EVENING COURSES—SESSION 1964-65

The part time session of the College of Technology will begin on Monday, 5th October, 1964.

RE-ENROLMENTS

Students who completed the 1963-64 session may re-enrol on payment of fees between 8 a.m. and 2 p.m., or between 5.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on September 2nd, 3rd or 4th. Those who were successful in the sessional examinations, and who satisfied the conditions for homework, classwork and attendance, will be promoted. Others who completed the session but were unsuccessful may repeat the class. No student will be permitted to repeat a class more than twice.

Students who attended in previous years (before 1963-64) and who wish to return should re-apply as new enrolments stating their previous attendance.

NEW ENROLMENTS

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for the following evening courses :

Preliminary Technical.—A three-year course preparatory to entry to more advanced 'Technicians' courses in engineering and building. Applicants, selected on the basis of their applications, will be examined for entry. The subjects of the course are : English, Mathematics, Science and Drawing.

Commercial (General).—A four-year course consisting of one junior and three senior years. The senior stages prepare students for the R.S.A. examinations in the relevant subjects at the appropriate stages. Selected applicants who hold a Standard VI or First School Leaving Certificate will be examined for entry to the junior stage. Selected applicants with a Secondary IV Certificate will be examined for entry to the senior stages.

This is a group course, and promotion within the course is obtained only on passing (or being exempted from) all subjects of each stage. Subject exemptions will be given for success in internal or R.S.A. subject examinations. The subjects of the first year of the course are : English, Geography and Commercial Arithmetic, and in subsequent years : English, Geography, Book-keeping, Commerce and Economics.

Stenography (General).—A four-year course of one preliminary and three senior years. The senior stages prepare students for the R.S.A. examinations in English, Shorthand and Typewriting at the appropriate levels. Selected applicants who hold a Standard VI or First School Leaving Certificate will be examined for entry to the preliminary stage. A limited number of vacancies exist in the senior stages for holders of R.S.A. certificates who may be selected or examined for entry. This is a group course, but students of proved ability may proceed to higher stages in one or two of the subjects while continuing the remaining subject(s) at a lower level.

Stenography (High Speed).—A special course for holders of R.S.A. certificates of 100 words per minute in shorthand and 50 words per minute in typewriting. The object of the course is to coach competent stenographers for speeds in excess of 120 and 60 words per minute in shorthand and typewriting respectively.

Accountancy (i).—A three-year course designed to prepare students for the intermediate examinations of A.C.C.A. Qualification for entry is a pass in, or exemption from, the preliminary examinations of A.C.C.A., but consideration may be given to holders of a good W.A.S.C. or G.C.E. in appropriate subjects. The subjects of the first year of the course are : Book-keeping and Accountancy, Costing, Mercantile Law, Auditing and Business Statistics. A competitive examination may be held.

(ii) A two-year course leading to the final examinations of A.C.C.A. (section I may be taken after one year). Qualification for entry is a pass in the intermediate examinations of A.C.C.A. The subjects of the first year of the course are : Advanced Accountancy, Executorship and Bankruptcy, Company Law, Business Administration and Advanced Costing.

Secretaryship (i).—A three-year course preparing students for the intermediate examinations of C.I.S. and C.C.S. Qualification for entry is a pass in, or exemption from, the preliminary examinations of either of those two bodies, but consideration may be given to holders of a good W.A.S.C. or G.C.E. in appropriate subjects. The subjects of the first year of the course are : English, Accountancy, Economics and General Principles of English Law. A competitive examination may be held.

(ii) A two-year course leading to the final examinations of C.I.S. and C.C.S. (Part I may be taken after one year). Qualification for entry is a pass in the intermediate examinations of either of these two bodies. The subjects of the first year of the course are : Mercantile Law, Advanced Economics, Secretarial Practice, Accountancy.

Monotype Keyboard.—A three-year vocational course in Monotype keyboard operation open only to students already employed as compositors or keyboard operators. The subjects of the course are English and Monotype Theory and Practice.

Art.—Vocational courses are offered in : Drawing, Painting, Design, Illustration, Lettering, Portraiture, Sculpture, Textile Design, Silk-screen Printing and Pottery. Admission, which is by interview, is open to teachers and others in relevant professions. A number of places are offered to other candidates wishing to study any of the above subjects, either for interest or in preparation for an examination. The College Testimonial is awarded on successful completion of four years of study.

Admission to the part time classes does not automatically qualify candidates for entry to the full time courses.

TUITION FEES AND METHOD OF APPLICATION

Preliminary and Junior Courses : £2 10s per session

Senior and Professional Courses : £4 per session

There will also be a Students' Union subscription of 2s 6d per session. Students must supply their own stationery, text books and instruments, of a type and quality specified by the College. Engineering and Building students will be provided with drawing boards, but are advised to supply their own T-squares.

External examination fees, where applicable, are *not* included in the above fees.
