Public Service Commission (Delegation of Powers) Notice No. 3 of 1964

OPENING TO THE PUBLIC OF THE YANKARI GAME RESERVE

Notice is hereby given that as from 1st December, 1964 the Yankari Game Reserve, Bauchi Province, will be opened again to the General Public for visits, and will remain open to visitors until 31st May, 1965.

- 2. Visitors wishing to see the Yankari Game Reserve should apply for permission to enter the Reserve, preferably at least one month in advance of the date of their intended visit. Application should be made to the Regional Game Warden, Ministry of Animal and Forest Resources, Bauchi (Telegraphic address Game Bauchi).
- 3. Visitors to the Game Reserve are required to comply with any rules and instructions for visitors issued by the Regional Game Warden.
- 4. The Yankari Game Reserve is situated in the Fali and Duguri Districts of Bauchi Emirate to the South-east of Bauchi, and covers an area of approximately 720 square miles. From Bauchi, access to the Reserve is by the Bauchi-Gombe all season laterite road for a distance of 25 miles to Dindima on the east bank of the Gongola river; thence by the Dindima-Gar-Mainamaii dry season road for a distance of 18 miles to the Mainamaii Base Camp at the north-western corner of the Reserve; thence through the Reserve by an all season motor track for a distance of 27 miles to the visitors' camp at Wikki Springs.
- 5. Visitors are expected to use their own transport to and from Wikki Springs on entering and leaving the Game Reserve though a limited number of requests for transport from Bauchi to and from Wikki can be met. For excursions from Wikki within the Reserve, Landrovers are provided, though visitors having four-wheel drive vehicles may use their own vehicles if they wish, provided they are accompanied by a member of the Game Unit staff.

- 6. Excursions to view the wildlife are undertaken each morning and evening. Game Scouts accompany each excursion as guides. To have a reasonable certainty of seeing a tepresentative selection of the wildlife, it is recommended that at least one night be spent in the Reserve.
- 7. Three rough "hides" have been erected at strategic points for the benefit of visitors who prefer to observe or photograph game in one particular location.
- 8. There is an unfurnished resthouse at the Mainamaji Base Camp available for persons wishing to break their journey to and from the Reserve for a brief rest.
- 9. Accommodation at the visitors' camp at Wikki Springs consists of :--
 - (a) Five round thatched chalets each accommodating two persons and furnished with beds, mattresses, pillows, mosquito nets, chairs and a table.
 - (b) Whitewashed mud buildings with thatched roofs and cement floor, each room furnished with two single beds with mattresses, mosquito nets and pillows. Accommodating twenty-eight persons.
 - (c) Six tents, with beds, mosquito nets and pillows, to provide additional accommodation and to cater for those who prefer to live under canyas.
- 10. There is a furnished dining room lounge of permanent construction, and additional dining accommodation of temporary construction. Wood and water is provided and three refrigerators, and there are rough camp cooking facilities, but no catering is undertaken. Visitors should therefore come prepared with their own bedding, food, drinks, crockery, cutlery, lamps and cooking utensits.
- Radio-telephone equipment is being installed to provide a link between Wikki Camp and the office of the Regional Game Warden at Bank hi.
- 12. Excellent bathing facilities exist at the Wikki Warm Spring, situated in a goree inmediately below the Wikki Camp. Comented steps lead down from the camp to the pool, and there is a concented landing and a changing but at the edge of the pool.
- 13. At the office of the Regional Game Warden in Bauch is a small wildlife museum which is open to visitors.
- 14. The following diurnal animals inhabit the trame Reserve, and visitors can normally expect to see a fair selection:

RULES GOVERNING VISITORS TO THE YANKARI GAME RESERVE.

- 1. No visitor may take any firearms into the Game Reserve. Any visitor having firearms in his possession on arrival at the Reserve is required to hand them over to a member of the Game Unit staff at Mainaman Base Camp for custody during the time that the visitor is within the Reserve.
- 2. Except in the immediate environs of Wikki Camp, visitors are not permitted to move about in the Reserve except under the guidance and in the company of the Regional Game Warden or a member of his uniformed staff.
- 3. While on excursions from Wikki Camp, dismounting from vehicles (except with the permission of the member of Game Unit staff in charge of the party) is forbidden.
- 4. Visitors are forbidden to drive, harass or deliberately startle game.
 - 5. No fires may be lit, except at the Wikki Camp.
- 6. In the interests of safety, children below the age of twelve years are not permitted to join excursions. They must remain at Wikki Camp in the care of an adult visitor or a trustworthy servant.
- 7. A maximum speed limit of 30 miles per hour must be observed on the access road between Mainamai and Wikki.
 - 8. Dogs are not allowed in the Reserve.
- 9 The following charges are payable to the clerke at Wikki Camp before leaving the Reserve:
 - (a) Ten shillings per person in respect of transport for each excursion to view the game.
 - (b) Ten shillings per night per person in respect of rest camp ficilities provided at Wikki.
 - (c) Sixty shillings per person in respect of transport for the round top Bauchi-Wikki-Bauchi.

Children under the age of sixteen years are not hable for these charges 10. Visitors are remainded that the game is wild and that some species (e.g., bushcow) are potentially dangerous to human life. Visitors entering the Game Reserve do so entirely at their own risk, and the Government of Northern Nigeria cannot be held resposible for any damage, injury or loss, either to visitors themselves or to their property.
