SENIOR HOUSE OFFICERS—MULAGO HOSPITAL, KAMPALA

TANGANYIKA GOVERNMENT TIED BURSARIES 1963/64
ACADEMIC YEAR

1. Applications are invited for bursaries for post-secondary courses for the academic year 1963/64. Details of the types of awards available and of the conditions which will apply are given below.

Eligibility.

2. Candidates must be citizens of Tanganyika and must possess a Cambridge Higher School Certificate (or equivalent qualification) in subjects appropriate to the course which they wish to undertake or must be sitting for the Cambridge Higher School Certificate (or an equivalent examination) in appropriate subjects during 1962. Candidates who fall within the definition of "African" set out in the Public Service Commission Regulations will be given preference.

Conditions.

3. All bursaries will be "Tied", and candidates will be required to enter into an agreement binding them to take up an appointment in the Civil Service (or in the Local Government Service or Unified Teaching Service), if they are called upon to do so, on the completion of their training and to remain in the Service for a specified minimum period (three years in the case of a candidate undertaking a course lasting not more than a year and five years in the case of a candidate undertaking a course lasting more than a year). Candidates who are already members of the Civil Service will be required to enter into an agreement binding them to remain in the service for a specified minimum period (calculated as above) following the completion of their training.

4. Candidates who apply under the terms of this notice may be offered bursaries or scholarships put at the disposal of the Tanganyika Government by other donors, instead of Tanganyika Government Bursaries.

5. The administrative terms to apply to Civil Servants who are awarded bursaries will be published in a Staff Circular shortly. In the case of other candidates the Tanganyika Government Bursaries will cover the full cost of the course, including fees, travel and maintenance, subject to a contribution from the candidate and/or his parents or guardians, which will be assessed by the Ministry of Education and Information Services.

- The Diploma of the Royal Institute of British Architects.
- The Diploma of the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors in Land or Quantity Surveying.
- The Domestic Science Teacher's Certificate of the University of Manchester.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TRANSPORT AND GENERAL WORKERS' UNION (T) AND THE TANGANYIKA CASHEWNUIT COMPANY LIMITED NEGOTIATED BEFORE MR. O. A. WASHOKERA, ASSISTANT LABOUR OFFICER (T.G.), CONCILIATOR APPOINTED BY THE LABOUR COMMISSIONER UNDER SECTION 3 (1) OF THE ORDINANCE

We, the accredited representatives of the Transport and General Workers' Union (Tanganyika) and Tanganyika Cashewnut Company Limited, being parties to a trade dispute reported to the Labour Commissioner by the Transport and General Workers' Union (Tanganyika) and having agreed on to the twenty-fourth day of March, 1962, on the terms set out below in respect of the issues reported as being in dispute, now in witness thereof have appended our signatures hereto:—

Terms and Conditions of Agreement.

1. *Operative Date and Duration of Agreement:* It is mutually agreed that this Agreement shall come into force on the first day of January, 1962, and remain in force for a period of one year. Thereafter this Agreement may be terminated by giving one month's notice of such intention by either parties.

2. *Recognition:* The Company agrees to recognize the Transport and General Workers' Union (Tanganyika) as the sole bargaining body for and on behalf of the workers employed by the Company.

3. *Leave with Pay:* The Company agrees to grant 6 (six) days leave with pay per annum to all employees provided such employee has worked 245 days in any calendar year before so qualifying for leave with pay.

4. *Medical Facilities and Sick Leave:* The Company agrees to provide its workers free hospital fees (which is Sh. 1/-) at the Tanganyika Government Hospital and Health Services in Dar es Salaam when they fall sick. The Company further agrees to grant leave with pay to all employees provided such sick pay shall be made on production by the employee of a medical certificate signed by the attending doctor that the employee is excused from duty on medical grounds.

The grant of sick pay shall be maintained as hereunder:—

(a) Employees admitted in hospital as in-patients shall be granted full normal pay per day for a period not exceeding 5 days and thereafter will receive half of the normal rate for the next maximum total period of 25 days. Provided that an employee in this category shall be entitled to sick leave with pay for a period not exceeding 30 days during the period covered by this agreement.

(b) Employees exempted from duty by the attending doctor but as out-patients shall be granted half-pay of the normal rate per day as from the first day of illness to a maximum total period of 15 days. Provided that an employee in this category shall be entitled to sick leave with pay for a period not exceeding 15 days during the period covered by this Agreement.

