CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATION

(1963 No. 20)

The Public Service Commission (Delegation of Powers)**Notice 1972***Commencement : 31st December 1971*

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 147 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Public Service Commission of the Federation with the approval of the Head of the Federal Military Government hereby makes the following delegation :—

1.—(1) Subject to sub-paragraph (2) below, the power to warn or to reprimand any officer in the Public Service of the Federation is hereby delegated to the Secretary to the Federal Military Government.

Delegation of power to the Secretary to the Federal Military Government.

(2) The power delegated under sub-paragraph (1) above may only be exercised where any shortcoming or misconduct on the part of an officer has come to the notice of the Secretary to the Federal Military Government (other than through a formal report made by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry or the Head of the Extra-Ministerial Department where the officer is serving which should be to the Public Service Commission) and the shortcoming or misconduct is, in the opinion of the Secretary to the Federal Military Government, not one of such seriousness requiring to be reported to the Public Service Commission (hereafter in this Notice referred to as "the Commission") for appropriate disciplinary proceedings but one that ought to be brought to the attention of the officer concerned.

(3) The Secretary to the Federal Military Government shall as soon as any warning or reprimand is issued to any officer in exercise of the power delegated under this paragraph send a report of any such warning or reprimand to the Commission.

2.—(1) The powers specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto are hereby, in respect of the posts specified in the first column of that Schedule and subject to the condition specified in the third column of that Schedule, delegated to Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Extra-Ministerial Departments in the Public Service of the Federation.

Delegation of power to Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Extra-Ministerial Departments.

(2) The Commission may require a Permanent Secretary or Head of Extra-Ministerial Department, subject to such conditions as it may specify, to further delegate in writing any of the powers delegated under this paragraph to Heads of Units in outlying formations of his Ministry or Department.

3. Any person aggrieved by anything done in respect of him by any officer to whom any power is delegated under this Notice may appeal to the Commission and the Commission may give any ruling as it thinks fit.

Appeal.

4. Nothing in this Notice shall prevent the exercise by the Commission of any power hereby delegated.

EXCHANGE CONTROL ACT 1962
(1962 No. 16)

Exchange Control (Appointment of Authorised Dealers)
(Amendment) Notice 1972

Commencement : 18th December 1971
