(b) Members of the newly created Typists' grade will also be eligible to sit the examination after they have completed three years' established service as Typists and provided they possess the requisite minimum educational qualification of Primary School Leaving Certificate or its equivalent.

(c) No age limit is fixed for the examination.

3. The examination will consist of three straight-forward written tests (similar in standard to that required of candidates for entry to a secondary school) comprising:

- (i) An English paper;
- (ii) An Arithmetic paper;
- (iii) A General Knowledge paper.

The Arithmetic and General Knowledge papers will be half-hour papers, and the English paper will be a one-hour paper.

4. Applications to sit the examination should be submitted on the prescribed form No. W.R.P.S.C. 20 and sent through the Head of the applicants' Department to the Director of Recruitment and Training, the Treasury, Ibadan, accompanied by a Treasury Receipt for £1 examination fee (Money or Postal Orders will not be acceptable). The closing date for entry is Wednesday, the 28th of September, 1960. No applications will be accepted after that date.

5. Fees are not refundable under any circumstance.

6. The prescribed application forms are obtainable from the Director of Recruitment and Training, Ibadan, the Chief Information Officer, Ministry of Information, Ibadan or from any Divisional Adviser's office.

7. The examination will be held at the following centres provided there are sufficient candidates:—

Abeokuta, Akure, Benin City, Ibadan, Ijebu-Ode, Ikeja and Warri.

8. The cost of transport to and from the place of examination will be paid by the Regional Government as provided under General Order 17314.

9. Successful candidates will be eligible for promotion to the Clerical Assistant Grade on salary Scale F 1, 2, 3, (£132-£319). There are consequent prospects of promotion to the standard clerical grade on salary Scale D 1, 2, 3 (£174-£432). Officers with exceptional ability may be considered for promotion to higher posts.

NOTICE BY THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

1. *Subject.*—Imports and exports from the Southern Cameroons through Nigeria and trade between Nigeria and the Southern Cameroons on and after 1st October, 1960.

2. *Note.*—This Notice is ancillary to Government Notices Nos. 696, 699, 702, 703, 704, relating to transit, goods in warehouse, entry for home consumption, entry for exportation and drawback respectively.

3. *Purpose.*—This Notice contains Customs requirements consequent upon the Independence of Nigeria on 1st October, 1960.

4. *Duty Charge.*—As from 1st October, 1960, the Southern Cameroons will be treated for Customs purposes as a foreign country and duties of import and export will be levied on goods imported into Nigeria from the Southern Cameroons and exported from Nigeria into the Southern Cameroons in accordance with the tariff of duties in force. Likewise goods imported into the Southern Cameroons from Nigeria and goods exported from the Southern Cameroons into and through Nigeria will be charged with Southern Cameroons duties.

5. *Collection of Southern Cameroons Duties.*—Southern Cameroons duties will be collected at certain Nigerian Ports and frontier posts as provided below.

6. *Frontier Posts.*—The Southern Cameroons East of the Eastern Region of Nigeria will be considered to be outside Nigeria. For Customs control of traffic and goods, Customs stations will be set up at Mfum, near the Cross River on the Ikom-Mamfe Road and at Ekang on the Mamfe-Calabar Road and later at Ikang. These Customs Frontier Stations will be administered for the joint control of goods and collection of duties on behalf of the Federal Government of Nigeria and the Southern Cameroons Government.

7. *Payment of Duties.*—Duties of Import and Export, both Nigerian and Southern Cameroonian must be paid at the frontier stations of Mfum and Ekang except as stated below.

8. *Goods in transit through Nigeria consigned to the Southern Cameroons.*—(a) Transit facilities without payment of duty will not be permitted. Southern Cameroons duty will be collected at the Port of Entry in Nigeria. After payment of Southern Cameroons duty, Nigerian duty will not be charged and delivery of the goods will be permitted to enable them to be transported over the approved route.

(b) *Approved Routes and Ports.*—The routes approved for the movement of these goods by land and inland waterways between Nigeria and the Southern Cameroons are the Mamfe-Ikom Road, the Mamfe-Calabar Road and the Cross River. The Ports of Entry will be Port Harcourt and Calabar unless importation at another port is specifically approved by the Board in any particular occasion.

(c) *Customs Entries.*—For importation at the approved ports, entries over-printed or over-stamped "SOUTHERN CAMEROONS" must be presented. Three additional copies of the entry are required. Machine receipted copies will not be made available as receipts for the duty paid, but a Bill of Entry Receipt on Bk. C. 1002 (old form 1A) will be issued which will be clearly over-written in green ink "SOUTHERN CAMEROONS". The three additional copies of the entry will be returned to the trader under official cover addressed to the Customs Officer at the frontier station for production to him there with the goods.

(d) *Examination of Goods.*—Importers are informed that all goods will be examined and certificates of examination given by the Customs Officer at the port of importation. The goods will also be liable to check examination at the frontier station. The above procedure will apply equally to goods cleared ex-ship and to goods cleared ex-warehouse. Goods cleared ex-warehouse must be duty paid in Nigeria on an ex-warehouse (Southern Cameroons) home consumption entry.

(e) *Delivery of Part Consignments.*—Where the entered quantity is not removed at one time for presentation at the frontier station, each load is to be accompanied by two copies of relevant way-bills supplied by the transporter. Each way-bill is to be endorsed with particulars of the Entry to which it refers. Entries and way-bills must be delivered to the Customs Officer at the frontier station.

(f) *Time Limit.*—In respect of goods entered on Southern Cameroons entries, production of the goods and accompanying documents at the frontier station must be made within three months of the date of entry.

9. *Other Goods on which Nigerian Duty has been paid.*—Except for goods in transit mentioned above on which duty has been paid in Nigeria on Southern Cameroons entries, Southern Cameroons duty will be payable on importation into the Southern Cameroons.

