(4) Where any matter is added after the copy has been prepared, and such additional matter results in one or more sheets being inserted between those already numbered, all sheets must be renumbered from there onwards—not, for instance 7, 7b, 8, *et cetera*.

4. Photographic copy or copy produced on a duplicating machine may be accepted if it is abundantly clear.

5. (1) Should any copy—

- (a) exceed 10 pages of double-spaced typing on size A4 paper; or
- (b) contain tabular or other matter which involves complicated setting; it will be classed as “lengthy” copy, and will be required to be submitted not less than 21 days before the date of closing for the *Gazette* in which it is to be published.

(2) Lengthy copy may be accepted at less than 21 days' notice if—

- (a) the work involved is of a straight forward and non-tabular nature; and
- (b) the total volume of work on hand for the time being permits its acceptance.

6. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these conditions, any copy—

- (a) which is of national importance, and which is originated as a matter of urgent necessity, may, by prior arrangement, be accepted late for the current week;

- (b) may, due to shortage of staff or to technical considerations, be delayed until conditions permit its processing.

7. Copy must not be submitted as part of a letter or a requisition. It must appear on a separate sheet of paper, on which there is no instruction or other extraneous matter.

8. (1) In cases where notices have to be published in tabular form copy must be drafted exactly as it is to appear. If printed forms for any such notices are unavailable, advertisers must prepare their own forms. While it is not necessary to include the preamble, the box-headings must be there, and, where applicable, the number of the form; for example, "Insolvency Regulations—Form 3".

(2) In the case of copy for tabular notices, the provision of subsection (2) of section 3 does not apply.

9. Copy for all advertisements, whether sent by post or delivered by hand, must be accompanied by a requisition or a letter which clearly sets out—

- the name and address of the advertiser; and
- the debtor's code number, if any; and
- the required date or dates of publication.

10. If a typographical error occurs in the *Gazette*, it is rectified as soon as possible by a correcting notice without charge to the ministry or department concerned, subject to the following conditions—

- that such error is reported to the editor within three months from the date of publication; and
- that the relevant copy, upon re-examination, is proved to be abundantly clear; and
- that the correction of such error is legally necessary.

(2) If a drafting error is not detected before publication, the originating ministry or department is required to draft its own correcting notice, take it to the Attorney-General for vetting and pay for such notice to be published.

(3) For the removal of doubt—

- a typographical error is made by a typographer;
- a typist's error is classed as a drafting error by reason of the fact that the officer responsible for drafting failed to check the typist's work.

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IT is hereby notified that the Minister of Information, Communication and Technology, Postal and Courier Services has, in terms of section 99 of the Postal and Telecommunications Act [*Chapter 12:05*], made the following regulations: —

PART I

PRELIMINARY

Title

1. These regulations may be cited as the Postal and Telecommunications (Licensing, Registration and Certification) Regulations, 2021.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations —

“application service” means an end-user service provided by means of one or more services;

“Broadband Global Area Network (BGAN)” means a global satellite internet network that includes telephony;

“C band” is the portion of the electromagnetic spectrum covering the frequency range 4.0 to 8.0 GHz;

- “earth station” means a station located on the earth’s surface and intended for communication with one or more space stations;
- “fixed satellite service” means a radiocommunication service between earth stations at given positions, when one or more satellites are used; the given position may be a specified fixed point or any fixed point within specified areas; in some cases this service includes satellite-to-satellite links, which may also be operated in the inter-satellite service; the fixed-satellite service may also include feeder links for other space radiocommunication services;
- “fixed wireless access system” means a radio system employed to provide connectivity between end-user equipment and the core network;
- “form” means a form prescribed in the First Schedule;
- “fee” means a fee prescribed in the Second, Third and Fourth Schedules;
- “hub” means a central VSAT earth station operating within a VSAT Network, star or mesh in configuration, whose functions include control of network operations, configuration, performance and traffic engineering;
- “Ka band” means the portion of the electromagnetic spectrum covering the frequency range 18 to 40 GHz;
- “Ku band” means the portion of the electromagnetic spectrum covering the frequency range 11.2 GHz to 14.5 GHz;
- “ITU radio regulations” means the radio regulations made in terms of the ITU Constitution;
- “ISM”, in relation to frequency bands or radio communication systems, means Industrial, Scientific and Medical equipment;
- “ITU” means the International Telecommunication Union;
- “low capacity” means a rate of information transmission which is equal to or less than 2 megabits per second;
- “medium capacity” means a rate of information transmission which is greater than 2 megabits per second and equal to or less than 34 megabits per second;

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“Mesh topology” means a network architecture in which devices are connected with many redundant interconnections between network nodes;

“Mobile-Satellite Service(MSS)” means a radiocommunication service—

- (a) between mobile earth stations and one or more space stations, or between space stations used by this service; or
- (b) between mobile earth stations by means of one or more space stations;

This service may also include feeder links necessary for its operation;

“network facilities” means any element, or combination of elements of physical infrastructure, used principally for, or in connection with the provision of one or more network services, but not including customer premise equipment. (This includes a cellular telecommunication system, or a telecommunication system as defined in the Act);

“network service” means a cellular telecommunications service or a telecommunication service or both as defined in the Act, or any other service for the carrying of information in the form of speech, or other sound, data, text or images, by means of guided or unguided electromagnetic energy or both, but does not include services provided solely on the customer side of the network boundary;

“paging system” means a communication system that send brief messages to a subscriber. The message may be a tone message, a numeric message or an alphanumeric message;

“private radio station” means a radio station other than a public radio station;

“public radio station” means a radio station operated for the purpose of providing a radiocommunication service to the public;

“telecommunication gateway” means telecommunication infrastructure or hardware equipment used in

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telecommunications networks that allows voice, video and data communication to flow from one discrete network to another nationally and internationally;

“trunked system” means a communication system that shares a limited number of radio channels amongst a large group of users;

“Star topology” means an architecture in which all nodes are individually connected to a central connection point, like a Hub or a router;

“Virtual Network Operator (VNO)” means a local entity that does not own VSAT network facilities but leases such facilities from International VSAT Hub service providers;

“VSAT (Very Small Aperture Terminal)” a two-way ground based station with a small aperture antenna designed to receive satellite signals;

“Unified Services Licence” means a licence issued in terms of the Act, entitling the holder to provide network facilities, network services and application services.