In this term of agreement it is agreed that in case at any one time the party to the Agreement considers it necessary to make any changes or variations on the terms set out above in respect of medical facilities and sick leave shall have to give notice of not less than one month to the other party requesting the same to meet and discuss whatever changes or variations that are deemed necessary.

5. *Public Holidays:* It is agreed that the Company shall grant 6 (ix) Government gazetted holidays with pay as follows:—

- (i) New Year Holiday, 1st January.
- (ii) Id-el-Fitr, one day.
- (iii) International Workers Day, 1st May.
- (iv) Easter, one day, 23rd April.
- (v) Independence Day, 9th December.
- (vi) Christmas Day, 25th December.

It is further agreed that the Company shall pay at double rates work is done during the other Government gazetted holidays in those mentioned above.

6. *Probation Period:* It is agreed that there shall be a 10 days training period for all newly engaged employees—during which the Company shall have no right to dismiss the same. The training period shall expire on the tenth day of training, following which there shall be a 5 days probation period during which the Company shall have the right to terminate the contract of service without notice, and the employee shall be entitled likewise.

Termination of Services: It is agreed that a month's notice of termination of service shall be given by either parties in respect of permanent staff or one month's salary in lieu thereof by the Company. It is further agreed that in case of seasonal workers either parties shall give 15 days notice of termination of service and 5 days wages in lieu of notice by the employer:

Provided that the Company shall not summarily dismiss an employee except—

During probation period,
Discipline and Misconduct:

It is agreed that a worker is subject to instant dismissal for any one of the following clauses (which shall be regarded as Gross Misconduct):—

- (i) if during working hours is unable to work due to intoxication;
- (ii) wilful damage to the Company's property;
- (iii) theft from the Company or colleagues;
- (iv) unreasonable 5 (five) days absence from work;
- (v) wilful disobedience to lawful orders given by employer, headmen or headwomen of each section;

(f) for failing frequently to keep up with the timetable mentioned;

(g) for habitual or substantial neglect of his/her duties.

8. *Workers' Council:* It is agreed that there shall be a Workers' Council which shall consist of 5 members elected by the workers from among themselves. The purpose of the Council shall be to settle internal problems arising out of their work in liaison with the Management so as to maintain proper understanding and promote good relationship between the parties.

9. *Respect:* The Company undertakes on their part that the Management will not use abusive language, and the Union undertakes for its members that no abusive language shall be used in the factory during the working hours.

10. *Check-off System:* It is agreed that the Company shall collect the Union's fees on behalf of the Union from its members and send the cheques or cash or money to the Union's National Headquarters, provided the individual workers voluntarily agree such fees to be deducted from their wages.

Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be understood as permitting the inspection of books or documents of accounts of the Company by members, officials or auditors of the Union; nor to authorize the books or documents of account of the Company to be subject to audit other than the usual auditors of the Company.

11. *Working Hours:* It is agreed that the standard working hours shall be 44 hours per week, made up of 9 hours from Monday to Thursday and 8 hours on Friday. It is further agreed that employees required to work more than the agreed hours, overtime shall be paid calculated at:—

- (i) $\frac{1}{2}$ time plus normal rate on normal working days;
- (ii) $1\frac{1}{2}$ time plus normal rate on granted public holidays; and
- (iii) 1 time plus normal rate on Sunday which is an unpaid non-working day.

12. *Uniforms:* It is mutually agreed that the Company shall provide to all its workers uniforms of aprons.

13. *Africanisation:* It is agreed that the Company will try its level best to promote African workers to high grades.

14. *Wages:* It is mutually agreed that the following minimum wages shall be payable to the following classes of employees:—

- (a) Unskilled female workers.—Shs. 77/- per month of 22 days worked and/or Shs. 3/50 per day to those on temporary basis.
- (b) Headwomen.—Shs. 99/- per month of 22 days worked and/or Shs. 4/50 per day to those on temporary basis.
- (c) Unskilled male workers.—Shs. 121/- per month of 22 days worked and/or Shs. 5/50 per day to those on temporary basis.
- (d) Watchmen.—Shs. 135/- per calendar month.
- (e) Drivers.—Shs. 198/- per calendar month.
- (f) Headmen.—Shs. 198/- per month of 22 days worked and/or Shs. 10/- per day to those on temporary basis.

Payments shall be made on the 16th of each working month, and on the 2nd of the following month.

Employees already receiving higher wages than the above-mentioned rates shall be granted an immediate increase of 50 cents per day.

