INCREASE IN THE PRICE OF ROBUSTA COFFEE BEANS

The Ministry of Trade and Industry wishes to announce that with immediate effect the producer price of Robusta Coffee Beans is increased from 46 cents per pound (Le1,030.40 per ton) to 60 cents per pound (Le1,344.00 per ton).

Although the buying season does not open until the 1st February, 1977, this information is given to farmers so that they may know the correct price to be obtained from any buying agent offering to purchase coffee beans from them before the official opening date.

INCREASE IN THE PRICE OF COCOA

It is announced from the Ministry of Trade and Industry that with immediate effect that is 30th October, 1976 the producer price for Cocoa is increased as follows:—

Frcm 44 cents per pound or Le985.60 per ton

to

54 cents per pound or Le1,209.60 per ton

Farmers will note that this reflects an increase of 10 cents per pound; or Le224 per ton;

The current Buying Agents' Commission of 48 cents is raised to 50 cents.

All Buying Agents are again reminded that it will be an offence to offer or pay anything less than the above quoted pice to farmers, and any information of such under payment reaching the Sierra Leone Produce Marketing Board will result in the withdrawal of licences from the Buying Agents concerned.

Background

The African Training and Research Centre in Administration for Development (CAFRAD) was founded through out the for Development (CAFRAD) was founded through out the initiative of the Government of Morocco supported in the General Conference of UNESCO by ten African States covering the major regions of the Continent. Its legal existence rests upon an agreement signed on 13th May 1964, between UNESCO and Morocco. The first meeting of the Governing Board in July 1964 determined CAFRAD's work and objectives and its general organizational framework. In December 1967 a Permanent Multilateral Agreement was signed by eleven Member States. eleven Member States.

Legally, the Centre is an "African regional institution" under international law, open to the membership of all African States and located in Tangier, Morocco.

By June 1976 the number of States that had joined CAFRAD totalled thirty: Algeria, Botswana, Burundi, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Fgypt, Gabon, The Gambia, Ghana, Ivory Coast, Kenya, Liberia, Libya, Mauritania, Morocco, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, Swaziland, Tanzania, Togo, Tunisia, Uganda, Upper Volta, Zaira, Zambia Volta, Zaire, Zambia.

In 1971, all the parties concerned have signed the UNDP Project of Assistance to CAFRAD for the first phase and in 1975 for the second phase. The Member States are committed to completely taking over the financial responsibility for the Centre from the UNDP by December 1978, and to this effect have greatly increased their financial contributions from 1975.

Functions of CAFRAD, as defined by the 1967 Agreement, are as follows:

to undertake, promote and co-ordinate comparative studies and research on administrative problems connected with social and economic development in Africa;

to organize scientific meetings, seminars and in-service training courses for high-ranking officials from the public and private sectors in African countries who plays a signi-ficant role in development;

to compile, analyse and disseminate documentation on the structure, organization and administrative methods of to act as host and as a scientific liason body for the particular benefit of institutions and schools of administration, universities and, more generally, any other agencies whose activities come within the scope of the competence of the Centre.

Recent developments and the expressed needs of African Governments require that CAFRAD shall embark on a dynamic programme of providing at Tangier, and throughout Africa, short high-level training and staff development seminars for senior administrators and teachers of development administration, as well as expand its research, consultancy, documenta-tion and publication activities in order to give support to, and supplement the work of, national public administration instructions.

The major objective of CAFRAD is to provide assistance to the African States in solving their practical administrative problems through training, research consultancy and documentation, in accordance with their needs and wishes. CAFRAD has developed, with the advice of African Governments, a programme for 1974–73 which emphasizes the management aspect of the public sector activity -that is on an inter-disciplinary and innovative approach to the problems of com-bining resources and technology and action programmes leading to rapid economic and social development. In pre-senting its programmes CAFRAD co-operates, at the regional sub-regional and national levels, with other interested international organizations and agencies such as the ECA. OAU and the ADB, and particularly with the national training institutions

Under the CAFRAD Agreement the Governing Board is composed of all Member States; organizations and institutions supporting its work are represented at the meetings of the Governing Board as appropriate.

