5. Matters relating to the amount of compensation payable by the aforesaid Company for the use of the sea-bed affected shall not be material grounds to include in a notice of objection.

To undertake this programme, the Government has a considerable stock of heavy road building equipment which, in recent years, has been brought into the country. However, a lack of skilled mechanics and spare parts is causing a rapid deterioration of this equipment, which cannot be replaced because foreign exchange is not available. This situation threatens the secondary road construction programme as well as the maintenance of the main road network.

Furthermore, the supply of water consumed during the summer months and the water used for irrigation during the year is pumped by diesel pumps from wells. The maintenance and repair of these pumps is the responsibility of the Ministry of Public Works, and there is a need to establish appropriate field services facilities and to train mechanics to provide these services which, at present, are non-existent.

The Ministry of Public Works has received in the past considerable bilateral aid, including equipment, for the construction of the country's major road system.

The Government is therefore proposing to set up a training centre for personnel concerned with the maintenance and repair of heavy road building equipment. This training centre will be established in Taiz, where suitable classrooms and workshop buildings are already available. It will serve as a pilot centre for vocational training courses which will be conducted in Arabic and English.

In addition, the Public Works Department is planning the implementation of proper procedures for the administration of its three divisions (Sana'a, Hodeidah and Taiz), and intend to have courses in finance and business administration form part of the management training to be undertaken in this centre.

"To inquire into the trade dispute declared by the Railway and Ports Transport and Clerical Staff Union, Nigeria against the Nigerian Ports Authority in accordance with section 4 (1) of the Trade Disputes (Emergency Provisions) (Amendment) Decree 1969 over the following issues:

- (i) The case of Mr O. N. Barango of Port Harcourt Quay;
- (ii) Reinstatement of increment of Mr B. O. Adebayo and the refund of half of his salary during the period he was interdicted;
- (iii) Grant of full Scale E, i.e. £140-£310 to all staff who are now on the scale and the conversion of the men in accordance with the Cabinet Office Circular;

and to make such awards, having regard to the circumstances of the dispute, and such other matters pertaining thereto or arising therefrom as the Industrial Arbitration Tribunal may deem necessary."