PART II

PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATION LICENCES

Licensing framework

3. (1) The Authority may in accordance with section 37 of the Act and this part issue public telecommunication licences.

(2) The Authority may, upon application and due consideration in the prescribed manner, grant a telecommunications licence with one or more of the following services —

- (a) unified telecommunications services, valid for 20 years; or
- (b) network facilities services (NFS), valid for 20 years; or
- (c) network services (NS), valid for 20 years; or
- (d) application services valid for a maximum period of 20 years; or

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- (e) international gateway services, valid for a maximum period of 20 years; or
- (f) fixed line telephone services, valid for a period of 20 years; or
- (g) internet access provision class 'A', valid for 14 years or Class 'B' valid for 12 years; or
- (h) any other specified service under special circumstances, valid for a maximum period of 12 months.

(2) The Authority may, upon application and due consideration in the prescribed manner, grant a cellular telecommunications licence, valid for 20 years.

Unified Telecommunications Licence

4. (1) The Unified Telecommunication Licence shall authorise the licensee to provide telecommunication network facilities, network services and application services under one licence.

(2) The Unified Telecommunication Licence consolidates the following individual licenses —

- (a) Telecommunication Licence for Network Facilities Services (NFS); and
- (b) Telecommunication Licence for Network Services (NS);
- (c) Telecommunication Licence for Application Services; and
- (d) Telecommunications Licence for International Gateway Services.

Telecommunication Licence for Network Facilities Services

5. (1) The Telecommunication Licence for Network Facilities Services shall authorise a licence to build, own and manage passive infrastructure that facilitates provision of electronic communications and, lease or resell it, to other telecommunication operators, but specifically prohibits the licensee from providing services directly to end-users.

- (2) The passive telecommunications infrastructure includes —
 - (a) dark optical fibre cables;

- (b) copper cables;
- (c) towers and associated site equipment;
- (d) ducting and associated civil works.

Telecommunication Licence for Network Services

6. The Telecommunication Licence for Network Services shall authorise the licensee to operate and maintain active electronic communication equipment, such as —

- (a) transmission network; and
- (b) core network; and
- (c) access network;

in order to offer wholesale services to other licensees through network facilities offered by a network facilities provider.

Telecommunication Licence for Application Services

7. (1) The Telecommunication Licence for Application Services shall authorise the licensee to provide end-user electronic communication services such as voice, video, data, messaging services, mobile money services, among other customer facing services.

(2) The scope of the Telecommunication Licence for Application Services may be specific to one or more service or application.

(3) The Telecommunication Licence for Application Services can be issued for the following categories—

- (a) general licence for Application Services;
- (b) full mobile virtual network licence;
- (c) light mobile virtual network;
- (d) branded reseller mobile virtual network;
- (e) virtual network enablers;
- (f) internet service provider (National);
- (g) internet service provider (Metropolitan-Harare and Bulawayo);

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- (h) internet service provider (Provincial Excluding Harare and Bulawayo);
- (i) internet service provider (District);
- (j) internet service provider (Community);

applicants for the services referred to in paragraphs (i) and (j) shall make once off licence payments on issuance of the licence:

Provided that all licensees referred to in this section shall provide essential and emergency services such as emergency telecommunications services, operator assistance, customer assistance, crime stoppers, child helpline, health helpline, fire services, ambulance, anti-corruption; human safety and life among others, free of charge.

(4) Save for the general licence for application services, the licences listed in subsection (3) shall be valid for a maximum period of ten years.

Telecommunications Licence for International Gateway Services

8. The Telecommunications Licence International Gateway Services shall authorise the licensee to operate and maintain telecommunication facilities that allow electronic communication traffic to be interchanged between Zimbabwe and other countries. (Such facilities include international switches and or international links.)

Telecommunication Licence for Special Services

9. (1) A telecommunication licence for special services shall authorise the licensee to offer specified telecommunication services, as may be prescribed from time to, time in consultation with the Authority.

(2) Unless specified in the licence document, a telecommunication licence for special circumstances shall be a short-term licence issued under special circumstances such as testing, research, emergency and or disaster relief.

(3) The tenure of such short-term licence may not exceed a period of five years subject to renewal.

(4) Licence fees for such licences shall be prorated against full term licence fees of the licence category under which a special licence is required, unless otherwise exempted:

Provided that no licence fees shall apply for disaster management.

Telecommunications Licence for Special Services: Rural Fixed Broadband Wireless Access Systems

10. (1) Any person may apply for a telecommunications licence for special services in terms of section 9 for the establishment of fixed broadband wireless access in rural and farming areas of Zimbabwe, provided that such shall be operated within the frequency bands, bands 2400-2483 MHz and 5725-5875 MHz.

(2) Applications for a telecommunications licence for special services: rural fixed broadband wireless access systems shall be made in writing in to the Authority and applicants shall, in connection therewith, supply such information as the Authority may require.

(3) Anyone wishing to operate a rural fixed broadband wireless access system shall ensure that his or her equipment is type approved.

(4) Conditions applicable to use of rural fixed broadband wireless access systems are stipulated in the Fifth Schedule.

(5) Rural fixed broadband wireless access systems are specifically allowed in rural and underserved areas where there is low usage of the bands and low probability of causing interference to other users of the bands compared to urban areas.

Telecommunication licence for fixed line telephone service

11. The telecommunication licence for fixed line telephone services authorises the licensee to construct, develop, operate and manage a public switched electronic communication network infrastructure national long distance telecommunication service that shall include—

- (a) international telecommunication services;
- (b) local access telecommunication services;
- (c) public fixed telephone, telegraph and telex services;

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- (d) public internet and data services;
- (e) gateways services;
- (f) the leasing of telecommunication lines:

Provided that the licensee shall provide essential and emergency services such as emergency telecommunications services, operator assistance, customer assistance, crime stoppers, child helpline, health helpline, fire services, ambulance, anti-corruption, human safety and life among others, free of charge.

Telecommunication licence for internet access provision

12. (1) The telecommunication licence for internet access provision authorises the licensee to construct, develop and maintain a telecommunications network for public data, video and internet access for the provision of data and internet access services.

