The old notes and coins on issue at 31st December, 1972 will cease to be legal tender after 14th February and 30th September, 1973 respectively. However the Governor of the Bank may as respects currency notes extend the period for another two weeks, unless further extended by the Governor with the approval of the Federal Executive Council.

- 2. Included in other assets is an amount of £N3,413,598 being claims on the British Government under the terms of the Sterling Guarantee Agreement 1967, in respect of losses arising from the floatation of sterling during 1972. These claims are still under negotiation and may not be fully realised.
