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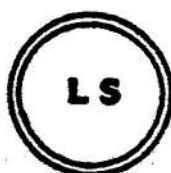

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 as amended by the Constitution (Miscellaneous Provisions) Decree 1967 and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, General YAKUBU GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces, Federal Republic of Nigeria, hereby appoint with effect from 8th May 1973, MAJOR-GENERAL HASSAN USMAN KATSINA, Deputy Chief of Staff, Supreme Headquarters, as a member of the Federal Executive Council and as Federal Commissioner for Establishments and Service Matters.
