(b) Diploma in Public Administration.

- (c) The Final Examination of the Chartered Institute of Secretaries.
- (d) The Final Examination of the Corporation of Secretaries.

Applications will also be considered from candidates who do not hold these qualifications but who have had considerable experience in the Public Service. Candidates must not be less than 22 nor more than 40 years of age.

For consulates in Arabic speaking countries (particularly the Sudan) a corps of Arabic Speakers would be needed.
- 4. Other conditions of service.—While serving overseas an officer will receive the following allowances which are non-pensionable:—
 - (1) A Clothing Allowance on three occasions during his career. The rate of this allowance is £180 for a married officer and £120 for a single officer.
 - (2) A Disturbance and Resettlement Allowance on posting from Nigeria to an overseas post, on transfer from one overseas post to another and on final return to Nigeria. The rate of this allowance is 10 per cent of basic salary up to a limit of £150 for married officers, and 5 per cent of basic salary up to a limit of £100 for single officers.
 - (3) An Overseas Allowance. This allowance is paid to officers to compensate them for the local cost of living and for expenditure which they must of necessity incur as representatives of Nigeria serving overseas. The rates of the allowance vary according to an officer's rank and the overseas post in which he is serving.
- 4. Rent Supplement.—If an officer is not occupying accommodation owned or leased by Government, he is granted a Rent Supplement to assist him to rent suitable accommodation.
