PROTOCOL

ON CULTURAL CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS AND THE REPUBLIC OF SIERRA LEONE FOR 1972/1973

In accordance with the Agreement on Cultural Co-operation concluded in Freetown on 7th September, 1965 between the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone on 30th May, 1972 negotiations were conducted in Freetown on the Protocol of Cultural Co-operation between the two countries for 1972/73.

The Contracting Parties have reached agreement on the following Protocol of Cultural Co-operation.

I. THE SOVIET PARTY WILL ADMIT AND THE SIERRA LEONE PARTY WILL SEND: A IN 1972

- Forty students to study in higher and specialised secondary and technical educational establishments of the U.S.S.R. in conformity with the various curricula.
- Two students to study at the Vocational Technical Schools at the following specialities: metal-working, repairs of industrial electrical equipment, repairs of tractors and agricultural machines, repairs of cars, repairs of radios and Television sets. The age of candidates for study is not to exceed 25 years, and general education is to be not lower than the second stage of secondary school.
- Two officials of Sierra Leone Radio and Television to work in the U.S.S.R. as probationers for a period of two months on conditions which will be mutually agreed upon by the Parties.
- Two Sierra Leone Library officials to get acquainted with work of Libraries in the U.S.S.R. for a period of 14 days (2nd-3rd quarter.)

B IN 1973

- Forty students to study in higher and specialised secondary and Technical educational establishments of the U.S.S.R. in conformity with various curricula.
- Ten students to study at the Vocational Technical schools in the specialities mentioned in paragraph 2 of the Section "A IN 1972"
- Delegation consisting of two members to discuss question of further co-operation in the sphere of Radio and Television, for a period of 13 days.

II. THE SIERRA LEONE PARTY WILL ADMIT AND THE SOVIET PARTY WILL SEND:

- The following specialists:
 - Four teachers of Russian language fluent in English to work in secondary schools of Sierra Leone and to teach adult classes in the evenings for a period of 1-2 years;
 - One Russian language teacher to work in higher educational establishments in the Republic of Sierra Leone for a period of 3 years (for account of the Soviet Party).
 - Six doctors and one operating nurse to work under conditions of contracts in Sierra Leone Medical establishments for a period of 2 years (as replacement).
- A representative of the Ministry of Higher and Specialised Secondary Education to take part in the selection of students who are going to study in the U.S.S.R. at an agreed time for a period of 10 days.
- A group of variety, art and circus artists consisting of 25 members (4th quarter of 1972) and a group of original genre artists of Soviet Union Republics consisting of 25 members (in 1973) on tour to the Republic of Sierra Leone.
- Photo documentary circulating exhibition which is demonstrating development of the Soviet State after the Resolution under the motto "Friendship of Peoples of the U.S.S.R.—basis of the Soviet State" (up to 100 works) with further donation of exhibits as a gift (in 4th quarter 1972).
- Exhibition of circulating drawings and political placards (up to 60 works) with further donation of these as a gift to one of the Cultural Organisations of the Republic of Sierra Leone (2nd quarter 1973).
- Specialist Librarian to exchange experience and hold consultations for a period of 14 days (in 1973).
- Two operators to shoot a television film about the Republic of Sierra Leone for a period of 20 days (3rd quarter 1972).
- The Soviet Party shall send samples of text-books, literature for children as well as a sanitary-educational literature.

1.1. The Kishinev State University will continue its relations with the University of the Republic of Sierra Leone.

IV. Every year the Parties shall exchange one or two Honoured Scientists or Lecturers of Soviet Higher educational establishments and Sierra Leone Higher educational establishments such as the University of Sierra Leone/Fourah Bay College and Njala University College, Milton Margai Teachers' College, Union College Bunumbu, Freetown Teachers' College, Women Teachers' College, Port Loko, and Technical Institutes of Freetown and Kenema—to read lectures on agreed subjects at higher educational establishments and to get a first-hand acquaintance with Soviet and Sierra Leone systems of higher education, for a period of up to 3 weeks each.

V. The Parties will continue exchange of tape-recorded broadcasting and television programmes about life of their peoples, as well as documentary and feature programmes within the two years of the validity of this Protocol.

VI. The Soviet Party shall organise in 1972 and 1973 shows or premiere of Soviet films in Sierra Leone and shall send in 1972 one or two cinematographers for period of 10 days (expenses connected with stay in Sierra Leone are to be borne by the receiving party).

