WHEREAS by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of Western State as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Western State shall be the Chief Justice of Western State and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (1) of the Constitution of Western State as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Chief Justice of the State and other Judges shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

NOW THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint ADENEKAN ADEKUNLE ADEMOLA a Judge of the High Court of Western State with effect from 16th June 1970.

(a) The acute dropout rate from primary schools during the early years of attendance, resulting in a high degree of illiteracy;

(b) Inadequate planning of staffing requirements in relation to projected pupil intake; and

(c) Deficiencies in the conduct of the educational process in schools and other institutions of learning.

(3) The recognition of these problems, which were examined by a number of UNESCO missions, resulted in the Ministry of Education, in association with the University of Baghdad, establishing in 1966 a Centre for Educational Research. The United Nations Development Programme, through UNESCO, has supplied experts under the Technical Assistance programme in testing, in research design and in curriculum to assist the Centre's staff. Work already in progress at the Centre includes:

(a) Curricular studies;

(b) Examination of problems of wastage in elementary schools;

(c) Evaluation of school textbooks; and

(d) A survey of agricultural secondary schools.

(4) The UNDP is developing its assistance to the Centre in 1970-1972 under its Special Fund programme in order that the major curricular and institutional problems be identified, enabling the Centre to start full scale development work leading towards an improvement in the educational system. This will make a significant contribution towards remedying the inadequate use of human resources,

(2) The quality of the educational system, is however, a matter of concern to the Government of Iraq. Major problems include :

(a) The acute dropout rate from primary schools during the early years of attendance, resulting in a high degree of illiteracy ;

(b) Inadequate planning of staffing requirements in relation to projected pupil intake ; and

(c) Deficiencies in the conduct of the educational process in schools and other institutions of learning.

(3) The recognition of these problems, which were examined by a number of UNESCO missions, resulted in the Ministry of Education, in association with the University of Baghdad, establishing in 1966 a Centre for Educational Research. The United Nations Development Programme, through UNESCO, has supplied experts under the Technical Assistance programme in testing, in research design and in curriculum to assist the Centre's staff. Work already in progress at the Centre includes :

(a) Curricular studies ;

(b) Examination of problems of wastage in elementary schools ;

(c) Evaluation of school textbooks ; and

(d) A survey of agricultural secondary schools.

(4) The UNDP is developing its assistance to the Centre in 1970-72 under its Special Fund programme in order that the major curricular and institutional problems be identified, enabling the Centre to start full-scale development work leading towards an improvement in the educational system. This will make a significant contribution towards remedying the inadequate use of human resources, which has been a major factor in retarding social and economic development in Iraq. Expert assistance is being provided in the fields of educational planning (Chief Technical Adviser) ; research methodology ; psychometrics ; and curriculum research.

(5) During the course of the Special Fund project, the Educational Research Centre is to :

(a) Examine the process of educational planning, including projected pupil and student intakes at all levels of the educational system and staffing requirements, both as regards numbers and qualifications of teachers ;

(b) Identify the major curricular and institutional problems ;

(c) Isolate and examine those deficiencies in the school system which cause dropouts and wastage ;

(d) Conduct fellowship and counterpart training ; and

(e) On the basis of (a) to (c) above, draw up a full-scale research and development programme directed towards the resolution of the problems identified.

(6) Teachers, educational administrators and senior staff of the universities, training institutes and ministries are closely associated with and will participate in the studies and research projects to be carried out. Liaison is maintained with similar research institutions in other countries so as to make full use of any relevant findings.

(7) The activities of the Centre are planned, co-ordinated and controlled by an Administrative Board under the chairmanship of the President of the

University of Baghdad. The membership of the Board include the Director of the Centre and representatives, with the rank of Director-General, from the Ministries of Education, Planning and Interior.

4. *Functions.*—The expert in Psychometrics under the supervision of the Chief Technical Adviser and in co-operation with the other experts attached to the Centre will :

(a) assist in the identification of major educational problems of immediate significance for economic and social development ;

(b) assist in planning, designing and executing the research studies carried out in the Centre ;

(c) assist in the planning and construction of appropriate achievement and aptitude tests ;

(d) undertake the training of counterparts and other educational personnel in techniques related to the field of psychometrics ;

(e) assist in the organization of meetings and workshops ;

(f) carry out such other related duties as may be assigned by the Chief Technical Adviser.

5. *Qualifications.*—Post-graduate university degree in psychology with specialization in testing and measurement. Good research experience related to psychometrics. Ability to work well as member of a team.

6. *Language qualifications.*—English or Arabic with excellent knowledge of English.

7. *Duration of appointment.*—Two years.

8. *International salary and allowances.*—(Net of national income tax—payable partly in the currency of the staff member's home or of the duty station).
