Immigration Act, 1963

NOTICE TO GENERAL PUBLIC

The attention of all members of the public, Owners and Managers of businesses and Directors and Managers of Companies is drawn to the provisions of the Immigration Act, 1963 as published in the Nigeria Federal Gazette No. 40 of the 14th June, 1963 and the Regulations made thereunder which are expected to come into force with effect from the 1st August, 1963.

These notes are issued for the guidance of the public in dealing with immigration matters and should not be taken as overriding any requirement of the Immigration Act.

ESTABLISHMENT OF BUSINESSES

- 3. Section 8 of the Immigration Act precludes any person who is not a citizen of Nigeria from establishing on his own account or in partnership with any other person, practising any profession or establishing or taking over any trade or business whatsoever or taking over any company with limited liability for any such purpose or employing any non-citizens of Nigeria without the consent in writing of the Minister of Internal Affairs.
- 4. Persons wishing to obtain the permission of the Minister under the provisions of paragraph 3 above are required to submit their applications in quintuplicate to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Internal Affairs, Alagbon Close, Ikoyi, Lagos on Immigration Forms T.I. which may be obtained from the Ministry of Internal Affairs or any Immigration Officer. No steps should be taken to establish any business, etc., until the consent of the Minister has been obtained. Such permission when granted will state the number of non-citizens of Nigeria who may be employed, and the number of non-citizens so permitted is known as the expatriate quota of the firm.
- 5. Where any company or business wishes to increase its expatriate quota application must be made on Immigration Forms T.2 in the same manner as outlined in paragraph 4.
- 6. Where a company or business wishes to employ expatriate staff over and above the allotted quota for temporary work such as the erection of a factory or installation of machinery, etc., where the work cannot be carried out within the existing quota a temporary quota should be applied for for the period required.

OPERATION OF THE QUOTA SYSTEM

- 7. Each company or business is permitted to employ expatriate staff up to the number granted by the Minister provided that such persons possess the qualifications stipulated by the company or business when applying to the Minister for a quota.
- 8. All non-Nigerians on duty in Nigeria, on vacation leave, temporarily absent from Nigeria, temporarily employed in Nigeria or holding valid entry visas or residence permits for entry into Nigeria will be counted against the quota.
- 9. The quota system does not normally apply to Educational Institutions, Universities or Government Corporations. It does however apply to all commercial companies wholly or partly owned by any of the Federal or Regional Governments of Nigeria.
- 10. Staff of Missions, Educational Institutions, Universities and Government Corporations require residence permits for entry into Nigeria if they are Commonwealth subjects and valid visas in the case of aliens.

ENTRY FOR RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES

Commonwealth Citizens.

- 11. All Commonwealth subjects seeking to enter Nigeria for the purpose of residence for any reason whatsoever are required to obtain residence permits *prior* to their entry into Nigeria and present them to the Immigration Officer who attends to them at the port of entry. Liability to present an entry permit entails refusal of entry to Nigeria.
- 12. Residence permits should normally be applied for by an employer in respect of his employees and employees' dependants. It is the responsibility of the Employer to ensure that his employees are in possession of residence permits on arrival at the port of entry.
- 13. Other persons seeking entry into Nigeria should submit their applications in writing giving their reasons for the desired entry.
- 14. All applications for the issue of residence permits should be made direct to the Chief Federal Immigration Officer, Private Mail Bag 12352, Lagos, and should contain the following information:—
 - (a) Full name of the person in respect of whom the residence permit is required.
 - (b) Date and place of birth.
 - (c) Nationality.
 - (d) Number, place and date of issue of passport.
 - (e) Reasons for application.
 - (f) Profession or occupation.
- 15. Residence permits are normally issued valid for two years and are subject to renewal on application at least one month before their expiry. Unless otherwise endorsed residence permits are valid for a single entry into Nigeria and may be withdrawn and cancelled on the departure of the holder from Nigeria although

the period of two years has not expired. Application may be made prior to departure for a new residence permit for a further entry into Nigeria. Such applications should show the approximate date of intended

Aliens.

- 16. All aliens are required to be in possession of valid visas for entry into Nigeria and residence permits are issued on arrival at the port of entry to holders of visas endorsed for residential purposes. All applications for residential status for aliens are required to be submitted through the Nigerian/British Consular Authorities in the country of domicile or temporary residence of the applicants and should be supported by letters from their prospective employers or persons in Nigeria who are accepting immigration responsibilities for their residence in Nigeria.
- 17. Possession of a residence permit by an alien does not exempt such alien from possession of a valid visa for entry into Nigeria.

