MID-WESTERN NIGERIA MARKETING BOARD APPOINTMENT OF LICENSED BUYING AGENTS FOR THE 1965-66 COCOA SEASON

(f) to arrange for checkweighing and inspection at port in accordance with the regulations;

(g) to arrange for delivery of cocea to ocean going vessel and to hand without delay shipping documents as required to the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited.

4. Minimum conditions :

(a) Purchases.—Applicants must produce evidence of ability to purchase with regularity throughout a season a minimum of 250 tons of Cocoa (*i.e.*, Main and Light Crops, inclusive).

(c) Where an employee is engaged after July 1965, and is therefore not entitled to any wages, salary or other emoluments for that month, the employer shall make the appropriate deduction from the wages, salary or other emoluments due to the employee for the first available month after July 1965, and shall, in like manner as in the case of all normal July deductions, issue an original official INCOME RATE receipt to such employee for the amount of the deduction. If for any other reason an employer had omitted to deduct INCOME RATE from an employee's wages, salary or other emoluments for the month of July 1965, the employer shall make the appropriate deduction from the wages, salary or other emoluments for the very next available month after such an omission is detected.

4. Individuals other than employed persons.—Every other individual, besides an employed person, with any income whatsoever in his or her own right shall obtain the appropriate 1965-66 INCOME RATE receipt in respect of his own income from whichever of the two Inland Revenue Offices shown in paragraph 2 above is more convenient to him, at the time and date shown.
