NOTARIES PUBLIC ACT (CAP. 141)

Notaries Fees of Office Order, 1980

Commencement : 1st January 1981

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection 3 of section 5 of the Notaries Public Act and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following Order :—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Notaries Fees of Office Order, 1980 and shall apply throughout the Federation.

(2) This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1981.

2. The Second Schedule to the Notaries Public Act is hereby amended by the deletion of the fees prescribed therein and the substitution thereof of the following—

Companies (Special Provisions) (Exemption) Order 1980

Commencement :

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 1 (3) of the Companies (Special Provisions) Act 1973, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, Shehu Usman Aliyu Shagari, President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria and Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federation, hereby make the following Order :-

Exemption from the requirements of Part X of 1968 No. 51.

1. The foreign companies listed in the first column of the Schedule to this Order, being engaged in the projects specified in the second column of the said Schedule, are hereby exempted from the provisions of Part X of the Companies Act 1968 for the periods respectively set against each company in the third column of that Schedule.

2. This Order may be cited as the Companies (Special Provisions) (Exemption) Order 1980.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the above Order but is intended to explain its effect)

The Order exempts certain foreign companies, which are only in Nigeria to undertake some major development projects, from the requirements of Part X of the Companies Act 1968. The periods for which the exemptions have been granted are as specified in the Order.

PRE-SHIPMENT INSPECTION OF IMPORTS ACT 1978

Pre-shipment Inspection of Imports (Exemption) Order 1980

Commencement : 1st April 1980

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 1 (5) (c) of the Pre-shipment Inspection of Imports Act 1978, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Minister of Finance, hereby make the following order :—

1. The goods prescribed in the Schedule hereunder shall, subject to such conditions as may be specified relative thereto, not be liable to pre-shipment inspection with respect to quality and quantity and price comparison thereof.

2. This order may be cited as the Pre-shipment Inspection of Imports (Exemption) Order 1980 and shall be deemed to have come into effect on 1st April 1980.

SCHEDULE

GOODS EXEMPTED FROM PRE-SHIPMENT INSPECTION

1. Industrial raw materials, but only where a certificate of clearance has been issued to the importer either generally or specially by the Federal Ministry of Industries.
2. Spare parts for motor vehicles.
3. Books and manuscripts.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Order provides that the goods listed in the Schedule thereto are exempted from pre-shipment inspection although in the case of industrial raw materials, such exemption will only be effective if a certificate of clearance has been issued to the importer by the Federal Ministry of Industries.