(2) An application may be made for any one of the following classes of internet services, namely—

- (a) class A internet access provider with authorisation to offer Internet Protocol telephony; or
- (b) class B internet access provider without authorisation to offer Internet Protocol telephony:

Provided that, the licensee shall provide essential and emergency services such as emergency telecommunications services, operator assistance, customer assistance, crime stoppers, child helpline, health helpline, fire services, ambulance, anti-corruption; human safety and life among others, free of charge.

Cellular Telecommunications licence

13. (1) The Cellular Telecommunications licence authorises the licensee to construct, develop, operate and manage a national cellular telecommunication network for providing public voice, video, data and internet services.

(2) The licensed network including all telecommunication apparatus, shall conform to the technical specifications for networks and equipment, including the use of radio frequency spectrum, as set out in the Zimbabwe National Frequency Allocation Plan (ZNFAP).

(3) A national cellular telecommunication network includes the following network segments —

- (a) transmission network;
- (b) core network; and
- (c) radio access network;

Provided that, the licensee shall provide essential and emergency services such as emergency telecommunications services, operator assistance, customer assistance, crime stoppers, child helpline, health helpline, fire services, ambulance, anti-corruption; human safety and life among others, free of charge.

Application for Licences under this Part

14. (1) Any person may, subject to the provisions of the Act and these regulations, apply for a public telecommunications licence in **Form PT1**, **Form PT2**, **Form PT3** and accompanied by the prescribed fee.

(2) The Authority may, by notice in the gazette and in at least two consecutive issues of a national newspaper give notice inviting applications for a licence and—

- (a) invite interested persons to apply and submit written applications in the prescribed format within the period mentioned in the gazette or newspaper;
- (b) set out the proposed licence conditions that will apply to the licence;
- (c) give interested parties an opportunity to submit written representations in response to any applications submitted in terms of paragraph (a);
- (d) may conduct public hearing in relation to any application for a public telecommunications licence.

(3) The Authority may, require an applicant or an interested party who has submitted a written application in terms of subsection (2)(a) to furnish the Authority, within a period specified by the Authority, with such additional information as maybe reasonably necessary in order to consider the application.

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- (4) The Authority must, after considering—
- (a) any application for a public telecommunication licence made in terms of these regulations; and
 - (b) any written representations made in terms of subsection (2)(c) in relation to the application;

notify the applicant of its decision, the reasons for that decision and any licence conditions applicable and publish such information in the *Gazette*.

(5) Whenever the Authority grants a public telecommunications licence, the Authority must do so on standard terms and conditions applicable to the type of licence, as prescribed in terms of section 2.

(6) Despite subsection (8), the Authority may impose on the applicant any other special conditions resulting from undertakings made by the applicant.

(7) Where an application is rejected the Authority shall inform the applicant of his or her right of appeal under section 62.

(8) Applicants and licensees shall pay the relevant prescribed fees stipulated in the Second, Third and Fourth Schedules.

Conditions attaching to public telecommunication licences

15. (1) No person shall transfer his, her or its licence to another person during the currency of the licence.

(2) A licensee shall be required to provide services within a maximum period of twelve months from the date of issuance of the licence.

(3) Where a licensee fails to provide services within the period specified in subsection (2), he or she shall be required to submit to the Authority reasons for failure to provide services and the Authority may consider extension of the period to provide services for a maximum period of twelve months.

(4) Where a licensee fails to provide services after the expiry of the extended period, the Authority shall revoke the licence.

(5) A licensee shall provide services in accordance with the applicable recommendations of the International Telecommunication

Union, other international standardisation bodies and any other relevant law applicable in Zimbabwe.

- (6) A licence may authorise or require —
 - (a) the connection or interconnection of the telecommunication system to which the licence relates—
 - (i) to any other telecommunication system specified in the licence, or for a description so specified;
 - (ii) to any apparatus specified in the licence, or of a description so specified;
 - (b) the provision by means of a telecommunication system to which the licence relates of any telecommunication service specified in the licence.

(7) Without limitation to any other conditions that may be so specified or otherwise applicable, a licence may specify—

- (a) guidelines, in accordance with ITU standards, to be adopted in the operation of the service;
- (b) the frequencies assigned to the licensee including the applicable terms and conditions;
- (c) universal service obligations to be undertaken by the licensee;
- (d) performance specifications to which the licensee is to conform;
- (e) the obligations of the licensee in respect of the licence conditions;
- (f) the obligation of the licensee in relation to the provision of emergency service for free;
- (g) any other conditions that may be specified in the licence document.

Renewal of licence and notice of termination or renewal

16. (1) Subject to section 3 every licence shall be valid for a period specified thereon.

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- (2) If an application for a licence is successful (whether approved with or without conditions by the Authority shall—
- (a) inform the applicant accordingly in accordance with section 14(4); and
 - (b) issue to the applicant the relevant licence, upon payment by the applicant of the prescribed issuance fee; and
 - (c) make an appropriate entry in the licensing register of licences.
- (3) The Authority may renew or terminate a licence issued in terms of this Part upon the written request of the licensee.
- (4) Subject to subsection (5), a licensee may submit to the Authority a written request for renewal or termination of his or her licence at any time.
- (5) A licensee the term of whose licence is —
- (a) more than ten years, shall notify the Authority of his or her intention to renew or terminate the licence three years before his or her licence expires;
 - (b) more than two years and less than ten years, shall notify the Authority of his or her intention to renew or terminate the licence six months before his or her licence expires;
 - (c) less than two years shall notify the Authority of his or her intention to renew or to terminate the licence a month before his or her licence expires.
- (6) The notice to renew or terminate a licence shall be submitted in **Form PT1**, where there has been no material change in the details of the application for the existing licence, together with the applicable fee if any, as prescribed.
- (7) Upon receipt of an application for the renewal of a licence in terms of subsection (5), the same procedure as is prescribed for the issuance of an original licence shall apply.
- (8) Any person who contravenes subsection (4) or (5) shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 3 or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month or both such fine and such imprisonment.

Suspension or cancellation of licences

17. (1) The Authority may at any time suspend or cancel any licence if the authority has reasonable grounds for believing that—

- (a) the licence was issued in error or through fraud or the misrepresentation or non-disclosure of a material fact by the licensee; or
- (b) the licensee has contravened any provision of the Act that is applicable to him or her; or
- (c) the licensee misrepresents the service or system he or she offers to the public; or
- (d) the licensee has ceased to provide the service or system specified in the licence; or
- (e) the licensee has assigned, ceded or otherwise transferred the licence to another person without the prior approval of the Authority; or
- (f) the licensee has failed to comply with any term or condition of the licence.