10. *Bonded goods ex-warehouse in Nigeria consigned to the Southern Cameroons.*—The procedure outlined in paragraph 8 will be followed, duty being paid at place of warehousing on home consumption entries overprinted "SOUTHERN CAMEROONS". Three additional copies will be requested but no ex-warehouse entry for exportation will be wanted.

11. *Goods chargeable with Nigerian Excise Duty exported overland to the Southern Cameroons.*—An additional copy of the export entry must be presented at the frontier station. This copy will be appropriately endorsed by the Customs Officer at the frontier station and returned to the exporter to enable a claim for rebate of Excise Duty to be presented by the Licensee of the factory. Southern Cameroons duty will be payable upon entry into the Southern Cameroons.

12. *Drawback Goods*.—Goods for which a drawback claim of Nigerian Import duty is to be made must be produced at the Frontier Station for certification of exportation from Nigeria. Attention is particularly drawn to the Drawback Regulations and the relevant Government Notice relating to Drawback. *Southern Cameroons Import Duty* will be payable to the Customs Officer at the Station. One additional copy of Form C. 57 is required for drawback claims of *Southern Cameroons* Import duty paid on goods exported through Nigeria.

13. *Produce of Nigerian Origin for shipment at Calabar*.—It is expected that produce of Nigerian (Eastern Region) origin will pass along the Ikom-Calabar Road, leaving Nigeria at Mfum and re-entering at Ekang frontier posts. Transporters must produce way-bills in duplicate to the Customs Officer at Mfum who, if satisfied, will authorise transit of the vehicle and the goods through Southern Cameroonian territory. The Officer will give appropriate certificates on the way-bills, and return one copy to the transporter who must produce it to the Customs Officer at Ekang on re-entry into Nigeria.

14. *Vehicles*.—Subject to the satisfaction of the Officer in charge, vehicles registered in Nigeria or in the Southern Cameroons will be allowed to pass through Frontier Stations in either direction without formality. Carnets or triptiques for foreign registered vehicles must be produced.

15. *Exports from the Southern Cameroons through Nigeria*.—The approved routes of entry through Nigeria are the Mamfe-Calabar and the Mamfe Ikom Roads for land traffic and the Cross River for inland waterways traffic. Goods must be produced at the frontier stations at Mfum or Ekang.

(a) *Produce not liable to Nigerian Import Duty*.—Southern Cameroons produce will in the main be destined for shipment at Calabar. A way-bill must be produced with the goods to the officer in charge at the frontier station at Ekang. Provided the officer in charge is satisfied that the produce will not remain in Nigeria, *Southern Cameroons export duty* will not be collected at Ekang. Way-bills will be certified at Ekang and despatched to the Collector at Calabar. Export entries will be passed in the normal way and export duty paid on *Southern Cameroons* Export Entries at Calabar.

(b) *Hides, timber and other goods liable to Nigerian Import Duty passing through Ekang other than for subsequent export from Calabar* will be liable to Nigerian import duty.

16. *Exports from the Southern Cameroons into Nigeria by land*.—The approved routes are given above. Southern Cameroons export duty and Nigerian import duty are payable at the frontier stations.

Provision for produce entering other than at Mfum and Ekang.—Where however produce from the Southern Cameroons enters Nigeria by a route other than an approved land frontier post, it may be exported from Nigeria as produce of Southern Cameroons origin provided a certificate of origin is produced to the satisfaction of the proper officer.

17. *Air Traffic*.—Goods passing between the Southern Cameroons and Nigeria are subject to Customs control at the airports of Tiko and Calabar. Southern Cameroons duties are payable at Tiko Airport. Nigerian duties are payable at Calabar Airport. Importers of goods into the Southern Cameroons are reminded that duty is chargeable on goods brought in from Nigeria and that invoices are required when entries are passed. Customs reserve the right to examine passengers baggage.

18. *Post Parcels*.—Dutiable goods imported by post into the Southern Cameroons from Nigeria and into Nigeria from the Southern Cameroons are chargeable with Southern Cameroonian and Nigerian duties respectively.

19. *Licensing*.—Import and export licences granted by the Federal Department of Commerce and Industries continue to be valid in the Southern Cameroons after 30th September, 1960. No import and export licences are required for trade between Nigeria and the Southern Cameroons.

WESTERN REGION MARKETING BOARD

1960-61 COCOA MARKETING SCHEME—MINIMUM BUYING STATION PRICES

It is notified for general information that the Western Region Marketing Board, by virtue of its powers under Section 16 (a) of the Western Region Marketing Board Law, 1954 (No. 10 of 1954), has fixed the prices set out in columns II and III of the schedule subjoined as the minimum prices payable for cocoa during the 1960-61 season at gazetted buying stations in the Western Region specified in column I.

2. The minimum buying station prices are based on the naked *ex-scale* port of shipment prices fixed by the Board for the 1960-61 season less the transport differentials by the approval evacuation routes.

PRODUCE SALES TAX

3. Under the provisions of the Western Region Produce Sales Tax Law, 1957 (No. 14 of 1957) all sales of cocoa made in the Western Region to the licensed buying agents of the Western Region Marketing Board are subject to produce sales tax at the rate of £4 per ton.

4. For purposes of collection of this tax, for which under the Western Region Produce Sales Tax Law, 1957 the Marketing Board is accountable to the appropriate regional authority in respect of all sales of cocoa made to it or to its licensed buying agents in the Region the arrangements as set out in paragraph 5 are prescribed.

5. The prices payable by the licensed agents of the Marketing Board for cocoa in the Western Region will take into account the incidence of produce sales tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in columns IV and V of the schedule subjoined (being the minimum buying station prices fixed by the Marketing Board reduced by the amount of produce sales tax).
