4. *Duties.*—The Vice-Principal shall be responsible to the Principal for assisting with the academic, domestic and social functioning of the school and should perform all other duties as assigned to him by the Principal.

5. *Conditions of service.*—(a) The post is pensionable, except where contract terms are offered, and in the case of new entrants, appointment would be on probation for three years.

(b) Rent is payable at 8½ per cent of salary subject to a maximum of £150 per annum when an officer is occupying Government Quarters.

6. *Method of application.*—Applications should be submitted in duplicate on the official form obtainable from the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Benin City.

Candidates in Government Service need not apply on the official form and their application in the form of a letter should be submitted in duplicate through their Heads of Departments.