(2) Without limiting any other grounds on which the Authority may cancel a licence the following events, whether specified in the licence or not, shall constitute material breaches of the licence justifying the cancellation of the licence concerned—

- (a) where applicable, failure by a licensee to commence construction of the licensed network or provision of licensed services or applications within twelve months of the date of issue of licence;
- (b) failure by a licensee to provide the licensed services in accordance with the targets specified in its rollout plan;
- (c) continuous service blackout of the licensed service for a consecutive period of 30 days, provided that the interruption is not a result of *force majeure*;
- (d) where a licensee is declared insolvent or is liquidated under any written laws in force in Zimbabwe or any other country;

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- (e) failure by a licensee to pay any prescribed fees or contributions or any penalty imposed in terms of section 43 of the Act on such a licensee by the Authority.

Amendment and replacement of licences

18. (1) The Authority may at any time amend a licence or any terms or conditions of a licence—

- (a) to correct any error in the licence; or
- (b) if the licensee requests the amendment; or
- (c) if the Authority considers the amendment necessary to reflect the true nature of the service, system or business which the licensee is conducting; or
- (d) if for any other reason the Authority considers the amendment necessary or desirable in the public interest;

in accordance with the procedure provided in terms of section 42 of the Act.

(2) A licensee may submit to the Authority a written request for amendment of its licence at any time.

(3) Where the Authority proposes to amend a licence, the Authority shall notify the licensee in writing accordingly and shall in its notice specify—

- (a) the proposed amendment;
- (b) state the reasons for the proposed amendment;
- (c) the date on which the Authority intends to effect the amendment.

(4) The licensee shall respond to a notification in terms of subsection (2) within 30 days from the date on which the Authority serves the notice on the licensee.

(5) If the licensee does not respond to the Authority within the period required under subsection (3), the authority shall amend the licence in the manner specified in the notice.

(6) Where the licensee responds within the period required under subsection (3), the authority may amend the licence taking into consideration the representations raised by the licensee.

Interconnection and Interoperability

19. (1) Any applicant for network service licence shall ensure that there is —

- (a) interoperability and compatibility of the network service system with other network services systems; and
- (b) availability of access to emergency services.

(2) Every licensee shall be required to comply with any regulations, technical specifications and rules that may be issued by the Authority as are applicable and appropriate in order to ensure interoperability of the licensed services and licensed systems with electronic communications services and systems provided by other operators.

(3) A licensee shall ensure that all the equipment comprised in, connected to the licensed systems and used in the provision of the licensed services is of the type, approved by the Authority.

(4) Any person who refuses, denies or inordinately delays interconnection with another operator in contravention of the Interconnection Guidelines published in Statutory Instrument 28 of 2001, shall be guilty of any offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 14 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

Network or System Modification

20.(1) A licensee shall inform the Authority in advance of any substantive change or modification of the licensed network or system which may result in a substantial service interruption.

(2) A licensee shall ensure that any substantive change does not interfere with other existing communication networks or systems.

(3) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of any offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 10 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

Numbering resources

21.(1) The applicant shall apply for subscriber numbers and short codes in writing to the Authority and complete a number application

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Form PT2 clearly indicating the subscriber number blocks or short codes required.

(2) The Authority shall respond within 14 days from the date of receiving the application. And if the application is successful, an invoice is issued within the 14 days.

(3) The number shall be used after payment for the numbers fees set out in Part I of the Second Schedule.

(4) Subscriber numbers are assigned in blocks of multiples of 1 000.

(5) For efficient utilisation of subscriber numbers, licensees shall be assigned additional numbers, if the utilisation of the assigned number blocks reaches 80%.

Tariffs

22. (1) Tariffs for licensed services and interconnection rates shall be approved in terms of the Act.

(2) A licensee shall display approved tariffs at each customer service centres including websites, outlets and dealers.

(3) No licensee shall—

(a) implement an unapproved tariff;

(b) publish an unapproved tariff;

(c) implement unpublished tariff;

(d) publish false or inaccurate information on licensed services.

(4) A licensee shall provide applicable roaming tariffs to outbound roaming customers.

(5) Any Licensee who implements an unapproved tariff shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine (from the day of commission of offence) of Fifty thousand dollars per each day in breach and continued breach by the licensee for seven days will result in cancellation of licence.

(6) Any licensee who fails to publish and display approved tariffs shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of five thousand dollars per each day in breach since the last tariff adjustment.

(7) Any licensee who fails to send an SMS notifying an outbound roaming customer of the applicable roaming tariffs upon handing over the customer to a roaming partner shall be obliged to charge the equivalent of applicable home tariff for all roaming services offered during the period of visit.

PART III

PRIVATE NETWORK LICENCES

Private Telecommunications Network licence

23. (1) A private telecommunications network license authorises the licensee to construct, operate and maintain a private telecommunication network for own-use.

(2) The traffic conveyed by a private network must not originate or terminate in a public telecommunications facility that is located in Zimbabwe.

Application for a private telecommunications network licence

24. (1) Any person wishing to apply for a private telecommunications network licence shall apply in writing to the Director-General indicating the licence he or she is applying for.

(2) The applicant must complete—

- (a) **Form PT4** for private network application for all applications;
- (b) **Form in PT5** for an Earth Station Application (For network with VSAT terminals);
- (c) **Form PT6** for a Fixed Wireless Access System;
- (d) **Form PT7** for a Radio Relay;

which should be endorsed by signatures of the approved person and accompanied by the applicable prescribed fees.

(3) The Authority must, after considering any application in terms of subsection (1) notify the applicant of its decision, the reasons for that decision and any conditions that are applicable to the licence.

(4) The provisions provided in sections 16 to 18 apply with the necessary changes to licences issued under this Part.

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Conditions for Licensing Private Network Operators

25. (1) The Authority may license a private network operator where —

- (a) the relevant telecommunication or radio communication service is not provided by a public telecommunication licensee;
- (b) it is not practicable or convenient or expedient for a telecommunication licensee to provide the service in question;
- (c) in the opinion of the Authority, circumstances justify the provision of the service in question;

(2) The Authority may, subject to subsection (3) licence a private telecommunication service or system and the operation of a radio station in connection therewith.

