

APPOINTMENT OF ACTING CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE FEDERATION

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Doctor NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria.

Whereas by subsection (2) of section 104 of the Constitution of the Federation it is provided that the Judges of the Federal Supreme Court shall be the Chief Justice of the Federation and, inter alia, such number of Federal Justices (not being less than three) as may be prescribed by Parliament:

And whereas by subsection (4) of section 105 of the Constitution of the Federation it is provided that if the person holding the office of Chief Justice of the Federation is for any reason unable to perform the functions of the office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other Judges of the Federal Supreme Court as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Governor-General acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister:

AND WHEREAS the Chief Justice of the Federation is about to depart and be absent from Nigeria and it is expedient and necessary that the functions of office of the Chief Justice of the Federation be performed by one of the other Judges of the Federal Supreme Court as may be designated as aforesaid:

Now THEREFORE, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, do hereby, in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister, appoint LIONEL BRETT to act during my pleasure as Chief Justice of the Federation as from the 5th day of June, 1961, and until further notice.
