in—

Class teaching (including Spoken English and the teaching of Physical Education). Account will be taken of the records of the candidate's progress during the training.

(b) pass an examination set by the West African Examinations Council in the last year of the course in—

(1) Principles and Practice of Education.

(2) English Language.

(3) Arithmetic.

(c) pass an examination set as prescribed by the Federal Ministry of Education, in Physical and Health Education.

(d) pass an examination set during the penultimate year or the last year of the course by the Principal of the Training Institution in consultation with the Inspectorate of the Federal Ministry of Education in FOUR of the following subjects, provided that one subject taken at a more advanced level, which shall be known as "Special" level, shall be equal to two at "Normal" level.

B.—EXTERNAL CANDIDATES**1. Conditions of Entry for an External Candidate.**

An external candidate is not eligible for the award of the Teachers' Higher Elementary (Grade II) Certificate until he has completed, as a scholar or teacher, a qualifying period of years which shall exceed by one year the minimum aggregate of years spent in schooling and training and teaching by a candidate who passes the internal examination, by the slowest normal route.

2. Conditions of Award

Stage I.—The candidate shall first attempt the papers in English Language and Arithmetic as set by West African Examinations Council and may not proceed to attempt the remaining subjects of the examination until successful in these two papers.

Stage II.—The candidate must then pass an examination in FOUR subjects under conditions described in regulations (c) and (d) for internal candidates except that a part of the regulation, *viz.*, "set during the penultimate year or the last year of the course" shall not apply.

The candidate may not proceed to Stage III until Stage II has been successfully completed.

Stage III.—The candidate must—

(a) pass the paper in Principles and Practice of Education as set for internal candidates.

(b) satisfy the Inspectorate of the Federal Ministry of Education in practical tests in Class Teaching (including Spoken English and the teaching of Physical Education).

(c) be attached to a training college for the period of the final teaching practice culminating in the Practical Teaching test.

Note.—A candidate who has secured approval from the Federal Ministry of Education to offer a Practical subject in Stage II will have his work inspected during the period of his attachment to a college.