Responsibilities:

SUMMARY OF BENEFITS ADDITIONAL TO SALARY AVAILABLE TO HOLDERS OF CAREER APPOINTMENTS

1. Dependency Allowance:

\$400 per annum for a spouse and \$450 per annum for each child provided those concerned qualify as being financially dependent upon the staff member. If the allowance in respect of a spouse is not paid a dependency allowance at the rate of \$200 per annum may be paid in respect of a parent or a brother or sister, subject to the same condition of financial dependency upon the staff member.

2. Education Grant:

Under certain conditions an education grant is paid up to a maximum of \$1,500 per child annually, as well as expenditure on children's education travel to and from the home country or other permissible place of education.

3. Pension Fund:

The staff member will become a full participant in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund which involves a contribution by the staff member of 7% of his pensionable renumeration (presently established at 120% of the gross salary) with the Organization contributing 14%.

1. Application of the Programme

This programme provides for a Special Draw which will be held on the 4th January, 1977 to mark the fourteenth Anniversary of the establishment of the Sierra Leone State Lottery. It shall be referred to hereinafter as the "Anniversary Special Draw". Also this programme provides for an Ordinary Draw which will be held on the 18th January, 1977 and shall be referred to hereinafter as the Mid-Month Draw" and which will be performed in the manner and under the conditions specified below:

- Anniversary Special Draw No. 24/76 to be held on 4th January, 1977.
- (2) Mid-Month Draw No. 1/77 to be held on 18th January, 1977.
- 2. The Lottery tickets for the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month Draws:
 - (a) For the Anniversary Special Draws specified in this programme, the State Lottery shall issue 50,000 tickets to bearer (hereinafter referred to as tickets). The tickets

- issued for any of the series mentioned in Section 1 above will be marked in the places (on the face of each ticket) with serial numbers LL000001 to LL050000 inclusive. The tickets will also be marked with the words "Fourteenth Anniversary Special Draw" to denote the draw in which the tickets are to participate.
- (b) For the Mid-Month Draw specified in this programme, the State Lottery shall issue 50,000 tickets to bearer (hereinafter referred to as tickets). The tickets issued for any of the series mentioned in Section 1 above will be marked in the places (on the face of each ticket) with serial numbers A000001 to A050000 inclusive. The tickets will be marked with the words "Mid-Month Draw" also with the series number of the draw in which the tickets are to participate.
- (c) In the programme a reference to a serial number shall be deemed to include a reference to any letter printed immediately before the digits forming the said serial

Participation in the Draws

- (a) All tickets issued for the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws specified in this programme will participate subject to the conditions specified in this programme. Separate draw will be held for each series.

Such ticket shall not entitle its holder to any right whatsoever other than the aforesaid right to receive the nominal price and in particular such ticket shall not entitle its holder to any compensation whatsoever for not including such a ticket in the draw, or for any other reason.

The sale of tickets and their prices

- (a) The ticket shall be sold by the State Lottery directly and/or through Selling Agents or Sellers appointed by the above-mentioned agents.
- (b) The price of each ticket shall be:-

- (b) For making the Anniversary and Mid-month draws under this programme, the State Lottery shall use, as addition to the machines as mentioned in paragraph (a) above, an additional lottery box in the form of a draw hereinafter referred to as "Prize Box".
- (c) In the said draw the machine and prize box specified above shall be operated in accordance with instructions given by the representatives of the State Lottery present at the draw.

Rotary Machines-Manner of Use

- (a) The five rotary machines shall be marked consecutively with letters, A, B, C, D and E.
- (b) Before the making of the draws under this programme, the balls as specified below shall be inserted in each of the rotary machines:-
 - (1) In machine A,-ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
 - (2) In machine B-ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
 - (3) In machine C-ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
 - (4) In machine D—ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
 - (5) In machine E-five balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 4 inclusive.
- (c) Every ball of the said balls bearing digit 6 or 9 as the case may be shall be marked with an additional sign, i.e. a horizontal line drawn under the digit on the ball referred to above.

11. Projecting Machine-Manner of Use

(a) The projecting machine—which was manufactured for the State Lottery by the Royal Institute for International Research in Norway—shall consist of wheels on which digits as specified below are engraved. The machine shall consist of a device for the projection of the digits on the wheel as specified, in such a manner the digits on the wheel as specified, in such a manner that not more than one digit on any wheel of the machine shall be projected at a time.