(3) Any radio station operated in connection with a private telecommunication service or system shall be worked solely for the purposes of transmitting and receiving messages relating to the business of the licensee.

PART IV

PRIVATE NETWORK LICENCES

Considerations relating to use of Very Small Aperture Terminals (VSATs) by Public and Private Telecommunication Licensees

26. (1) Public Network Operators may provide VSAT services through a local or external hub, provided that VSAT services can only be provided subject to a Virtual Network Operator (VNO) contract with the VSAT upstream provider or local hub provider where the local hub is not owned by the Public Network Operator.

(2) The Public Network Operator shall submit the VNO contract to the Authority for approval before implementation.

(3) The VNO contract shall include the following minimum provisions—

- (a) provision of exclusive rights to the VNO to add or delete remote stations for the Virtual Network;

- (b) the VNO shall have full visibility and management rights over remote stations belonging to the Virtual Network;
- (c) the VNO shall have billing and management rights for remote terminals within the virtual network;
- (d) the contract shall make provision for compliance with the Interception of Communications Act [*Chapter 11:20*];
- (e) all VSAT terminals shall be licensed by the Authority as specified in the Second Schedule;
- (f) all local hub operators shall comply with directives issued in terms of the Interception of Communications Act;
- (g) operating a VSAT Network without a VNO agreement approved by the Authority shall constitute a material breach of the licence justifying the cancellation or suspension of the licence concerned;
- (h) failure by any licensee to comply with any directive issued in terms of the Interception of Communications Act shall constitute a material breach of the licence justifying the cancellation or suspension of the licence.

VSATs in Mesh or Point to Point Configuration

27. (1) No public or private network operators shall use satellite networks in mesh or star configuration, unless the network operator notifies the Authority of earth stations located in Zimbabwe which have—

- (a) independent centralised control and monitoring functionality;
- (b) the capability to suppress transmissions from any earth station within the network.

(2) Subject to approval by the Authority, Public and Private Network operators may use earth stations with point-to- multi point and point- to- point configurations as permanent earth stations.

(3) Any licensee who contravenes subsection (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of five thousand dollars per each day in breach.

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Application for use of mobile satellite services by public and private operators

28. (1) Any person who wishes to use mobile satellite services from an external service provider shall apply in **Form PT8** accompanied by the prescribed fee.

(2) The Authority shall after considering the application made in terms of subsection (1) notify the applicant of its decision and reasons thereof and issue the licence with or without conditions upon payment of the prescribed issuance fee.

(3) The mobile satellite service licence shall be valid for one year and the provisions of sections 16 to 18 shall apply with the necessary changes to a licence referred to in this section.

(4) Any person who uses mobile satellite services without a valid licence shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of two thousand dollars per each day in breach.

PART V

PRIVATE RADIO TRANSCEIVER STATIONS AND SYSTEMS

Private Radio Transceiver Stations/System Licences

29. (1) Licences to be applied for under this Part are as follows —

- (a) radio station licence for Private Mobile Radio Station (PMR);
- (b) radio station licence for radio transceiver station(s) onboard an aerial vehicle;
- (c) radio station licence for radio transceiver station(s) onboard a water vessel;
- (d) radio station licence for amateur radio transceiver station(s);
- (e) radio station licence for citizen band radio transceiver station(s);
- (f) radio station licence for meteorological aids.

*Licence application for Private Radio Transceiver Station(s)/
System(s)*

30.(1) Applications for licences under this Part shall be made in writing in form PT9 to the Authority and applicants shall, in connection therewith, supply such information as the Authority may require.

(2) The Authority shall, within 10 working days of receiving the application, give a response to the applicant, whether to request for additional information or to indicate that the application has been successful.

(3) The proposed radio communication system may not be brought into service, nor may any alteration be made to an existing licensed network without written authority from the Authority.

(4) The applicant or licensee shall pay the relevant licence fees set out in Part II of the Second Schedule.

(5) Where applicable, licensees shall pay spectrum usage fees as set out in the Fourth Schedule.

*Conditions for Private Radio Transceiver Station(s)/System(s)
Licences*

31.(1) Subject to the Act, the licences set out in the first column of Part II of the Second Schedule shall be issued subject to the conditions set out therein and payment of the relevant licence fees:

Provided that, in such circumstances as it may determine the Authority may waive the payment or remit any fee or charge payable in terms of this Part.

(2) Detailed conditions attaching to amateur radio transceiver stations are set out in Part VII.

(3) The issue of a licence for radio transceiver station(s) onboard an aerial vehicle shall not in any way exempt the licensee from compliance with the provisions of the Civil Aviation Act [Chapter 13:16], nor shall such issue be construed as a guarantee by the Authority that the licence for radio transceiver station(s) onboard an aerial vehicle and radio apparatus associated therewith are safe for all the conditions which may be encountered during the operation of the aircraft in which the station is installed.

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(4) The issue of a licence for radio transceiver station(s) onboard a water vessel shall not in any way exempt the licensee from compliance with the provisions of the Inland Waters Shipping Act [Chapter 13:06], nor shall such issue be construed as a guarantee by the Authority that the radio transceiver station(s) onboard a water vessel and radio apparatus associated therewith are safe for all the conditions which may be encountered during the operation of the ship in which the station is installed.

(5) Any person who operates without a valid a private radio transceiver station or system commits an offence and shall be liable to a fine of five thousand dollars or three months imprisonment.

(6) Any licensee who fails to renew a licence within three months from date of expiry shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of two thousand dollars.

Duration of licences under Part V

32.(1) Licences for private radio transceiver station(s)/ System(s) issued in terms of this Part shall be valid for the period shown in the licence document.

(2) Applications for renewal must be made at least 15 days before the date of expiry of the licence subject to payment of the prescribed renewal fees.

Requirement for type approval

33.(1) All equipment used in relation to a licence issued under this Part shall be type approved by the Authority, prior to bringing the equipment into operation.

(2) The applicant shall submit an application with the necessary documentation as may be required by the Authority together with the prescribed fee set out in the Second Schedule.

