THE O. & M. UNIT : ITS SERVICES

I am directed to inform you that the O. & M. Unit of the Ministry of Establishments and Service Matters provides a management service which is available on request to all Ministries and Extra-Ministerial Departments of the Federal Government. The assignment officers in the Unit have specialised in one or more of the following aspects of management :

- (i) Analysis of methods and procedures ;
- (ii) Organisation analysis ;
- (iii) Form design and control ;
- (iv) Records management ;
- (v) Stores and inventory systems ;
- (vi) General mechanisation of office work ;
- (vii) Office layout and accommodation ;
- (ix) Work measurement.

2. The basic concern of the O. & M. Unit is to analyse and solve problems of organisation at all levels. The Unit aims at raising efficiency in the office to the highest pitch by reducing wastes in manpower, material resources and time. To this end, assignments are arranged to ensure systematic observation of particular problems at first hand.

3. Every assignment is mainly undertaken to assist those concerned with administration and management who, because of their burdens,

- (a) are unable to keep their administrative machinery under review ;
- (b) are in no position to conduct detailed examinations of specific problems and
- (c) require a more specialist study of a given problem than their own resources permit.

4. As soon as difficulties in organisation, management or procedures arise or become evident in a Ministry or Extra-Ministerial Department, assignment officers in the O. & M. Unit may be requested to look into them by writing to :

The Senior Assistant Secretary,
Organisation and Methods Unit,
Ministry of Establishments,
Tafawa Balewa Square,
Lagos.

The reports of studies of the problems in a Department/Ministry are regarded as confidential. However, problems and solutions which may be of general interest may be disseminated in general terms. This principle reduces the calls on the capacity of the O. & M. Unit whilst the benefits of an assignment (say improvements in methods and procedures) are placed at the disposal of other branches of the Public Service.

5. *Recommendations and their Implementations.*—An assignment officer on being invited to examine a problem will be given clear terms of reference to guide him in his investigations. His work is only partially completed when he has put forward concrete recommendations in the light of his findings and, in any case, the whole exercise is useless if the recommendations are not implemented. As a rule, he must discuss and agree his recommendations with a customer (who has invited him) before embodying them in a report. In the event of a major disagreement, the hon. Minister of Establishments will invoke his authority to issue final executive directions in the matter, if he is satisfied that the improvements or reorganisation recommended by the assignment officer are in the best interests of the Public Service. However, the services of the O. & M. Unit will mainly be advisory in the first instance and only mandatory as a last resort. As regards the implementation of suggested recommendations, assignment officers will be available to assist Ministries and Extra-Ministerial Departments.

6. *Follow up.*—After three to six months of submitting a report, the O. & M. Unit will arrange a "follow up" to ascertain

- (i) the extent to which a report has been implemented ;
- (ii) whether or not unexpected difficulties have arisen and
- (iii) the degree of its success or failure.

7. *Staff Investigation.*—At present, the Staff Investigation Branch is a part of the O. & M. Unit. Staff Investigators assist in scrutinizing the various establishments in the Federal Service by means of physical, on-the-spot investigations to assess the work-load of specific schedules and to determine the number and grading of the necessary staff. The long-term objective is a standardisation of work-loads and gradings for similar work performed throughout the service. Although the primary object of staff investigation is to discover an efficient, economic and equitable establishment in the Public Service, those concerned with this work are not "staff snatchers". Like other O. & M. staff, they are friends whose first consideration is to help administrators, management and other clients in the Federal Service.

8. *O. & M. sub-units.*—An additional responsibility of the O. & M. Unit is the establishment of sub-units in the Ministries and Extra-Ministerial Departments in due course. Like the parent Unit, the sub-units will aim at

- (i) improving methods and procedures and
- (ii) keep methods and procedures under constant review so as to achieve efficiency and economy in the use of manpower and equipment.

The establishment of sub-units in Departments/Ministries will be the subject of separate circular letter.

9. *Informal Advisory Service.*—The O. & M. Unit will always welcome and consider requests for advice which do not involve enough work to be classified as formal assignments or surveys. Such minor assignments, which may be cleared within a few hours or days include such problems as :

- (a) finding out alternative ways of doing a job ;
- (b) the preparation of an administrative manual ;
- (c) designing a particular form or group of related forms ;
- (d) laying out an office to the best advantage ;
- (e) deciding on what kind of office machinery is best suited to a particular operation and
- (f) weeding out obsolete files in a registry.

Requests for informal advice may be made in writing or by telephone to the head of the O. & M. Unit. There were 17 such informal studies in 1960 and over 50 had been completed by November 1961.

10. *Office Machinery and Equipment Service.*—A specialist section within the O. & M. Unit is available to give information and advice on office machinery and equipment and their proper application. The general policy on this matter was set out in Circular Letter No. OM. 15/S. 1/100 of 24th April, 1961. The Unit is in continual contact with manufacturers and agents so that it is always abreast of new developments. Further, demonstrations, tests and analytical studies are carried out and recorded for future reference.

11. Finally, the hon. Minister of Establishments hopes that Departments/Ministries will avail themselves of the specialist services of the O. & M. Unit. Any inquiries on the work of the Unit or requests for assistance should be cleared as suggested in paragraph 4 of this circular letter.

TRAINING OF NIGERIANS AS COMMERCIAL PILOTS

The Federal Government invites applications from suitably qualified young men to train as commercial pilots and to take their place in Nigeria's developing civil aviation. To be eligible for training under this scheme, candidates must be aged between 17 and 25 years, and hold the West African School Certificate (or equivalent), with credits in English Language and Mathematics; candidates with higher educational qualifications will receive preference. A high standard of physical fitness is essential.

2. An initial training course of about six months' duration will be held at the Flying School near Lagos, during which successful candidates will be paid a salary or allowances of £28 per month and provided with uniform and flying clothing. They will however, have to make their own arrangements for board and lodging.

3. On completion of the initial training course, successful candidates may qualify for the Private Pilot's Licence, and the more outstanding pupils will be eligible for selection for further training in the United Kingdom, the successful completion of which would make them eligible for the Commercial Pilot's Licence. During this advanced training the Federal Government's Scholarship rates will be paid, together with all the usual allowances.

4. Successful candidates returning to Nigeria with Commercial Licences may be offered appointment with Nigeria Airways, but there may also be opportunities for employment in the Northern Region Communications Flight, and with Nigerian non-scheduled operators. Holders of Commercial Licences appointed to Nigeria Airways would begin their careers as Second Officers, and with experience,

would be required to gain higher qualifications, making them eligible for promotion, ultimately to the responsibility of having their own command. Somewhat similar arrangements would apply to those taking up other air crew appointments.

5. Candidates holding the requisite educational qualifications should apply immediately by letter, addressed to the Secretary, Scholarship Board, Federal Ministry of Education, Lagos, giving the following personal information only:—