VII. The Parties shall support initiatives of public organisations directed at development of contacts between them.

VIII. In conformity with Clause 7 of the Agreement on Cultural Co-operation the Parties shall finish negotiations and shall sign before beginning of 1972/73 academic year Protocol on Equivalency of Diplomas and Scientific Degrees given in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Republic of Sierra Leone.

IX. Present Protocol does not exclude any other undertakings in the field of cultural exchange which may be carried out on the basis of mutual agreement between the interested bodies of the two Parties.

X. In absence of special provisions the financial questions connected with the implementation of the Present Protocol shall be regulated by the Parties on a reciprocal basis.

Done in Freetown on 30th May, 1972 in two copies, each in Russian and English, both texts being equally, authentic.

DETAILED PROGRAMME FOR THE DRAW OF LOTTERY TICKETS

1. Application of the Programme

This Programme provides for a special draw which will be held on the 4th January, 1973 to mark the Tenth Anniversary of the establishment of the Sierra Leone State Lottery. It shall be referred to hereinafter as the "Anniversary Special Draw". Also this programme provides for an ordinary draw which will be held on the 18th January, 1973 and shall be referred to hereinafter as the "Mid-Month Draw"—and which will be performed in the manner and under the conditions specified below:—

(1) Anniversary Special Draw No. 24/72 to be held on 4th January, 1973.

(2) Mid-Month Draw No. 1/73 to be held on 18th January, 1973.

2. The Lottery tickets for the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws

(a) For the anniversary special draw specified in this programme, the State Lottery shall issue 50,000 tickets to bearer (hereinafter referred to as tickets). The tickets issued for any of the series mentioned in Section 1 above will be marked in the places (on the face of each ticket) with serial numbers LL 00001 to LL50000 inclusive. The tickets will also be marked with the words "Tenth Anniversary Special Draw" to denote the draw in which the tickets are to participate.

(b) For the Mid-Month Draw specified in this programme, the State Lottery shall issue 50,000 tickets to bearer (hereinafter referred to as tickets). The tickets issued for any of the series mentioned in Section 1 above will be marked in the places (on the face of each ticket) with serial numbers A 00001 to A 50000 inclusive. The tickets will be marked with the words "Mid-Month Draw" also with the series number of the draw in which the tickets are to participate.

(c) In the programme a reference to a serial number shall be deemed to include a reference to any letter printed immediately before the digits forming the said serial number.

3. Participation in the draws

(a) All tickets issued for the anniversary special and mid-month draws specified in this programme will participate subject to the conditions specified in this programme. Separate draw will be held for each series..

Such ticket shall not entitle its holder to any right whatsoever other than the aforesaid right to receive the nominal price and in particular such ticket shall not entitle its holder to any compensation whatsoever for not including such ticket in the draw, or for any other reason.

(a) The ticket shall be sold by the State Lottery directly and/or through Selling Agents or Sellers appointed by the above-mentioned agents.

- (b) Two Consolation prizes of Le20 will be paid to the holders of the ticket the serial numbers of which are less by one or greater by one than the serial number of the ticket drawn under item (6A) of the 6th stage that wins 1st prize of Le1,000.

A Consolation prize of Le10 will be paid to the seller of the ticket which wins Le1,000.

7. *The making of the draws and the control thereof*

The draws will be made by the State Lottery and under its instructions. The draws will be made in public at the place and at the time to be specified in a public notice that will be published in the daily press.

8. *Deferment of the draws*

In the event of the State Lottery being unable due to circumstances over which it has no control to hold the anniversary special and mid-month draws or part thereof under this programme, such draws or part thereof shall be held at a place and time specified in a notice issued to the public by the State Lottery.

9. *Lottery Machines*

- (a) For making the anniversary special and mid-month draws under this programme, the State Lottery shall use, of its discretion from time to time—

- (i) The (five) rotary machines as specified in Section 10 herein or
(ii) The projecting machine as specified in Section 11 herein.

- (b) For making the anniversary and mid-month draws under this programme, the State Lottery shall use, as addition to the machines as mentioned in paragraph (a) above, an additional lottery box in the form of a draw hereinafter referred to as "Prize Box".

- (c) In the said draw the machine and prize box specified above shall be operated in accordance with instructions given by the representative of the State Lottery present at the draw.

10. *Rotary Machines—Manner of use*

- (a) The five rotary machines shall be marked consecutively with letters A, B, C, D and E.
- (b) Before the making of the draws under this programme, the balls as specified below shall be inserted in each of the rotary machines:—
- (1) In machine A—ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
- (2) In machine B—ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
- (3) In machine C—ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
- (4) In machine D—ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
- (5) In machine E—five balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 4 inclusive.
- (c) Every ball of the said balls bearing digits 6 or 9 as the case may be shall be marked with an additional sign i.e. a horizontal line drawn under the digit on the ball referred to above.