VISITORS

Commonwealth subjects.

- 18. All Commonwealth subjects seeking to enter Nigeria for a visit do not require residence permits provided they are not undertaking any kind of employment. If they intend to take up any employment, of no matter how temporary a nature, they are required to be in possession of residence permits. Unless prior permission of the Chief Federal Immigration Officer has been obtained for a longer stay visitors passes may be issued for a period of 28 days subject to renewal by any Immigration Officer up to a period of three months on application in writing by the holder, supported by his reference in Nigeria giving full reasons why he requires an extension of his stay. The visiting pass may be further extended beyond three months at the discretion of the Chief Federal Immigration Officer. Such applications must be made at least seven days before the expiration of the visitors pass and each application is dealt with on its merits.
- 19. An applicant for the issue of a visitors pass is normally expected to satisfy the Immigration Officer that :-
 - (a) He is in possession of a return ticket to his country of origin or a destination beyond Nigeria to which he possesses entry facilities : or

(b) He is in possession of adequate funds for his return passage or to another destination to which he

possesses entry facilities : or

(c) He is in possession of a letter of guarantee issued by a responsible Business or Commercial House, Educational Institution, approved Mission or reputable organisation in Nigeria; and

(d) He is in possession of adequate funds for his maintanance in Nigeria; and

(e) does not intend to remain in Nigeria permanently.

Aliens.

- 20. All aliens are required to be in possession of valid visas for Nigeria, and may be permitted entry up to a period of 28 days unless there is a restriction on the visa authority or a longer period has been authorised by the Chief Federal Immigration Officer. They are also required to satisfy the Immigration Officer as to their means in accordance with paragraph 19 above.
- 21. No extension of a visiting pass may be granted to an alien who entered Nigeria on a visa issued without the prior authority of the Chief Federal Immigration Officer and no application can be considered for residential status in respect of an alien, whilst he remains in Nigeria in consequence of a visa issued for a visit.

Note.—The holder of a visiting pass is not permitted to undertake any employment in Nigeria.

TRANSFERS

- 22. All persons entering Nigeria in transit are required to satisfy an Immigration Officer that they are in possession of an onward passage ticket, travel exchange voucher, or adequate funds to pay their onward passage and sufficient funds for their maintenance whilst in transit through Nigeria and they possess entry facilities for a destination beyond Nigeria. In addition all aliens require transit visas unless they are in direct transit by air or changing aircraft provided that they do not intend to leave the confines of the airport and their stay is not likely to exceed 24 hours.
- 23. All persons who satisfy these conditions may be issued with transit passes for the period of their transit up to a maximum of 7 days. If they wish to remain beyond this period they must apply in writing to the Chief Federal Immigration Officer at least 48 hours before the expiry of their pass giving reasons why the extension is required.

DISCHARGE OF EMPLOYEES

24. Employers are required to notify the Chief Federal Immigration Officer of all persons leaving their employment and the arrangements made for their repatriation from Nigeria. Failure to do so constitutes an offence under the provisions of Section 46 of the Immigration Act.

CHANGES OF EMPLOYMENT

25. All employees wishing to change their employment are required to direct their applications for consideration to the Chief Federal Immigration Officer together with their residence permits, letter of no objection from their present/previous employers and a letter of guarantee from their prospective employer. Under no circumstances must any change of employment take place without the prior approval of the Chief Federal Immigration Officer as this constitutes an offence under the Immigration Act.

APPLICATIONS FOR TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT

- 26. All applications for temporary employment submitted by holders of residence permits in Nigeria can only be considered where there is a suitable vacancy on the quota which the applicant is qualified to fill. In the case of a wife or daughter of a resident the application must be accompanied by a no objection certificate from the husband/father and an offer of appointment from the prospective employer. Any such approval granted in no way affects the conditions under which the applicant was permitted to enter Nigeria and in the event of the purpose for which her employment was approved ceasing to operate she will be required to leave Nigeria unless she obtains the permission of the Chief Federal Immigration Officer to continue to reside in Nigeria.
- 27. Applications for temporary employment which do not come under the quota restrictions shall be submitted in the same manner as required in paragraph 26 and will be dealt with on their merits. Applications for teaching in Educational Institutions shall be accompanied by a letter from the Government Education Authority of the area concerned approving the teaching qualifications of the applicant.

