#### IN THE MATTER OF SECTION 4 (2) OF THE TRADE DISPUTES (EMERGENCY PROVISIONS) (AMENDMENT) DECREE 1969

AND

IN THE MATTER OF DECLARED TRADE DISPUTE BETWEEN THE NIGERIAN MERCANTILE, TECHNICAL, CLERICAL AND GENERAL WORKERS' UNION

AND

#### JOHNSON GENERAL AGENCY

WHEREAS a trade dispute between Nigerian Mercantile, Technical, Clerical and General Workers' Union and Johnson General Agency has been declared ;

AND WHEREAS the endeavours to promote a settlement have proved unsuccessful;

Now THEREFORE, I, MAJOR-GENERAL HASSAN USMAN KATSINA, pursuant to the provisions of section 4 (2) of the Trade Disputes (Emergency Provisions) (Amendment) Decree No. 53 of 1969 hereby refer the dispute to the Industrial Arbitration Tribunal with the following terms of reference :--

To enquire into the Trade Dispute in existence between Nigerian Mercantile, Technical, Clerical and General Workers' Union and Johnson General Agency in accordance with section 4 (1) of the Trade Disputes (Emergency Provisions) (Amendment) Decree 1969 over the following issues :---

"(i) workers' objection to grading of all workers (including those with 5 to 6 years service) as casuals and daily paid workers;

(ii) management refusal to recognise the union representing the employees ;

(iii) workers' demand for N2.31 per day instead of N2.00 per day offered by management ;

(iv) workers' demand for arrears with effect from 1st July, 1974 as against February 1975 conceded by management; and

In view of the fact that from the returns so far received from the bank's branches in Lagos, West, Mid-West and parts of the North, with returns from the Eastern States still being awaited, 1,926 staff which constitutes more than 60 per cent of 3,116 affected staff have declared their membership of NUNBE, the Management of Barclays Bank of Nigeria Limited has agreed to recognise NUNBE as the accredited representatives of the Unappointed Staff of the bank subject to mutually agreed recognition and procedural agreement which will include determination of the respective bargaining units.

III. This recognition is accorded without prejudice to the bank's Legal rights in any action against it by any other trade union.

IV. All conditions of service of the Unappointed Staff of the Bank as at today remain valid until they are superceded, or altered by new agreements between the two parties",

Further to Government Notice No. 1876 of 3rd December, 1973, it is notified for general information that offices of the Federal Board of Inland Revenue have been opened in Ilorin, Maiduguri, Calabar and Sokoto. An office of the Board is therefore now established in every state capital throughout the Federation. The addresses of the new offices, each headed by an Inspector of Taxes, Grade I are:

Henceforth, the Ilorin office will be responsible for the tax affairs of companies with registered offices in the Kwara State, the Maiduguri office for those with registered offices in the North-Eastern State while the new offices in Calabar and Sokoto will handle the cases of companies with registered offices in the South-Eastern and North-Western States respectively. The companies concerned should therefore render their tax returns *et cetera* to the four new offices as appropriate and *not* to Ibadan, Kano, Port Harcourt and Kaduna offices respectively as before.

3. By the above arrangement, the Board's district offices outside the Lagos area will henceforth deal exclusively and only with the cases of companies with registered offices within the State in the capital of which they are situated, viz :

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT BURSARIES FOR THE TRAINING OF TEACHERS FOR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS IN NIGERIA, 1975-76

In pursuance of the Federal Government policy that teachers in all types of educational institutions in the country should be well-qualified, applications for bursaries are hereby invited from interested candidates, who have decided to take up teaching as a career.