- (b) In order to execute the draw in its following stages, i.e. first, second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth stages five wheels are to be inserted in the machine No. 1 and shall be marked consecutively with letters A, B, C, D, and E as follows:—
 - (1) Wheel 'A' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
 - (2) Wheel 'B' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
 - (3) Wheel 'C' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
 - (4) Wheel 'D' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
 - (5) Wheel 'E' on which digits 0 to 4 inclusive are engraved.
- 12. The Preparation of the 'Prize Box for the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws

Before making the Anniversary Special and Mid-month draws under this programme a number of cards equivalent to the number of the tickets that will be drawn at the 6th stages of the draw will be deposited in the prizes box. On each such card there will be printed a sum equal to the prizes specified for the said stage of the draw in accordance with section 6 and 6A (a) of this programme.

- 13. The Manner in which the draw of the tickets for the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws shall be made under section 6 and 6A (a) by the rotary machine as specified in section 3.
 - (a) The winning numbers of the first stage of the Anniversary Special and Mid-Month draws shall be drawn by the picking up of one ball only from the rotary machine marked 'A' and the coming up of this ball shall be deemed to constitute the drawing at this stage, of all the tickets of that series the serial numbers of which end with the digit marked on the ball as drawn from the machine marked 'A'.
 - (b) The winning numbers of the second stage of the Anniversary Special and Mid-month draws shall be drawn by picking up of the ball as specified in paragraph (a) above and before commencing the draw of the second stage of the Anniversary Special and Mid-month draws, the ball ejected from machine 'A' is re-inserted into that machine and ten balls marked consecutively with digits from 0 to 9 inclusive shall be deposited in machine marked 'B'.
 - (c) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (b) the draw of the numbers corresponding to the second stage of the Anniversary Special and Mid-month draws shall be held by picking up two balls, the first ball from machine 'A' and the second ball from machine 'B' to constitute the drawing of all tickets the serial numbers of which end with the two digits marked on the balls picked up as aforesaid.
 - (d) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (c) the draw of the numbers corresponding to the third, fourth and fifth stages of the anniversary special and mid-month draws shall be held separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said third stage and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fourth stage—and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fifth stage i.e. by picking up three balls and four balls respectively the first ball from machine A, the second—from machine B, the third—from machine C and the fourth—from machine D, and the coming up of these three and four balls shall be deemed with respect to the relevant item of the third, fourth and fifth stages as the case may be, to constitute the drawing of all the tickets the serial numbers of which end with the digit marked on the ball picked up as aforesaid, that is—the digit marked on the ball drawn from the machine A shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from the right side of the said serial numbers the digit marked on the ball drawn from the right side of the said serial number to the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine C shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine

- D shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial numbers.
- (e) After the completion of the draws of each item of the third, fourth and fifth stages, the balls that were picked up from such rotary machine marked A, B, C, and D shall be returned to the machines from which they were removed before commencing the draws for the next stage.
- (f) The draw of the numbers of the sixth stage of the anniversary special and mid-month draws shall be made (separately for each number which has to be drawn in accordance with the items enumerated for this stage) by the picking up of one ball only from each of the rotary machines marked A, B, C, D, and E and the picking up simultaneously of one card only from the "Prize Box". The coming up of the five balls—one only from each of the rotary machines marked A, B, C, D and E shall be deemed to be the draw of the tickets bearing the serial number conforming to the number formed by the digits marked on the five balls in such a way that the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine A shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the serial number of the said ticket and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine B shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine C shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine D shall be deemed to be the first side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine E, shall be deemed to be the fifth digit from the right side of the said serial number. The amount marked on the card drawn simultaneously from the prizes box as aforesaid.
- (g) After the picking up of the balls as specified in para (f) above the ball drawn from each of the machines marked A, B, C, D and E as aforesaid, shall be returned to the machine from which it was drawn before beginning the draw for the next item of the stage.
- (h) Notwithstanding anything contained in para (g) above, in the event that the balls drawn in accordance with the said paragraph from machine A, B, C, D and E all bear the digit 'O', it shall be deemed that the ticket bearing number 50000 was drawn in accordance with that paragraph.
- (i) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section 13 in the event of more than one ball being picked up from any of the machines A, B, C, D, and E at the making of the draws specified in this programme, including the separate draw of tickets at the 6th stage, the picking up of all balls for this item of the stage of the draws in question shall be null and void and all balls so drawn shall be returned into the machine from which they were drawn and the draw for this item shall be recommenced from the beginning.