(3) The Authority shall check the equipment for conformance with technical parameters adopted for use in Zimbabwe.

(4) If the equipment is found to be in conformity, the Authority shall issue a certificate of approval for such equipment.

(5) The Authority shall maintain a register of type-approved radiocommunication equipment, which shall be made available on request and on the Authority's website.

(6) No licensee shall supply or install equipment, which is not type approved.

(7) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of not exceeding level 9 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

PART VI

GENERAL PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO LICENSEES

Interference

34. (1) A licensee shall establish and work his or her radiocommunication system in such a manner as not to cause harmful interference to other radiocommunication systems licensed or worked by another licensee.

(2) Radiocommunication systems operating within frequency bands designated as ISM bands shall accept interference from ISM devices and systems.

(3) Radiocommunication systems operating in bands designated as ISM bands shall not cause harmful interference to systems operating in the adjacent bands.

(4) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 12 or to imprisonment for a period not six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

Distress calls

35. A licensee shall accept with absolute priority any distress call, message or signal regardless of its origin and shall immediately take such action in accordance with the guidelines provided for in the licence or by otherwise provided for by the Authority.

False signals and impersonation

36. (1) No licensee or person working a radio communication service shall transmit or use call signs or other identifying signals which have not been assigned to that radio station by the Authority.

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(2) No person or licensee in the working of any radio communication service shall impersonate any other licensee.

(3) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 10 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment

Altering parameters of radio transceiver station(s)

37. (1) No radio transceiver station shall be altered in respect of—

- (a) its power beyond the set limit stipulated in the licence; or
- (b) the class or characteristics of its emission stated in the licence; or
- (c) in the case of a fixed station, its location or area stated in the licence; or
- (d) in the case of a mobile station, its area of operation stated in the licence;

without prior written approval of the Authority.

(2) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 9 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment

Radio station identification

38. (1) No radio station shall transmit signals without identification of such station.

(2) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 6 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

PART VII

AMATEUR RADIO TRANSCEIVER STATIONS

Amateur Radio Transceiver Operator's certificate

39. (1) Any person, above the age of sixteen, who wishes to apply for a Radio Amateur Operator's Certificate may do so by submitting information as may be required by the Authority including—

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- (a) the name and address of the applicant;
- (b) proof of his or her citizenship;
- (c) copy of identity document;
- (d) the type of certificate which is applied for.

(2) Each application shall be accompanied by two unmounted photographs of recent date and approximately seventy-five millimetres by fifty millimetres in dimension showing the head and shoulders of the applicant.

Examinations

40. (1) The holding of examinations for the certificate set out in section 34, shall be advertised by the Authority and shall be held at such intervals, at such times, in such places and under such conditions as the Authority may specify.

(2) Where an applicant for a certificate produces to the satisfaction of the Authority evidence of qualifications recognised outside Zimbabwe, it may issue to the applicant a certificate set out in section 33.

Qualifications

41. (1) An Amateur Transceiver Radio Operator's Certificate shall be issued only to a person who—

- (a) holds a Radio Amateur Examination Certificate issued to him or her by the Authority; or
- (b) satisfies the Authority that he or she possess qualifications or knowledge and experience equivalent to that required for the possession of such certificate; and
- (c) proves, to the satisfaction of the Authority—
 - (i) that he or she has sufficient knowledge of the technique of living up and working a radio transmitter, with special reference to the maintenance of correct frequency and avoidance of harmful interference; and
 - (ii) that he or she has sufficient knowledge of the working procedures to enable him or her to comply

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with the provisions of these regulations and the ITU Radio Regulations.

Licence for amateur radio transceiver station

42. A licence to establish and work an amateur station shall be issued only—

- (a) to a person who possesses an Amateur Transceiver Radio Operators Certificate; and
- (b) subject to inspection of the station by the Authority before it is brought into use.

Applications under Part VII

43. (1) Applications for licences for amateur radio transceiver stations shall be made in writing to the Authority and applicants shall, in connection therewith, supply such information as the Authority may require.

(2) A licence for a radio amateur station shall not be issued to an association, company, corporation, educational institution or any other body of persons corporate or unincorporated:

Provided that in the case of a *bona fide* radio society such a licence may be issued to an office-bearer of such society who holds on behalf of such society a licence to work a radio amateur station.

Communication between amateurs

44. (1) A radio amateur station may establish communication only with another amateur radio transceiver station.

(2) Communication with another amateur radio transceiver station outside Zimbabwe shall be established only if such communication is not prohibited by or under the law in force in the country in which such other radio amateur station is situated.

(3) Subject to the provisions of this section when communications between radio amateur stations are permitted they shall be limited to messages relating to radio experiments and to remarks of a personal character for which by reason of their unimportance recourse to use public telecommunication service is not justified.

(4) All communications between radio amateur stations shall be conducted in plain language or the “Q” code and neither the licensee

of the amateur station or any other person shall use his or her radio station or allow it to be used for the transmission of advertisements, news, or any message for or on behalf of a third party.

(5) Any headquarters of an amateur radio society recognised by the Authority may, with its approval, transmit information bulletins of direct interest to amateurs at regular intervals and may transmit Morse code transmission for persons learning or improving their efficiency in Morse code.

Entertainment not to be transmitted

45. (1) An operator of an amateur radio transceiver station(s) shall not transmit from his or her station any form of entertainment unless it is for testing purposes subject to the following conditions —

- (a) no transmission of music shall exceed a period of three minutes in any such transmission; and
- (b) after a transmission of music there shall be a period of at least five minutes during which music is not transmitted; and
- (c) where gramophone records are used no mention shall be made of the make or name thereof or of any information to identify the records; and
- (d) transmission of music shall be restricted to the following frequencies—
 - (i) 3 650 Kilohertz to 3 800 Kilohertz; and
 - (ii) 144 Megahertz to 146 Megahertz; and
 - (iii) 430 Megahertz to 440 Megahertz; and
 - (iv) 1 215 Megahertz to 1 300 Megahertz; and
 - (v) 2 300 Megahertz to 2 450 Megahertz; and
 - (vi) 5 650 Megahertz to 5 850 Megahertz; and
 - (vii) 10 000 Megahertz to 10 500 Megahertz.

(2) For the purposes of this section the transmission of anything recorded whether on a gramophone record or by any means shall be deemed to be a transmission of music.