It is further agreed that the Company shall offer work to all employees who went on strike on the twenty-eighth day of December, 1961, and the Union undertakes to call the workers back to work during the period between 26th March, 1962, and 7th April, 1962, such that all workers shall have taken over their work by 7th April, 1962.

15. The Union undertakes that if the Company be closed before the expression of this Contract no compensation shall be made in any respect. Provided that due notice is given by the employer in the manner provided in clause 7 above.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TANGANYIKA RAILWAY AFRICAN UNION AND THE EAST AFRICAN RAILWAYS AND HARBOURS ADMINISTRATION NEGOTIATED BEFORE MR. N. H. BULL, SENIOR LABOUR OFFICER, CONCILIATOR APPOINTED BY THE LABOUR COMMISSIONER UNDER SECTION 3 (2) OF THE ORDINANCE

Terms and Conditions of Agreement.

1. We, the accredited representatives of the Tanganyika Railway African Union, hereinafter referred to as the "Union", and the East African Railways and Harbours Administration, hereinafter referred to as the "Administration", being parties to a trade dispute reported to the Labour Commissioner on the twenty-seventh day of February, 1962, and having agreed on the twenty-seventh day of March, 1962, on the terms set out below in respect of the following issues reported as being in dispute, now in witness thereof have appended our signatures hereto.

Application and Operative Date of Agreement.

2. (i) This Agreement shall apply to all established employees of the Administration—

- (a) who were employed in Tanganyika on Group "C" salary scales on the effective dates of the various revisions of minimum wage rates and minimum housing allowances as hereinafter provided; or
- (b) who were engaged for employment in Tanganyika on Group "C" salary scales on any date subsequent to the effective dates of the various revisions of minimum basic wage rates and minimum housing allowances as hereinafter provided.

(ii) This Agreement shall come into force on the twenty-seventh day of March, 1962, and the terms of the Agreement relating to the revision of minimum basic wage rates and minimum housing allowances shall take effect from the dates and in the manner as hereinafter expressly provided for.

(iii) By Agreement between the parties this Agreement is made without specific reference to a period of duration.

Area Differentials.

3. It is agreed that a differential shall be introduced in so far as minimum basic wage rates and minimum housing allowances are concerned depending upon the area of employment, and for the purpose of such rates and allowances the Territory shall be subdivided in accordance with the following schedule:—

Place of Employment

- (a) AREA I—the areas within the jurisdiction of the City Council of Dar es Salaam and the Town Council of Tanga.
- (b) AREA II—the areas within the jurisdiction of the following Town Councils and Township Authorities:—
Arusha, Bukoba, Dodoma, Iringa, Kigoma, Korogwe, Lindi, Mbeya, Morogoro, Moshi, Mtwara, Mwanza, Tabora.
- (c) AREA III—any other area of the Territory not already included in Area I or Area II as defined above.

4. Minimum Basic Wage Rates and Minimum Housing Allowances.

5. Payment of Arrears.

Arrears of basic wages and where appropriate housing allowances shall be paid as a lump sum payment as soon as is practicable.

6. Effect of Revision of Wages and Allowances on other Payments.

Any payment of gratuities or compensation payments made under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance calculated and paid on any date subsequent to 1st November, 1961, shall be recalculated on the basis of the revised basic wage rates and housing allowances appropriate to the date of such payment, and where appropriate an amount equal to the difference between the original calculation and the revised calculation shall be paid to the employee concerned.

7. Introduction of "Check-off" System.

The issue reported as being in dispute in connection with the introduction of the "check-off" system is deemed to have been satisfied by the agreement reached and signed by the parties on 21st March, 1962, as a result of direct negotiations.

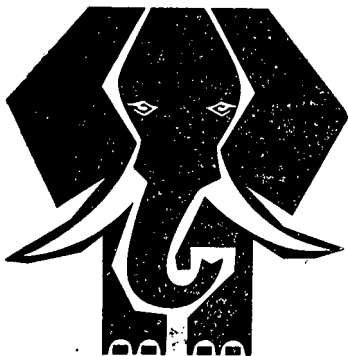

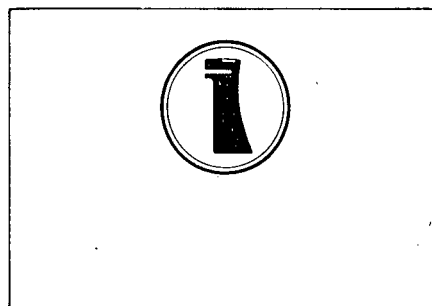
