(b) Every employer who is required by the Regulations mentioned above to deduct INCOME RATE from the wages, salary or other emoluments due to any of his employees in respect of the year ending 31st March, 1964, shall deduct the appropriate amount from the wages, salary or other emoluments of every such employee for the month of July 1963, and shall issue an original official INCOME RATE receipt to each such employee for the exact amount so deducted.

(c) Where an employee is engaged after July 1963, and is therefore not entitled to any wages, salary or other emoluments for that month, the employer shall make the appropriate deduction from the wages, salary or other emoluments due to the employee for the first available month after July 1963, and shall, in like manner as in the case of all normal July deductions, issue an original official INCOME RATE receipt to such employee for the amount of the deduction. If for any other reason an employer had omitted to deduct INCOME RATE from an employee's wages, salary or other emoluments for the month of July 1963, the employer shall make the appropriate deduction from the wages, salary or other emoluments for the very next available month after such an omission is detected.

4. *Individuals other than employed person.*—Every other individual, besides an employed person, with any income whatsoever in his or her own right shall obtain the appropriate 1963-64 INCOME RATE receipt in respect of his own income from whichever of the two Inland Revenue Offices shown in paragraph 2 above is more convenient to him, at the time and date shown.

COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION INFORMATION CIRCULAR

CONDITIONS FOR QUALIFYING CERTIFICATES

1. By the combined effect of section 3 of the Legal Practitioners Act, 1962, and sections 3 and 4 of the Legal Education Act 1962, before anyone can be enrolled as a Legal Practitioner he must, unless exempted under the Legal Practitioners Qualification Regulations 1962/3 (L.N. 188 of 1962 as amended by L.N. 48 of 1963) which are summarised in paragraph 5 below, obtain a qualifying certificate from the Council after fulfilling the conditions specified in section 3 of the Legal Education Act. To fulfil these conditions he must have undergone an approved course of study at an approved institution and obtained an approved qualification and thereafter successfully completed a course of practical training lasting not less than one year and conducted under arrangements made by the Council.

2. It is notified for information that in exercise of the Council's powers under section 4 of the Legal Education Act to approve courses, institutions, and qualifications the Council will, until further notice, regard the following as fulfilment of these conditions:

(a) Passing the final examination qualifying for call or admission as a barrister, advocate or solicitor in any part of Great Britain or Ireland followed by the satisfactory completion of a year's course of practical training at the Nigerian Law School; or

(b) Passing the final examination qualifying for the award of a law degree of any University in Nigeria or in Great Britain, or of the Queen's University of Belfast or Trinity College, Dublin, followed by the satisfactory completion of a year's course of practical training at the Nigerian Law School.

3. For the purposes of paragraph 2 (b) above, the expression "law degree" bears the meaning assigned to it in the Legal Practitioners Qualification Regulations 1962/3 and the LL.B., LL.M., B.C.L. or B.A. degree of any of the Universities concerned awarded as a result of a course in law lasting three or more years will be regarded as a law degree granted by an approved university in consequence of an approved course of legal studies. In the case of courses leading to a B.A. or the like in which legal subjects form part only of the course leading to the degree (for example where a Cambridge student has taken law in one part only of the Tripos) the Council will consider each case on its merits.

4. In other cases, for example where an applicant for enrolment has obtained a law degree of a University other than those mentioned or been admitted as a legal practitioner in another part of the World, individual application should be made to the Council which will consider each case on its merits. In no case will a qualifying certificate be granted prior to the satisfactory completion of a course of training at the Nigerian Law School, but applicants can, and should, apply for a decision on whether, subject to such completion, their course of study and qualifications will be approved. Applications should be made in writing giving full details of the previous course of study, examination results, and professional qualifications.

EXEMPTIONS

5. For the exact terms of the transitional exemptions and concessions, reference should be made to the Regulations referred to in paragraph 1 of this Circular. Briefly summarised they provide as follows:

(a) A Nigerian citizen who, before 31st August, 1962, had become entitled to practise as a barrister, advocate or solicitor in any part of Great Britain or Ireland is totally exempt and can apply for enrolment without obtaining a qualifying or other Certificate from the Council.

(b) So can one who, prior to 31st August, 1962, had passed a final examination qualifying him for call or admission as such a barrister, advocate or solicitor or who, prior to that date, had a conditional pass in the Bar examination and who fulfilled the conditions prior to 1st October, 1962.

(c) One who, before 1st November, 1962, had obtained an approved law degree and embarked on a course of study for an approved post-graduate law degree and who obtains the post-graduate law degree before 1st September, 1965 is also totally exempt from a course of training at the Nigerian Law School, but must (i) satisfy the Council that these conditions are fulfilled and obtain a certificate from the Council to that effect, and (ii) apply for enrolment prior to 1st January, 1966.

(d) One who passed a final examination qualifying for call or admission as a barrister, advocate or solicitor in any part of Great Britain or Ireland after 31st August, 1962 but before 31st August, 1963 is entitled to take a 3-months' course at the Nigerian Law School, instead of the full year's course, but must successfully complete the course prior to 31st December, 1965, and obtain a certificate from the Council to that effect.

(e) One entering the public service of the Federation or a Region may be permitted to fulfil the requirements of practical training by successfully completing a 3-months' course at the Nigerian Law School and working for a period of not less than nine months in the public service on duties of a type usually performed by persons whose names are on the roll. He must, however, (i) obtain from the Council and from the appropriate Attorney-General certificates to the effect that these conditions have been fulfilled, and (ii) apply for enrolment before 1st January, 1966.

(f) One who, prior to 31st August, 1963, has passed the Final examination qualifying for the award of a law degree after an approved course of legal studies as an INTERNAL student at an approved University in Great Britain or Ireland may take the 3-months' course at the Nigerian Law School instead of the full year's course. BUT HE MUST SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE THE COURSE BEFORE THE END OF 1963 and apply for enrolment prior to 1st January, 1966.

Particular attention is drawn to this new concession introduced by the amending Regulations of 1963. Its object is to prevent hardship to University students in the U.K. and especially to those who are sitting for their Final examinations in June 1963 and who, in consequence, may be unable to take the Bar examinations in May 1963 so as to bring themselves within the exemption referred to in paragraph (d) above. To take advantage of this concession students must register for, and successfully complete, the 3-months' course, October-December 1963, and must therefore return to Nigeria before the end of September 1963. If they fail to take and complete this course they will have to take a full year's course.

(g) Under paragraph (f) of regulation 1 (1) the Council also has power to grant individual exemptions. But this power, which has not yet been exercised and will be exercised very sparingly, is limited to cases where the Council is satisfied that the person in question has acquired knowledge and experience fitting him for enrolment and would suffer undue hardship if he were required to undergo a further course of practical training.

6. In determining what is a law degree, an approved University, and an approved course of legal studies for the purposes of the above-mentioned exemptions and concessions the same principles will be observed by the Council as those set out in paragraphs 3 and 4 above.
