(5) The average mass/weight of ten like units of bread selected at random from a batch derived from the same source shall not be less than 0,5 % of the relative standard mass/weight prescribed herein for a whole unit or a pre-packed sliced unit.

***Restrictions and resale of bread.***

5. A person who purchases bread for resale shall not sell such bread if, at the time of the resale, the mass of the bread is less than the standard mass prescribed in Regulation 4 (1) to an extent greater than that set out in Regulation 7.

***Pre-packed Sliced Bread.***

6. The sale or purchase of any pre-packed sliced bread shall be deemed to be a sale or purchase of a whole unit of any applicable standard mass prescribed in Regulation 4 (1) of these regulations.

***Permissible Bread Tolerances.***

7. The bread units shall have a permissible excess tolerance of 10% and a deficiency tolerance of 4.5% for each unit of bread, provided that Regulation 4 (5) is complied with.

***Revocation of legal Notice No. 98 of 1980.***

8. Legal Notice No.98 of 1980 is hereby revoked.

LEGAL NOTICE NO. 129 OF 2012

THE METROLOGY ACT 1991  
(Act No. 12 of 1991)

THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES (SALE OF BREAD)  
REGULATIONS, 2012.

In exercise of powers conferred by Section 43 of the Metrology Act No. 12 1991, the Minister of Commerce, Industry and Trade hereby makes the following regulations.

***Citation and Commencement.***

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Sale of Bread) Regulations, 2012.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day of publication in the Gazette.

***Interpretation.***

2. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires-

"bread" means any wheaten or rye product which is sold as or under the name of bread but does not include fancy bread, that has been baked in a pan with supporting sides exceeding 50% of the height of the loaf;

"fancy bread" means bread containing currents, raisins, cinnamon or other fruits and spices, and includes bread rolls, French rolls and twists, Portuguese loaves, milk loaves, cake, confectionery, sandwiches, whole wheat bread and bread of the kind known as German rye bread;

***Non-application of these Regulations.***

3. These regulations shall not apply to fancy bread.

***Prescribed units of mass and permissible tolerances.***

4. (1) Subject to regulation 5 below, a person shall not make and sell any bread except in whole units of 400g, 500g, 600g, 700g, 800g, 1.2kg and 1.6k.

(2) A loaf shall be individually wrapped and bear a label of the net mass/weight, name and the address of the baker in a plastic bag with a wall thickness of 25 to 30 micrometers, except when it is sold from the premises at which it is baked, in which case it need not be individually wrapped and marked with a net mass/weight if it is displayed in close proximity to a sign clearly indicating the type of bread and its net mass/weight.

(3) The quantities of 1.2kg and 1.6kg shall be, exempt from mass individual labelling required in sub-regulation (2); however a sign posted in close proximity shall clearly display the type of bread and its mass.

(4) The mass of an individual unit of bread may deviate from the standard mass prescribed herein, in deficiency or in excess to the extent set out in Regulation 7.