11. *Projecting Machine—Manner of use*

- (a) The projecting machine—which was manufactured for the State Lottery by the Royal Institute for International Research in Norway—shall consist of wheels on which digits as specified below are engraved. The machine shall consist of a device for the projection of the digits on the wheels as specified, in such a manner that not more than one digit on any wheel of the machine shall be projected at a time.
- (b) In order to execute the draw in its following stages i.e. first, second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth stages five wheels are to be inserted in the machine No. 1 and shall be marked consecutively with letters A, B, C, D and E as follows:—
- (1) Wheel 'A' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
- (2) Wheel 'B' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
- (3) Wheel 'C' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
- (4) Wheel 'D' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
- (5) Wheel 'E' on which digits 0 to 4 inclusive are engraved.

12. *The preparation of the 'Prize Box' for the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws.*

Before making the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws under this programme a number of cards equivalent to the number of the tickets that will be drawn at the 6th stages of the draw will be deposited in the Prize Box. On each such card there will be printed a sum equal to the amount of one of the prizes specified for the said stage of the draw in accordance with sections 6 and 6A (a) of this programme.

13. *The Manner in which the draws of the tickets for the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws shall be made under sections 6 and 6A (a) by the rotary machine as specified in section 3*

- (a) The winning numbers of the first stage of the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws shall be drawn by the picking up of one ball only from the rotary machine marked 'A' and the coming up of this ball shall be deemed to constitute the drawing at this stage, of all the tickets of that series the serial numbers of which end with the digit marked on the ball as drawn from the machine marked 'A'.
- (b) The winning numbers of the second stage of the anniversary special and mid-month draws shall be drawn by picking up of the ball as specified in paragraph (a) above and before commencing the draw of the second stage of the anniversary special and mid-month draws, the ball ejected from machine 'A' is re-inserted into that machine and ten balls marked consecutively with digits from 0 to 9 inclusive shall be deposited in machine marked 'B'.
- (c) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (b) the draw of the numbers corresponding to the second stage of the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws shall be held by picking up two balls, the first ball from machine 'A' and the second ball from machine 'B' to constitute the drawing of all tickets the serial numbers of which end with the two digits marked on the balls picked up as aforesaid.
- (d) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (c) the draw of the numbers corresponding to the third, fourth and fifth stages of the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws shall be held separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said third stage and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fourth stage—and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fifth stage; i.e. by picking up three balls and four balls respectively; the first ball from machine A, the second—from machine B, the third—from machine C and the fourth—from machine D, and the coming up of these three and four balls shall be deemed with respect to the relevant items of the third, fourth and fifth stages as the case may be, to constitute the drawing of all the tickets the serial numbers of which end with the digits marked on the ball picked up as aforesaid; that is—the digit marked on the ball drawn from the machine A shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from the machine B shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial numbers and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine C shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine D shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial numbers.
- (e) After the completion of the draws of each item of the third, fourth and fifth stages, the balls that were picked up from each rotary machines marked A, B, C, and D shall be returned to the machines from which they were removed before commencing the draws for the next stage.
- (f) The draw of the numbers of the sixth stage of the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws shall be made (separately for each number which has to be drawn in accordance with the items enumerated for this stage) by the picking up of one ball only from each of the rotary machines marked A, B, C, D, and E and the picking up simultaneously of one card only from the 'prize box'. The coming up of the five balls—one only from each of the rotary machines marked A, B, C, D, and E shall be deemed to be the draw of the tickets bearing the serial number conforming to the number formed by the digits marked on the five balls in such a way that the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine A shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the serial number of the said ticket and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine B shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine C shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine D shall be deemed to be the fourth

digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine E shall be deemed to be the fifth digit from the right side of the said serial number. The amount marked on the card drawn simultaneously from the prizes box as aforesaid.