Postal and Telecommunications (Licensing, Registration and Certification) Regulations, 2021

(3) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 9 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

PART VIII

RADIOCOMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT DEALERS AND REPAIRERS

Application for registration as dealer

46. (1) Any person who is an importer or distributor of electronic communications equipment, shall be registered as a telecommunications equipment dealer by the Authority.

(2) No person shall be registered as a telecommunications dealer in radiocommunications equipment unless he or she has satisfied the Authority that he or she has the technical capacity to examine, test and certify that any radio transmitting station assembled, manufactured or sold by him or her conforms to the technical specifications laid down by the Authority for that type of station.

(3) Any person who is an importer or distributor of electronic communications equipment shall ensure that equipment imported or distributed to sellers are of acceptable quality and of the type approved by the Authority.

(4) The importer, distributor or seller of electronic communications equipment which use frequency spectrum shall ensure that customers have frequency licences from the Authority.

(5) No person shall carry on the business of dealership in telecommunication or radiocommunication equipment unless they have been issued with a certificate by the Authority.

(6) A dealership certificate of registration shall at all times be kept by the dealer on the premises to which it relates, and an additional copy of such certificate may be issued by the Authority for each set of premises in which the dealer carries on business as a dealer, subject to payment of a prescribed fee for the issuance of additional certificates.

(7) Every application for registration shall include —

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- (a) the name of the person or firm concerned; and
- (b) the address or addresses at which the trade, business or industry is carried on; and
- (c) information indicating whether such trade, business or industry is conducted as an assembler, manufacturer, importer, wholesaler, retailer, auctioneer or any or all of those in combination; and
- (d) complete particulars of his or her training, qualifications and experience; and
- (e) any other information as the Authority may reasonably require.

(8) The duration of a certificate issued in terms of this section shall be specified in the certificate.

(9) Every dealer shall submit to the Authority such returns and information at such times as the Authority may reasonably request.

(10) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 9 or to imprisonment for a period exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

Application for registrations as repairer

47. (1) No person shall operate any business of repairing radiocommunication or telecommunication equipment without registering with the Authority.

(2) Every application for registration as a repairer shall include—

- (a) the full names of the repairers; and
- (b) national identity numbers; and
- (c) postal and physical address; and
- (d) complete particulars of his or her training, qualifications and experience; and
- (e) any other information as the Authority may reasonably require.

Postal and Telecommunications (Licensing, Registration and Certification) Regulations, 2021

(3) The duration of a certificate issued in terms of this section shall be specified in the certificate.

(4) No person shall carry on the business of a telecommunication or radiocommunication station or equipment repairer unless they have been issued with a certificate by the Authority

(5) Any person who carries on the business of repairing radio communication equipment without a licence shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 9 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

Conditions for installation and maintenance of radio communication equipment

48. (1) Any person who carries on the business of maintenance or installation of radiocommunication equipment shall be registered with the Authority as a radiocommunication equipment repairer.

(2) Any radio repairer shall record in a register kept for that purpose the following particulars in respect of every service provided by him or her—

- (a) the name and address of the person on whose behalf the repair is carried out; and
- (b) the make, type and serial number of the transmitter required or of the transmitter with which any repaired equipment is associated; and
- (c) the nature or the repair carried out; and
- (d) particulars of the licence, of the person on whose behalf the repair is carried out.

(3) Any person who carries on the business of maintenance or installation of radio stations shall submit to the Authority such returns and information at such times as the Authority may reasonably request.

(4) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of level 6 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

Restrictions on importation, possession or delivery of radio stations to unlicensed persons

49. (1) No dealer or his or her employee or agent shall deliver a radio station to any person in pursuance of the sale, exchange, hire or loan of that station, or for any other reason, unless that person first produces, or causes to be produced, to him or her a licence authorising the possession of the radio station by that person, irrespective of whether or not that radio station is to be used for the purpose of establishing a new station or to add to an existing licensed network.

(2) No person shall import, possess or deliver any radio station without a licence or express permission from the Authority.

(3) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 10 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

PART IX

SHORT RANGE AND ULTRA WIDE BAND DEVICES

Requirements for low power devices

50. (1) Short range and ultra wide band devices operating or conforming to parameters stipulated in the Sixth Schedule shall be exempt from licensing.

(2) Such devices shall operate on a no-protection and non-interference basis.

(3) Such devices shall be subject to type approval.

PART X

SPECTRUM ACCESS AND USAGE

Spectrum licence

51. (1) Applications for radio frequency spectrum for use in the deployment of public land mobile systems shall be made in writing to the Authority. Applicants shall, in connection therewith, supply such information as the Authority may require.

Postal and Telecommunications (Licensing, Registration and Certification) Regulations, 2021

(2) Applications for radio frequency spectrum for radio relay or fixed wireless access systems shall be made in writing to the Authority in **Form PT6** or **Form PT7** together with such information as the Authority may require.

(3) An application for spectrum assignment shall be made by a person who holds a valid telecommunications licence.

(4) No licensee shall apply for frequencies for speculative or hoarding purposes.

(5) A licensee shall pay spectrum access fees as prescribed in the Third Schedule and spectrum usages fees as prescribed in the Fourth Schedule.

(6) The Authority shall revoke spectrum assignments in cases where assigned frequencies remains unused for a period of six months.

Right to use frequencies

52.(1) No person shall use radio spectrum without the appropriate authorisation.

(2) Unless stated in the licence document no spectrum assignment shall be construed as conferring any exclusive right in respect of any frequencies.

(3) The Authority may re-assign any frequency or frequencies assigned to any licence in certain circumstances and conditions to which the Authority will give prior notification to the licensee as the case may determine.

(4) Any person other than a licensee who uses unassigned radio frequencies shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 12 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment

(5) Any licensee who contravenes subsection (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of five thousand dollars per each day in breach.

PART XI

GENERAL

Licence fees and universal services fund contributions

53. (1) An applicant for a licence or a licensee shall pay to the

Authority the following fees and contributions as prescribed by notice in the *Gazette* or as set out in the Second Schedule —

- (a) a non-refundable application fee; and
 - (b) an initial or renewal licence fee; and
 - (c) and where applicable—
 - (i) an annual licence fee;
 - (ii) and a contribution to the Universal Services Fund in terms of section 76 of the Act.
- (2) Where applicable, a licensee shall pay to the Authority—
- (i) spectrum access fees as set out in the Third Schedule;
 - (ii) and annual spectrum usage as set out in the Fourth Schedule.