Persons in Nigeria who do not hold any Immigration Certificate

28. Section 36 of the Immigration Act requires that all persons in Nigeria who are not citizens of Nigeria, who are over the age of 16 years and who are not in possession of Immigration Certificates to apply to the Immigration Authorities for the issue of permits and regularisation of their stay in Nigeria. Likewise all persons who are in Nigeria at the present time or enter at any subsequent date are required to report before the Immigration Authorities for regularisation of their stay in Nigeria within 3 months of attaining their sixteenth birthday.

EXEMPTIONS

29. These instructions do not apply to any person who is in the employment of the Government of the Federation of Nigeria or any of the Regional Governments or persons holding immunity under the provisions of the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act, 1962 except that any such person who is an alien requires a visa to enter Nigeria unless he is a citizen of a country with which Nigeria has entered into a visa abolition agreement.

RETURNS

30. In order to facilitate the operation of the new Act and the Quota system all employers are required to forward to the Chief Federal Immigration Officer, on the 1st August, 1963, a list of their expatriate staff including those on leave, temporarily absent from Nigeria and locally employed in Nigeria. Thereafter it will be necessary for a monthly return to be submitted showing arrivals and departure of staff.

GENERAL

31. Nothing in these notes affects the right of the Minister, or Chief Federal Immigration Officer to refuse the issue of or cancel any immigration permit or certificate or refuse a person permission to enter Nigeria.

Immigration Act, 1963

NOTES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF SHIPPING COMPANIES AND SHIPPING AGENTS

The attention of Shipping Companies and Shipping Agents is drawn to the Immigration Act, 1963 (Published in Federation of Nigeria Official Gazette No. 40 of the 14th June, 1963) and the regulations made thereunder which are shortly to come into effect.

2. The following notes are issued for the guidance of Shipping Companies and Shipping Agents, and should not be taken as overriding any requirement of the Immigration Act.

RECOGNISED PORTS

3. All ships entering or leaving Nigeria are required to clear Immigration formalities at a recognised port. Recognised ports are Lagos, Warri, Sapele, Port Harcourt and Calabar. In the event of a ship arriving at other than a recognised port it is the responsibility of the Master of the Vessel to contact the nearest Immigration Officer and ensure that no one leaves his Vessel until the consent of the Immigration Officer has been obtained.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED IN RESPECT OF THE ARRIVAL OF A VESSEL AT A NIGERIAN PORT

4. The following documents are required in respect of any vessel arriving in Nigeria:

(a) Crew list in duplicate.(b) List of ports of call on inward journey.

(c) List of disembarking passengers showing the port of embarkation,

(d) List of passengers in transit showing the port of embarkation and intended port of disembarkation.

(e) List of other persons on board including stowaways.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED IN RESPECT OF THE DEPARTURE OF A VESSEL FROM A NIGERIAN PORT

5. (a) List of Embarking passengers showing port of destination.

b) List of outward ports of call. List of embarking crew.

(d) List of any crew members or other persons missing from the ship on departure.

DISEMBARKING PASSENGER REQUIREMENTS

- 6. All persons seeking to disembark from a vessel arriving at a port in Nigeria who have embarked at a Port outside Nigeria are required to report before an Immigration Officer, complete a disembarkation card and produce their passports, residence permits and/or valid visas for examination by an Immigration Officer who shall decide under what conditions the passengers may be permitted to enter Nigeria or alternatively refuse such passengers permission to enter Nigeria. Passenger clearance normally takes place on board the vessel unless otherwise directed by an Immigration Officer who may permit landing for the purpose of examination.
 - (a) Aliens.—All Aliens require visas with the exception of the following:
 - (i) Nationals of the following countries:-

Cameroun Republic, Republic of Niger,

- (ii) Transit Passengers continuing their journey on the vessel on which they arrived. They will not however be permitted to live ashore whilst the vessel is in a Nigerian port unless they are in possession of valid visas.
- (iii) Holders of United Nations Laissez Passer who are travelling on official business and are not staying in Nigeria for more than three months.
- (b) Commonwealth subjects.—All Commonwealth subjects seeking entry into Nigeria for the purpose of residence or employment are required to be in possession of residence permits which must be obtained prior to embarkation. Such permits may be obtained on application to the Chief Federal Immigration Officer, P.M.B. 12532, Lagos. The following persons are exempt from the requirements of Residence permits on entry :-

Citizens of Nigeria.