- (g) After the picking up of the balls as specified in paragraph (f) above the ball drawn from each of the machines marked A, B, C, D, and E as aforesaid, shall be returned to the machine from which it was drawn before beginning the draw for the next item of the stage.
- (h) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (g) above, in the event that the balls drawn in accordance with the said paragraph from machines A, B, C, D and E all bear the digit '0', it shall be deemed that the ticket bearing number 50000 was drawn in accordance with that paragraph.
- (i) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section 13 in the event of more than one ball being picked up from any of the machines A, B, C, D and E at the making of the draws specified in this programme, including the separate draw of tickets at the 6th stage, the picking up of all balls for this item of the stage of the draws in question shall be null and void and all balls so drawn shall be returned into the machine from which they were drawn and the draw for this item shall be recommenced from the beginning.
- (j) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section, in the event of one or more of the balls being broken while a draw is being made for any item of a stage of the stages of the draw specified in this programme the draw shall be cancelled and the broken ball or balls shall be replaced by others bearing the same digit and the draw for this item shall be recommenced from the beginning.
- (k) The provision of this section 13 shall not apply in the event of the State Lottery deciding under section 9 (a) hereof to use the projecting machine referred to in sub-paragraph (ii) thereof.
14. *The manner in which the draw of the tickets for the anniversary special and mid-month draws shall be made under section 6(a) by the projecting machine as specified in section 5(a) (ii).*
- (a) The winning number of the first stage of the anniversary special and mid-month draws shall be drawn by the employment of wheel 'A' only of the machine No. 1 and the digit that will be projected from the wheel marked 'A' shall be deemed to constitute the drawing at this stage, of all the tickets of that series, the serial numbers of which end with the digit projected from wheel 'A'.
- (b) Immediately after the projection of the digit as specified in paragraph (a) above, the machine No. 1 shall be removed from the projecting machine and substituted by machine No. 2 with its set of five wheels marked with letters 'A' to 'E' will be engraved with digits 0-4 and the others 0-9.
- (c) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (b) above, the draw of the numbers corresponding to the second stage of the anniversary special and mid-month draws shall be held by the employment of wheels, 'A' and 'B' only of the projecting machine and the two digits that will be projected from the wheels A and B shall be deemed to constitute the drawing of all tickets the serial numbers of which end with the two digits projected as aforesaid, that is—the digit projected from wheel 'A', shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from wheel 'B', shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number.
- (d) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (c) above the draw of the numbers corresponding to the third, fourth and fifth stages of these anniversary special and mid-month draws shall be held separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said third stage and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fourth stage and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fifth stage; by the employment of wheels A, B, C and D only of the projecting machine and the three and four digits that will be projected from the wheels A, B, C and D shall be deemed with respect to relevant items of the third, fourth and fifth stages as the case may be, to constitute the drawing of all tickets the serial numbers of which end with the three and four digits projected as aforesaid, that is—the digit projected from wheel 'A' shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from wheel 'B' shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number of the digit projected from wheel 'C' shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from wheel 'D' shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial numbers.

(e) After the completion of the draws of each item of the third, fourth and fifth stages of the anniversary special and mid-month draws prescribed in paragraph (d) above, the draw of the numbers of the 6th stage of the anniversary special and mid-month draws shall be made separately for each number which has to be drawn in accordance with all the wheels A, B, C, D and E and the picking up simultaneously of one card from the 'Prize Box' the five digits that will be projected from the wheels A, C, B, D and E shall be deemed to be the draw of the ticket bearing the serial number conforming to the number formed by the digit projected from the five wheels in such a way that the digit projected from wheel 'A' shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the serial number of the said ticket and the digit projected from wheel 'B' shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit projected from wheel 'C' shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit projected from wheel 'D' shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit projected from wheel 'E' shall be deemed to be the fifth digit from the right side of the said serial number. The amount marked on the card drawn simultaneously from the prizes box as aforesaid.

(f) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (e) above, in the event that all the digits projected from the wheels A, B, C, D and E shall be '0' it shall be deemed that the ticket bearing serial number 50000 was drawn in accordance with that paragraph.

(g) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section 14 in the event of a number being unclearly projected on a digit or digits of such number shall be missing, at any time of any stage of the stages of the draws specified in the programme, including the separate draw of tickets at the sixth stage, such projection shall be null and void and the projecting machine shall be re-employed for the making of the draw of this item.

(h) The provisions of this section 14 shall not apply in the event of State Lottery deciding under section 9 (a) hereof to use the rotary machine referred to in sub-paragraph (i) thereof.

15. *The recording and publication of the results of the draw*

(a) The number of each ticket drawn and the prize appertaining thereto shall be recorded in a written statement at the conclusion of the anniversary special and mid-month draws under this programme and such statement shall be signed by the representative of the State Lottery present at the time of the draw and only such statement shall bind the State Lottery.

