(P.N. No. 66 of 1974)THE PLANT PHYTOSANITARY (IMPORT RESTRICTION) NOTICE,
1976

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Rule 9 of the Plant Phytosanitary Import Rules, 1974, I hereby declare, with the approval of the Minister of Agriculture and Natural Resources, that the conditions for the importation of the plants listed in the Schedule shall be as set out in this Notice.

For the purposes of this Notice, vegetative material, seeds and fruits of plants shall be deemed to include those which are fresh, dried, frozen or chilled and shall not include those which are cooked, or pickled and imported in bottles or cans.

(i) A number of workpeople who registered for employment are known to be "not unemployed". They register with the hope of obtaining more regular or more remunerative employment.

(ii) Maritime Pool:—Number awaiting sea-going employment = 6,859; this figure consists of the following:—

(a) Persons who have been unemployed for over three weeks.

(b) Persons who have recently returned from a voyage and who should rest for three weeks before being eligible for another voyage. These unemployed workers are usually engaged on casual jobs as stevedores while awaiting sea-going employment.

(iii) Articled Seamen's Pool:—Number awaiting sea-going employment = 618; this figure consists of persons who were unemployed at the date referred to above.

(iv) With effect from January, 1973, this table has been revised by classifying the occupations for which people registered in accordance with the International Standard Classification of Occupations. The figure for Apprentices who normally are classified under a separate Group has been shown in this table under the occupational group for which they registered but separately. The figure for 'Boys' in previous statistics has been included in the figure for 'male' in the current statistics.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR MINEWORKERS—4TH QUARTER, 1975

The Consumer Price Index for Mineworkers for 4th quarter, 1975 was 183.5 as compared to 184.4 for 3rd quarter, 1975. This shows a decrease of 0.9 points or about 0.49 per cent over the previous period.

Almost in line with the 4th quarter, 1975 Consumer Price Index for Freetown, the most important decrease among the major group item was for "Food and Drinks" while an appreciable increase was noted for "Housing". The index (1961=100) measures the average change in prices of a fixed list of goods and services known as "Market Basket" which represents the purchases of the low income African families in the Mining Areas of Marampa, Yengema and Tongo Field. Separate indices are computed for Marampa and the Diamond Mining Areas (Yengema and Tongo Field combined). These are combined into a single index weighted in proportion to the number of workers employed in each area.

Food and Drinks:—The index for this group dropped by 10.3 points or 4.6 per cent over the previous quarter consequent to considerable drop in the average prices of dried bonga, dried snapper, fresh fish, oranges, onions and pounded groundnut coupled with moderate drop in the average prices of rice and coffee. This drop was however offset by a huge increase in the average prices of small pepper and tinned tomato puree and moderate increase in the average prices of jacato, beef (steak) and palm oil.

Housing:—The housing index rose by 12.9 points or 7.5 per cent over the previous quarter as a result of an increase in the average prices of firewood and kerosene.

Clothing:—A substantial increase of 4.9 points or 3.3 per cent was recorded due to some increases in the average prices of men's singlet, drill materials and tailor charges for sewing men's garments (shorts). There was however a small drop in the average prices of headties lappas, ladies dresses and children's wear.

Miscellaneous:—An overall drop of 2.3 points or 1.6 per cent was noted consequent to a decrease in the average prices of tobacco leaves and kola nuts. A small increase in the average prices of soda soap was however noted.