(ii) Persons under the age of 16 years who are accompanying or joining their parents.

- (iii) Persons in the employment of the Federal Government or a Regional Government. Their wives are also exempt and are issued with Residence permits on arrival.
- (iv) Commonwealth High Commissioners and Representatives duly accredited to Nigeria by their respective Government and recognised as such by the Government of Nigeria. This exemption also applies to their families, members of their official staffs and their wives and their personal servants.

(v) Staffs of the following International Organisations:-

International Refugee Organisation (IRO)

United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO)

World Health Organisation (WHO)

Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO)

International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO)

International Labour Organisation (ILO)

Universal Postal Union (UPU)

International Telecommunication Union.

United Nations and International Court of Justice.

World Meteorological Organisation.

U.N.I.C.E.F.

C.C.T.A.

U.N.T.A.B.

United Nations.

ALL PERSONS SEEKING ENTRY FOR EMPLOYMENT OR RESIDENCE WHO, NOT BEING AN EXEMPTED PER-SON, IS NOT IN POSSESSION OF A RESIDENCE PERMIT WILL BE REFUSED ADMISSION.

(c) Visitors.—All persons seeking to enter Nigeria as visitors (aliens require visas unless otherwise exempted) are, prior to admission, required to satisfy the Immigration Officer that they are in possession of a return ticket, an onward transportation ticket to a country to which they possess entry facilities and they have sufficient funds for their maintenance whilst in Nigeria or that they have made or are in a position to make adequate arrangements for their maintenance in and departure from Nigeria.

- (d) Transients.—All perosns seeking to enter Nigeria in transit (Aliens require visas unless otherwise exempted) are, prior to admission, required to satisfy the Immigration Officer that they are in possession of an onward passage ticket to a destination beyond Nigeria to which they have entry facilities and have sufficient funds for their maintenance whilst in Nigeria or that they have made or are in a position to make adequate arrangements for their maintenance in and departure from Nigeria.
- (e) Transit passengers.—All passengers in transit on a vessel are liable to examination by an Immigration Officer and are not permitted to go ashore without the approval of an Immigration Officer. Where such approval is withheld or refused the Master of the Vessel is responsible that such passenger or passengers do not go ashore in Nigeria. All Aliens require visas to live ashore whilst vessel is in port.

CONTROL OF CREW

- 7. (a) Shore leave.—All members of the crew are subject to examination by an Immigration Officer and may not go ashore without the permission of an Immigration Officer. On arrival of the vessel in Port the Master shall hand to the Immigration Officer two copies of the Crew manifest and the Immigration Officer will examine such members of the crew as he considers necessary and return one copy of the manifest to the Captain of the ship indicating which members of the crew if any are not to be permitted to go ashore. Where any member of the crew is refused shore leave the Master of the Vessel shall be responsible for ensuring that the crew member does not go ashore. All persons on board who are not crew members will be treated as passengers.
- (b) Signing on of Crew.—All persons, other than Citizens of Nigeria, signing on as crew in a Nigerian Port are required to report before an Immigration Officer prior to embarkation and complete embarkation cards.
- (c) Discharge of Crew.—No member of the crew, not being a citizen of Nigeria, may be discharged without the consent of an Immigration Officer. Such consent may be given by an Immigration Officer at the time at which he clears the vessel or when the crew member is attending the Shipping Master's Office for discharge. Such consent will not be given unless the Immigration Officer is satisfied that adequate arrangements have been made for the repatriation of the crew member or his signing on another vessel. Each person seeking discharge is required to complete a disembarkation card provided that no disembarkation card need be competed or the permission of the Immigration Officer obtained in the respect of the transfer of a crew member from one vessel to another vessel that is in the same port. In a case of this nature the Agents of the vessel are required to notify the Immigration Officer of the crew transfer.