(b) The results of the draw shall be published as soon as possible in a special notice to be issued by the State Lottery.

(c) The holders of tickets shall check the numbers of their tickets against the list of numbers published in the said notice, in order to verify whether the numbers on their tickets correspond with the winning numbers.

16. *The payment of prizes*

(a) The payment of the amount of the prize to the bearer of the ticket whose number is drawn at the anniversary special and mid-month draws specified in this programme shall be made upon the bearer's request and against presentation and surrender of the ticket, as from the third day after the holding of the draw in which the winning ticket was drawn but not later than 180 days from the date of the draw. Payment of prizes shall be effected at the time and place specified in the public notice announcing the results of the draw which shall be published by the State Lottery as aforesaid.

(b) The State Lottery shall not be obliged to pay the prize if it was not claimed as provided in paragraph (a) above.

(c) The State Lottery shall not be obliged to pay the prize for a ticket the number of which was drawn in the draw if such ticket is lost, destroyed or obliterated or torn or cut or holed or its serial number or the series number of the draw in which it participated is not sufficiently clear at the time the ticket is presented for payment.

(d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section 16, if the Managing Director of the State Lottery has reason to believe that a ticket presented for payment has been lost or stolen, payment of any prize to which the bearer would be entitled under this programme, may be withheld for a reasonable period in order to permit any person who claim that he has a better right to the ticket than the bearer, to institute legal action and if such person initiates any such action within the said period, the State Lottery shall withhold payment until the matter has been finally decided by a competent Court.

17. Income Tax

The prizes are not liable to Income Tax.

18. Licence to hold the draw

The draws are held in accordance with the terms of a licence issued under section 3 of the Control of Betting and Lotteries Act, 1962.

19. The Address of the State Lottery

ORGANISATION FOR PLANNING

COMPOSITION AND TERMS OF REFERENCE OF PLANNING BODIES

In accordance with Government's policy of directing economic development of the country through development plans, a Central Planning Unit has been established, with assistance from UNDP, in the Ministry of Development. The Unit is engaged at present in making sectoral and macro-economic studies preparatory to formulation of a comprehensive medium-term plan. It will also be assisting the Ministry of Development in the preparation of the annual Development Budget and the Sectoral Ministries in preparation of development projects and in instituting appropriate procedures for appraisal of progress on them. Planning and Project Formulation Units have already been created in two Ministries and are proposed to be established in all the important sectoral Ministries.

In order to provide overall direction on the goals, objectives, priorities and strategies of the national development plans, as well as to formulate policies and programmes for effective plan implementation, Government have decided to set up a National Planning Council. The Council will be headed by His Excellency the President and will have the following as its Members:—

The Vice-President and Prime Minister
The Minister of Finance
The Minister of Development
The Minister of Agriculture and Natural Resources
The Minister of Trade and Industry
The Minister of Education
The Minister of Health
The Minister of Works
The Minister of Lands and Mines
Governor, Bank of Sierra Leone

The Council will have the following terms of reference:—

- (i) to indicate the basic goals and objectives of planning;
- (ii) to decide for each plan, the macro-economic variables, such as the rate of economic growth and the magnitudes of investment, domestic savings and foreign aid, as well as the resource allocations among programmes and projects and the physical accomplishment targets;
- (iii) to provide all other guidelines on economic and social policies and on programmes and projects, which are needed by the planners for plan formulation;

- (iv) to approve the plans before they are presented to the Parliament and the public;
- (v) to decide on monetary, fiscal, foreign trade and other economic policies needed for mobilization of resources for effective implementation of the plans or for direction of the economy in keeping with plan objectives;
- (vi) to review progress of the plans from time to time and decide on changes in them, based on the reviews or changes in the domestic or international situation.

The Council shall be assisted by an Inter-Ministerial Committee of Permanent Secretaries, headed by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Development. The principal functions of the Committee will be:—

- (i) to examine with a view to advising the National Planning Council, all papers relating to formulation and implementation of the national development plan;
- (ii) to decide on proposals relating to less important policies, programmes and projects, in case of which reference to the National Planning Council is not necessary, but interministerial action is involved;
- (iii) to serve as the principal executive organ for inter-ministerial co-ordination in formulation and implementation of development programmes.

Sub-Committees and Inter-Ministerial or Technical Working Groups will be set up from time to time as considered necessary by Government.

In order to associate non-official interests, such as business industry and labour, as well as distinguished scholars, scientists and social workers with the planning process, an Advisory Planning Body is proposed to be constituted.