Preservation of secrecy

54.(1) It shall be a condition of the issue of a licence or certificate that if any message, the receipt of which is not authorised thereunder, is received by means of the station concerned neither the licensee nor the holder of the certificate shall make known the contents of any such message, its origin or destination, its existence or the fact of its receipt to any person except an officer of the Authority or a competent legal tribunal and shall not retain any copy or make any use of any such message or access it to be reproduced in writing, copied or made use of.

(2) A licence or certificate shall not be issued unless the applicant signs, in the presence of an officer of the Authority, a declaration of secrecy in the following form—

“I (name in full) do solemnly declare that if any radio communication which I am not entitled to receive is unintentionally received through my working of a radio station I will not make known or allow to be made known its contents, its origin, its destination, its existence or the fact of its receipt to any person otherwise than in terms of subsection (1) of section 54 of these regulations.”.

Permission of owners of premises

55. Where an applicant for a licence to work a radio station is not the owner of the premises on which the station is to be installed

Postal and Telecommunications (Licensing, Registration and Certification) Regulations, 2021

no licence shall be issued unless the applicant has produced to the Authority the written permission of the owner of the premises for such an installation.

Visiting foreign stations

56. (1) The provisions of these regulations shall not apply to visiting foreign aircraft or ship stations except in so far as compliance with the ITU Convention is concerned.

(2) Other visiting foreign stations other than those mentioned in subsection (1) may require temporary licence before entry into Zimbabwe.

Serial number of transmitters

57. (1) No radio station shall be sold, given, lent or otherwise transferred to any person unless a serial number is firmly affixed or endorsed in a prominent place on the chassis of the transmitter.

(2) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding level 10 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

Duplicate copies of licences or certificates

58. A duplicate copy of any licence or certificate issued in terms of these regulations may be provided by the authority upon payment of the appropriate fee set out in the Second Schedule.

Changes of address

59. The holder of any licence or certificate issued in terms of these regulations shall, within 14 days of any change in any address specified in such licence or certificate, notify the authority of the person's new address.

Return of licences or certificates on cancellation

60. Where in terms of the Act, the Authority refuses to renew, cancels or suspends any certificate or licence the holder of the certificate or licence in question shall return it to the Authority at its request.

Indemnity

61. No liability shall attach to the Authority or to any employee of the Authority for any loss or damage sustained by any person as a

result of the *bona fide* exercise or performance of any function which by or in terms of the Act is conferred or imposed upon the Authority:

Provided that this section shall not be construed so as to prevent any person from recovering compensation for any loss or damage sustained by him or her which was caused by gross negligence or recklessness.

Appeals

62.(1) Any person who is aggrieved by a decision of the Authority to—

- (a) reject an application for a licence; or
- (b) grant an application for a licence subject to conditions; or
- (c) cancel a licence; or
- (d) suspend a licence; or
- (e) amend a licence;

may appeal in writing to the Minister in accordance with the provisions of section 96 of the Act.

Record keeping and reporting

63. (1) A licensee shall —

- (a) keep proper records of network plans and installations;
- (b) submit reports and returns as prescribed or requested by the Authority;
- (c) inform the Authority of any material changes in network.

(2) No licensee shall make false declarations of information in reports, returns and accounts submitted to the Authority.

(3) Any licensee who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of five thousand dollars for each contravention.

Repeals

64. The Postal and Telecommunications (Licensing, Registration and Certification) Regulations, 2001, published in Statutory Instrument 11A of 2001, are repealed.

Provided that, subject to the Exchange Control Regulations in force in Zimbabwe at any given time, nothing contained in this schedule, shall prevent any company incorporated in Zimbabwe, any Zimbabwean entity, any individual Zimbabwean citizen or permanent Resident of Zimbabwe, from paying the equivalent of any of the fees contained in this Schedule, in United States Dollars, or any other major foreign currency acceptable to the Authority.

“*Spectrum Fee / Channel*” is the fee payable in respect of a frequency together with the assigned bandwidth in a communication link. A Frequency Division Duplex (FDD) link is considered to be two channels;

“*RadioFrequency Bandwidth RFBW*” is the actual bandwidth occupied by channel;

“*Reuse Factor*” is the coefficient taking into account the number of times a frequency is reused in Zimbabwe. To encourage the efficient usage of spectrum, the ceiling for the chargeable reuse factor is pegged at 8, meaning that any reuse beyond 8 does not contribute to the spectrum fee.

“*Sharing Factor*” is the coefficient of the number of users sharing the same frequency in the same charging area. It is established as follows —

When two users share, a sharing factor of 0.8 shall apply

When three users share, a sharing factor of 0.7 shall apply

When four users share, a sharing factor of 0.65 shall apply

Offences and penalties

Any annual fee payable in terms of paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 not paid by the due date, shall attract a penalty calculated at the prescribed rate of interest plus 12.5% of the payable amount:

Provided that, any annual fee not paid within three months after the due date, shall attract a penalty calculated at 100% of the fee payable, plus interest calculated at the prescribed rate of interest.

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Public Health (COVID-19 Prevention, Containment and Treatment) (National Lockdown) (No. 2) (Amendment) Order, 2021 (No. 11)

IT is hereby notified that the Minister of Health and Child Care has, in terms of section 68 of the Public Health Act [*Chapter 15:17*], made the following order: —

1. This order may be cited as the Public Health (COVID-19 Prevention, Containment and Treatment) (National Lockdown) (No. 2) (Amendment) Order, 2021 (No. 11).

2. The Public Health (COVID-19 Prevention, Containment and Treatment) (National Lockdown) (No. 2) Order, 2020, published in Statutory Instrument 200 of 2020, is amended in section 2 (“Interpretation”) in the definition of “essential service” by the insertion of the following paragraph after paragraph (x) —

“(y) for the purpose of attendance at any court to the extent permitted under paragraph (m) above, and of travelling to or from any other place for purposes preparatory to or in connection with such attendance, the work of persons who are legal practitioners registered as such in terms of the Legal Practitioners Act [*Chapter 27:07*];”.