In the case of hospitalisation of a crew member, the permission of the Immigration Officer is not necessary on condition that the Agent of the vessel concerned notifies the Immigration Officer within 24 hours in writing and arranges for the person concerned to report before an Immigration Officer on discharge from hospital and where he is not conveyed back on board the vessel from which he disembarked. Notice of such reembarkation shall be given to the Immigration Officer in writing by the Agent of the vessel.

STOWAWAYS

8. The master of the Vessel shall report, immediately on arrival of the vessel, to the Immigration Officer the presence of any stowaway on board that vessel and is responsible that that stowaway does not land in Nigeria unless he is a citizen of Nigeria. All person found attempting to stowaway in Nigeria should be handed over to the Nigeria Police.

DESERTERS

9. Deserters and persons left behind after departure of the vessel on which they arrived are treated as prohibited immigrants and the costs of maintenance and repatriation are to be met by the Owners/Agents of the vessel on which the person arrived.

EMBARKING PASSENGER REQUIREMENTS

10. All passengers seeking to embark in Nigeria on board a vessel are required to report before an Immigration Officer, complete an embarkation card and produce their travel documents for examination by an Immigration Officer. The Immigration Officer may prohibit departure in any of the following cases:—

(a) On the direction of the Minister, or

(b) Where the passport of a person is not in proper order, or
 (c) There is, to the knowledge of the Immigration Officer an unsatisfied order of a court of competent jurisdiction or warrant of arrest relating to that person.

REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

- 11. A list of the categories of persons whose entry into Nigeria is prohibited is given in section 17 of the Act. In addition names are published in the Federal Gazette of persons whose entry has been prohibited.
- 12. Where a person has been refused admission by an Immigration Officer, the Master of the vessel shall be informed in writing by the Immigration Officer and the Master shall be responsible for ensuring that such person is not allowed to disembark in Nigeria. Where the passenger has been permitted to land for examination he shall be immediately conveyed back on board the vessel from which he disembarked.

EMBARKATION/DISEMBARKATION CARDS

13. It is the responsibility of the Shipping Company to supply Embarkation/Disembarkation Cards and specimens of such cards may be obtained from the Chief Federal Immigration Officer, Lagos.

Persons Entering Nigeria for the purpose of Employment on Vessels Plying in Nigerian Territorial Waters or Based in Nigeria

14. All persons seeking to enter Nigeria for employment on vessels based in Nigeria or plying mainly or exclusively in Nigerian waters are required to be in possession of valid residence permits if they are Commonwealth subjects and in the case of Aliens visas for residential status.

Immigration Act, 1963

NOTES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF AIR COMPANIES AND HANDLING AGENTS

The attention of all Air Companies and Handling Agents is drawn to the Immigration Act, 1963 (Published in Official Gazette No. 40 of the 14th June, 1963) and the Immigration Regulations made thereunder which is shortly to come into effect.

2. The following notes are issued for the guidance of Air Companies and Handling Agents and should not be taken as overriding any requirement of the Immigration Act.

RECOGNISED AIRPORTS

3. All Aircraft entering or leaving Nigeria are required to land at or leave from a recognised airport. Recognised airports are Kano, Lagos, Maiduguri and Calabar. In the event of an aircraft landing at a port other than a recognised airport it is the responsibility of the Commander of the aircraft to report to the nearest Immigration Officer for clearance.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED IN RESPECT OF AN AIRCRAFT LANDING IN NIGERIA

4. The following documents are required in respect of any aircraft arriving in Nigeria:-

(a) A general Declaration containing a full list of all crew members and the dates and ports of call of the aircraft since it started on its flight.

(b) A list of all disembarking passengers together with particulars of the port from which they embarked on that aircraft.

(c) A list of all passengers in transit showing the ports at which they embarked and their intended port of disembarkation.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED IN RESPECT OF AIRCRAFT LEAVING NIGERIA

5. The following documents are required in respect of any aircraft leaving Nigeria:-

(a) A general Declaration containing a full list of all crew members and outward ports of call.

(b) List of embarking passengers showing their points of intended disembarkation.

DISEMBARKING PASSENGER REQUIREMENTS .

- 6. All persons seeking to disembark from an aircraft arriving in Nigeria who have embarked at a port outside Nigeria are required to report before the Immigration Officer, complete a disembarkation card and produce their passports, residence permits and/or valid visas for examination by the Immigration Officer who shall decide the conditions under which the passenger may be permitted to enter Nigeria or alternatively refuse such passengers entry to Nigeria.
 - (a) Aliens.—All Aliens require visas with the exception of the following:—

(i) Nationals of the following countries:—
 Cameroun Republic, Republic of Niger.

