CUSTOMS AND EXCISE MANAGEMENT ACT 1958 (No. 55 or 1958)

Customs Ports (Designation) Order 1967

Commencement: 27th May 1967

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 12 (1) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1958 and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf the Supreme Military Council hereby makes the following order :-

1.—(1) The several areas named in Schedule 1 to this order together with the approved wharves adjacent thereto are designated places of arrival or departure in Nigeria of ships by sea for customs purposes; and the description of those areas in the Customs Ports Order 1959 (as substituted in part by the Customs Ports (Amendment) Order 1967) shall continue in force and be read and construed herewith.

- (2) Accordingly the orders mentioned in Schedule 2 of this order shall be amended or revoked, as the case may be, to the extent necessary to give effect to this order.