- (d) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (c) above the draw of the numbers corresponding the third, fourth and fifth stages of the anniversary special and mid-month draws shall be held separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said third stage and immediately afterwards—separately for each item enumerated in the said fourth stage and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fifth stage; by the employment of wheels A., B, C, and D only of the projecting machine and the three and four digits that will be projected from the wheels A,B, C and D shall be deemed with respect to relevant items of the third, fourth and fifth stages as the case may be, to constitute the drawing of all tickets the serial numbers of which end with the three and four digit projected as aforesaid, that is—the digit projected from wheel 'A' shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from wheel 'B' shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from wheel 'C' shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from wheel 'D' shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial numbers.
- (e) After the completion of the draws of each item of the third, fourth and fifth stages of the anniversary special and mid-month draws prescribed in paragraph (d) above, the draw of the number of the 6th stages of the anniversary special nad mid-month draws shall be made separately for each number which has to be drawn in accordance with all the wheels A, B, C, D and E and the picking up simultaneously of one card from the 'Prize Box' the five digits that will be projected from the wheels A, B, C, D and E shall be deemed to be the draw of the ticket bearing the serial number conforming to the number formed by the digit projected from the five wheels in such a way that the digit projected from 'wheel 'A' shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the serial number of the said ticket and the digit projected from wheel 'B' shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit projected from wheel 'C' shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit projected from wheel 'D' (shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit projected from wheel 'D' (shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial number.) The amount marked on the card drawn simultaneous ly from the prizes box as aforesaid.
- (f) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (e) above, in the event that all the digits projected from the wheels A, B, C, D and E shall be 0, it shall be deemed that the ticcket bearing serial number 50000 was drawn in accordance with that paragraph.

- (g) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section 14 in the event of a number being unclearly projected on a digit or digits of such number shall be missing, at any time of any stage of the stages of the draws specified in the programme, including the separate draw of tickets at the sixth stage, such projection shall be null and void and the projecting machine shall be re-employed for the making of the draw of this item.

The Mineworkers Consumer Price Index has since its inception been based on prices collected in the three major Mining Areas of the country, i.e. Marampa, Yengema and Tongo Field. Starting with the third Quarter 1976, the Mineworkers CPI will no longer reflect price changes in Marampa. This has been made necessary by the temporary closure of the SLDC Mines at Marampa. The present index will therefore not be strickly comparable with the former series.

For the purposes of comparison therefore, the Central Statistics Office gives below the CPI for the Diamond Mining Area only. (i.e. excluding Marampa Mines).

The Consumer Price Index for 3rd quarter 1976 for Mineworkers of the Diamond Mining Areas—Yengema and Tongo Field was 187.8 as compared with 181.7 for the 2nd quarter 1976 for the same areas. This shows an increase of 6.1 points or 3.2 per cent over the previous quarter.

The most important increase among the major group items was for Housing which increased by 7.1 per cent over the previous period. The index (1961=100) indicates the average movement of retail process of selected items known as "market basket." This market basket represents the purchases of the low income African families in the mining areas of Marampa, Yengema and Tongo Field. Separate indices are computed for Marampa and the Diamond Areas (Yengema and Tongo Field combined). These are combined into a single index weighted in proportion to the number of workers employed in each area.

Food and Drinks: The index for this group rose 6.9 points or about 3.0 per cent over the previous period. This increase resulted consequent to the average price increases of onions, rice and cassava. Contrary however, there was a decrease in the average prices of small pepper, tinned tomato puree, pounded groundnut and dried bonga. Foofoo and soft drinks were among few of the items whose prices remained constant.

This is the only index this quarter that rose considerably. It increased 13.2 points or 7.1 per cent. This was mainly due to appreciable price increases in spoons, kettles (buckets), medium size drinking glasses, firewood and locally made mattresses. Prices of points, chairs, putty and electricity charges remained constant.

 Contrary to the high increase noticed last quarter, there was a slight increase of 1.6 points or 1.0 per cent due to small average price increases in ladies' and men's plastic sandals and drill materials.

This group index rose 4.6 points or 3.1 per cent over the last quarter. This increase resulted consequent to price increases in cough mixture (liquifruta) and transportation charges. Prices of phensic however declined while items like laxative (S'S'. Pills) union dues, church dues, school fees etc. remained unchanged.