(ii) Passengers in transit by air who are in possession of onward passage tickets who do not contemplate more than a 24 hours stop-over in Nigeria.

(iii) Holders of United Nations Laissez Passer who are travelling on official business and are not staying in Nigeria for more than three months.

- (b) Commonwealth Subjects.—All Commonwealth subjects seeking entry into Nigeria for the purpose of residence or employment are required to be in possession of residence permits which must be obtained prior to embarkation. Such permits may be obtained on application to the Chief Federal Immigration Officer, P.M.B. 12532, Lagos. The following persons are exempt from the requirements of Residence Permits for entry:—
 - (i) Citizens of Nigeria.
 - (ii) Persons under the age of 16 years who are accompanying or joining their parents.
 - (iii) Persons in the employment of the Federal Government or a Regional Government. Their wives are also exempt and are issued with Residence Permits on arrival.

ANY PERSON SEEKING ENTRY FOR EMPLOYMENT OR RESIDENCE WHO NOT BEING IN AN EXEMPTED CATEGORY, IS NOT IN POSSESSION OF AN ENTRY PERMIT WILL BE REFUSED ADMISSION

- (c) Visitors.—All persons seeking to enter Nigeria as visitors (aliens require visas) are, prior to admission, required to satisfy the Immigration Officer that they are in possession of a return ticket, an onward transportation ticket to a country to which they possess entry facilities and they have sufficient funds for their maintenance whilst in Nigeria or that they have made or are in a position to make adequate arrangements for their maintenance in and departure from Nigeria.
- (d) Transients.—All persons seeking to enter Nigeria in transit (aliens require visas unless they are otherwise exempted) are, prior to admission, required to satisfy the Immigration Officer that they are in possession of an onward passage ticket to a destination beyond Nigeria to which they have entry facilities and are in possession of sufficient funds for their maintenance whilst in Nigeria or that they have made or are in a position to make adequate arrangements for their maintenance in and departure from Nigeria.
- (e) Direct Transit Passengers. Ail passengers in transit by the same aircraft are liable to examination by an Immigration Officer should he consider it necessary. Visas are not required.
- (f) Night top Passengers.—Where any aircraft night stops in Nigeria, all crew and passengers are required to report before the Immigration Officer on disembarkation and re-embarkation. It will not be necessary for disembarkation/embarkation cards to be completed and the passports of the persons will be stamped with permission to land whilst the aircraft is in Nigeria.
- (g) Interline Passengers.—Do not require visas. No formalities are necessary if not leaving the confines of the transit area, although such persons are subject to examination at discretion of Immigration Officer.
- (h) Internal Passengers.—Internal Passengers on International services are subject to check by Immigration Officer to ensure that they are not passengers subject to examination under Immigration Act.

CONTROL OF CREW

7. All Crew disembarking from an aircraft for the purpose of joining another aircraft either as a passenger or a crew member are required to report before an Immigration Officer both on disembarkation and reembarkation. Such aircrew are required to be in possession of a valid passport and in the case of an alien a valid visa and shall be issued with transit passes for the duration of their stay ir Nigeria. Such passes shall be subject to any specific or general direction of the Chief Federal Immigration Officer and may be given in the form of an instruction to the agents of the aircraft concerned. Supernumerary and extra crew are treated as passengers.

STOWAWAYS

8. The commander of the aircraft shall report, immediately on arrival, the presence of any stowaway on board his aircraft and is responsible for ensuring that that stowaway does not land in Nigeria unless he is a Citizen of Nigeria.

EMBARKING PASSENGER REQUIREMENTS

- All passengers seeking to depart from Nigeria are required to complete embarkation cards and produce their passports for examination and stamping. The Immigration Officer may prohibit departure in any of the following cases :-
 - (a) On the direction of the Minister, or
 - (b) Where the passport of a passenger is not in proper order, or
 - (c) There is, to the knowledge of the Immigration Officer, an unsatisfied order of a court of competent jurisdiction or warrant of arrest relating to that passenger.

REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

- 10. A list of the categories of persons whose entry is prohibited is given in section 17 of the Act. In addition names are published in the Official Gazette of individual persons whose entry has been prohibited.
- 11. Where a person has been refused admission by an Immigration Officer he shall be placed back on board the aircraft on which he arrived or where the aircraft has already left he shall be handed over to the agents of the aircraft on which he arrived and they shall be responsible for removing him from Nigeria on the first available aircraft leaving to the destination from which he arrived or such other destination to which he has entry facilities. The cost of removing a person from Nigeria whose entry has been refused, and the maintenance of such person until his removal from Nigeria shall be borne by the owners/agents of the aircraft on which he arrived in Nigeria.

EMBARKATION/DISEMBARKATION CARDS

12. It is the responsibility of the Air Companies to supply embarkation/disembarkation cards and specimens of such cards may be obtained from the Chief Federal Immigration Officer, Lagos.

National Provident Fund Act, 1961 (1961, No. 20)

APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL PROVIDENT FUND ADVISORY COUNCIL

In exercise of the powers conferred by paragraphs 1 to 6 of the First Schedule to the National Provident Fund Act, 1961, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Federal Minister of Labour (after due consultation with the relevant associations, persons or bodies, specified in paragraphs 3 and 4 thereof), has for purposes of the Act constituted the following as members of the National Provident Fund Advisory Council for a period of three years with effect from 17th day of July, 1963, that is to say,—

- (a) to represent the Federal and Regional Governments-
 - (i) the Parliamentary Secretary to the Federal Minister of Labour, Lagos
 - (ii) the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Establishments and Service matters, Lagos
 - (iii) the Minister of Social Welfare and Co-operatives, Kaduna
 - (iv) the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Finance, Enugu
 - (v) the Assistant Accountant-General, Ibadan

Constitution of the Federation

Police Service Commission (Delegation of Powers) Notice, 1963

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 103 of the Constitution of the Federation and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Police Service Commission of the Federation (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission"), with the approval of the Prime Minister, hereby delegates to the Inspector-General of the Nigeria Police (hereinafter referred to as "the Inspector-General") the powers set out in Parts I and II of the Schedule hereto relating to the appointment and discipline of officers in the Nigeria Police Force.

- 2. The Inspector-General shall, on each and every occasion the power set out in Part II of the Schedule is exercised forthwith send a very brief report of the circumstances, the value of the loss and the names of the officers involved to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Finance, the Director of Audit of the Federation, and the Accountant-General of the Federation.
- 3. The Inspector-General shall not in turn, without the specific approval of the Commission being first obtained, delegate these powers.
- 4. Nothing in this delegation shall prevent the exercise of the powers by the Commission.

SCHEDULE

PART I

- 1. The power to appoint to any posts in the Nigeria Police Force, the initial basic salary of which is less than £648 per annum, subject to the condition that in exercising this power in respect of posts of Cadet Sub-Inspector and of the initial basic salary of £348 per annum or more (but less than £648 per annum), the Inspector-General shall seek the approval of the Commission.
- 2. The power to confirm or terminate the probationary appointment of any officer whose initial basic salary is less than £648 per annum, subject to the condition that in exercising the power of termination in respect of an officer who is a Cadet Sub-Inspector or holds a post, the initial basic salary of which is £348 per annum or more (but less than £648 per annum), the Inspector-General shall seek the approval of the Commission.
- 3. The power to dismiss and to exercise other disciplinary control over all officers whose initial basic salary is less than £648 per annum, subject to the following conditions—
 - (a) in exercising this power in respect of an officer whether confirmed or not, who is a Cadet Sub-Inspector or holds a post, the initial basic salary of which is £348 per annum or more (but less than £648 per annum), the Inspector-General shall seek the approval of the Commission; and
 - (b) in exercising this power in respect of a confirmed and pensionable officer who holds a post, the initial basic salary of which is less than £348 per annum, the Inspector-General shall seek the approval of the Commission in all cases where interdiction, dismissal, reduction in rank, termination of appointment, or incremental penalty is proposed.

PART II

The power to impose surcharge on officers in respect of loss of stores or funds if the value of the loss on any one occasion does not exceed ten pounds and to ensure that the surcharge imposed is paid into the revenue of the Federal Government:

Provided that if the loss reveals a weakness in stores or accounting procedure, the power shall not be exercised until the full report in accordance with Financial Instructions has been rendered and which report shall include advice as to the action intended to be taken.
